COMMUNION, CELEBRATION AT THE TABLE: (Maria Christina Conlon & Betty Lou McNabb)

- BETTY LOU: My name is Rev. Betty Lou McNabb. I serve the congregation of Georgina Island Native United Church and I am the President-elect of Shining Waters Regional Council.
- TINA: Welcome to the table, my name is Tina Conlon. Emmanuel College granted my Master of Divinity in 1983. While a student there, I sat with Rigoberta Menchu who gave me this shawl as a parting gift when she returned to Guatemala. This is what I wear today as my communion garment this service.
- BETTY LOU: Today we celebrate this feast, gathered from different places, with those among us who are newly ordained, commissioned and are admitted into service for the United Church of Canada.

TINA: The ritual of communion that we celebrate is a memory of the ritual Passover feast that Jesus, as an observant Jew, observed with his friends.

BETTY LOU: Yes – even with one who betrayed him for silver.

- TINA: Yes even with another who when asked, denied ever knowing him.
- BETTY LOU: Yes and even also with those who were fast asleep and could not stay awake to see his agony and loneliness, even as he begged for their company.
- TINA: We come to this table, not as spectators, but as witnesses to what we must bear witness: to unleash a hope and a commitment that we love one another, that our world be the beloved community for all our children to inhabit. We witness a world that saw the killing of George Floyd and again of Daunte Wright. We witness a world where the powerful nations keep their knee on other nations while they demonize those who disagree. We witness the other as not one of us and one who must be erased, not seen, invisible.

[SILENCE]

- BETTY LOU: May we have eyes to see and ears to listen.
- TINA: We come not as spectators to be entertained, but to witness; and that we must bear witness: where love of self has gone wrong because we failed to love our neighbour as ourselves. When in this pandemic the essential continue to serve those who remain sheltered in their dwellings, while the vaccines remain elusive to those who need them the most.
- BETTY LOU: May we be witnesses.
- TINA: We come not as spectators, but to witness, as participants at this table where we now open ourselves, our souls and our bodies with these elements of grain and fruit that were given to us.
- BETTY LOU: We come bringing ceremonial bread and wine in the many forms they take from wherever we came from. These we all partake together at this common table.
- TINA: We come, not as spectators, but as witnesses to the One who loved and who has given gifts, elements of grain and fruit: from seeds nourished in the earth, kissed by the sun, embraced by water and kindled in the passion of air and fire.
- BETTY LOU: God of mercy accept these elements we offer you this day.
- TINA: Increase, we pray, our sight to see you in those we have failed to see, all those who have lost their loved ones especially in this pandemic and still those who continue to experience the loss of house and are in encampments.
- BETTY LOU: keep us awake to accompany you as you cry for justice, to respond to the Truth and Reconciliation calls to action, to respond to indigenous rights to dignity and self-determination here in Canada as in Palestine and everywhere else in the world.
- TINA: Help us to love our neighbours, as we love ourselves, still grieving over the killing of George Floyd, Vincent Chin, Dean "Laser" Lisowick and many others, because of race, status, culture or sexual orientation.

BETTY LOU: Deepen our hope that brings us into your eternal love, in your creation, that we do not take more than what we need and will ensure the bounty of your gifts to share with others now and in the future, in this beloved community. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our risen Lord.

TINA: AMEN.

BETTY LOU: We remember Jesus as we partake of this feast in that supper where Jesus took the elements of grain and fruit, gave thanks and gave it to those at the table, "Eat and drink."

TINA: We gather at this table today not because we are worthy, but because we have all been invited to this feast; not because we must but because we may.

BETTY LOU: As we partake of this meal, we share in the body of Christ, the new covenant of love.

TINA: This is the body of Christ, broken for you.

BETTY LOU: This is the blood of Christ, poured out for you.

TINA: Take, eat and drink for we do this in the memory of Christ who lived, died and rose again from the dead.

AFTER COMMUNION

BETTY LOU: We thank you for this meal. Strengthen us in our ministry of service that we may preach good news to the poor, proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, set at liberty those who are oppressed, and proclaim the year of Jubilee.
