Total voting members present:

Quorum required: for this pastoral year (July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011) as defined by *The Manual*, section 001 (b) (ii), shall be one-quarter of total membership of whom one-third are Order of Ministry or Designated Lay Ministers, and one-third Lay members. 7. PRESENTATION: INTERIM MINISTRY

Jane Wetelainen introduced Interim Ministry as one of the tools available in the Presbytery tool box which is helpful in bringing us all into wholeness in the name of Jesus Christ.

Reverend Leslie Sedore spoke about the call and training for interim ministry, and that it is a positive approach based on identifying and working on a congregation's strengths. Opening a forum for discussion, she acknowledged that choosing interim ministry has sometimes had a negative affect on a pastoral charge, though others added that the benefits of intentionally entering into an interim ministry may not be seen until many years down the road. Difficulty may arise when a pastoral charge feels they just want to move forward at the end of a pastoral relationship rather than going through a two-year period of transition with a minister they know will have to leave. Other members spoke about very positive experiences in interim ministry.

The existing model of interim ministry assumes that it is only appropriate at the end of a long-term pastoral relationship, or when critical issues have arisen in the pastoral charge. Leslie and Jane offered a variety of ways that an interim ministry could be helpful to any pastoral charge as a natural means of moving from one pastoral relationship to another, or addressing a time of stress or change. In conjunction with a joint needs assessment, interim ministry could be helpful in assisting pastoral charges to name their identity and mission.

There was discussion about the language we currently use as perhaps carrying negative baggage, the availability of interim ministers in the presbytery, which is limited, and possibilities and opportunities for interim ministry to benefit the pastoral charges of Living Waters Presbytery.

8. COMMISSION REPORTS

a. Men's Ministries – George Bishop No report

- **b.** Congregational Life Jerry Therrien/Ted Meyers
 - 1. Jerry thanked the congregations who have hosted today. It is a reminder, that smaller congregations working together can host a meeting of presbytery.
 - 2. Jerry invited any new members to Presbytery to join this commission.
 - **3.** Annual Reports There are still 20 charges who have not sent in their reports. A reminder that they must be produced and three copies sent to the Presbytery Office.
 - 4. Queensville Pastoral Charge has changed its name to Queensville Holland Landing Pastoral Charge. (QHL for short). Jerry expressed gratitude for the effort that went into bringing these two pastoral charges together, and that funds were earmarked from the sale of the Holland Landing building to PTCC for future benefit of the presbytery.
 - **5.** Technology Grants Jerry reported on the technology grants that have been applied for. There are two sources of funding for technology

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grants – Toronto Conference has a fund available until September 2011. The General Council Office also has a technology grant fund. Information of both are available through their respective websites, or contact the Presbytery Office for assistance.

c. Vision and Church Development - Terry Davies/Donald Spratt

The commission has set up an ad hoc committee for new church development policy.. this is groundbreaking and is hoped to become a template for this work across the conference

Terry introduced a motion seeking additional financial support for New Hope United Church and Painswick United Church which would be in addition to the funding they already have received as new church development projects. The source of this additional funding would come from a grant request to Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation from the annual allotment available to Living Waters Presbytery.

Terry clarified the reason for the need for the funds, saying that New Hope is working on clustering and rentals to meet their budget. Painswick has had a difficult year due to the death of their minister. A full-time appointment is in place and was recently renewed, though with some hesitation based on budget constraints. 15,000 is the shortfall in the budget. Painswick is looking at a new church building that will be a multi-use facilities and will afford them a good, adequate space at little cost. They need our support for this year.

MOTION

Whereas New Hope United Church and Painswick United Church have used considerable creativity and diligence to meet their submitted Business Plan and Vision and the Vision & Church Development Commission has satisfied itself by review of financial reports and regular monitoring that additional support should be provided in 2011. Therefore be it resolved that Living Waters Presbytery request from the Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation (PTCC) a grant of \$15,000 for New Hope United Church and \$15,000 for Painswick United Church, in addition to the \$50,000 previously approved for each in 2011. **Audrey Brown/Terry Davies**

g. UCW – Helen Bishop

The new executive of UCW has been installed. A spring meeting was held in Huntsville with 74 women. The meeting centered around learning more about Camp Big Canoe. \$664.00 dollars were raised in addition to \$530.00 Canadian Tire dollars. One truck load and three carloads of camp supplies were given as well. The next meeting is Monday Sept 19 at Camp Big Canoe.

h. Co-Ordinating Committee - Pat Edmonds

Pat gave highlight of the past year.

- 1. formation of the worship team
- 2. Revision of the handbook. The Handbook Revision Task Group worked carefully over the past months to revise the handbook to address gaps in mandates and policies. Pat will be completing the final draft over the summer and sending it out to presbyters for comments, concerns and suggestions. Presbyters will be given a deadline to provide their concerns IN WRITING to Pat. Only those concerns sent in writing shall be considered to further revise the handbook before its final approval at the September meeting of presbytery. Information will be going out to presbyters in the near future.
- 3. Policy Development. Policies regarding having available contingency fund, a process for appeals, a new expense claims procedure, disbursement of surplus funds, communication protocol, disposition of property and others developed by the commissions have helped in conducting presbytery business.
- 4. A Welcome Package is being developed to be given to new presbyters.

- 3. Handbook Revisions:

Donald Spratt reported the Living Waters Presbytery handbook revisions were progressing. A change in the Vision and Church Development section was discussed.

5. Report on the Vision Task Force:

Donald Spratt and Laurie Cook reported on the meeting held June 7, 2011 at Guthrie.The feedback responses received from the condensed information compiled from the eight workshop groups at the April 16 Presbytery meeting and sent out to all Presbyters were taken into consideration. A Vision and a Mission Statement were written and sent out to all Presbyters for comments and consideration. 6. Report on Painswick United Church:

Terry Davies and Donald Spratt met with Tom Lowry, Chair of Trustees, and George Allen, Chair of Council of Painswick. They received valuable background information about the church and details of the proposed building project. The group is enthusiastic and knowledgeable. The Vision and Church Development Commission needs to stay informed so that we can continue to support the development of the Painswick United Church project and maintain a good relationship so that it is recognized that we will give this support.

7. Report on New Church Development Funding:

Rev. Nancy Waterman, Al McNaught and Terry Davies met as a subcommittee on June 7, 2011 at Stouffville to develop a future funding policy regarding New Church Development. The report was discussed and Terry explained the rational and direction taken.

The Vision and Church Development Commission adopts and supports the strategy as outlined by the subcommittee in the New Church Development Report, of June 7 2011, in concert with the Congregational Life Commission as a long-term strategy for all church development.

10. New Church Development Funding 2012:

On Sept10, 2011 at 10 a.m. there will be a meeting of the Vision and Church Development Commission at Painswick, Oasis location, to approve the applications for 2012 Church Development grants. New Hope and Painswick must submit documentation for a five (5) year business plan and a three (3) year budget.

11. Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation (PTCC):

From the funds previously held by TUCC, \$300 000 covering this year and the future commitment for New Hope and Painswick is being held in Toronto Conference. Any remaining balance from the Church Development Funding will move to PTCC for sharing by the four presbyteries.

12. Report on Painswick:

Irene Lowry reported they held an enjoyable Memorial Hymn Singing on Sat. June 11 with several musicians from the Oasis and those attending participating. \$800.00 was raised and added to the church funds. Eighteen women attend the U.C.W. meeting. It has been requested that Rev. Doug McLeod's contract be renewed for a year. They will hold a Vacation Bible School this summer. The assessment amount that Painswick has been asked to pay was discussed. It is very high at \$56.00 per member and the reason for this amount needs to be re-examined. There is no further news from the developer.

- related to the sale (real estate fees and legal fees), and
- related to the ongoing maintenance of the church, and
- related to repayment of funds borrowed from Presbytery

It is the wish of the Holland Landing Congregation that the remaining funds be disbursed as follows:

• 10% to go to Charities as follows:

50 % to KAIROS 50 % to United Church Toronto Conference Camping

- 10 % to Mission and Service fund of the United Church
- 10% to Greening Fund of the Toronto United Church Council
- 70% to Living Waters Presbytery with \$50,000 being allocated to Toronto Conference and the balance to Queensville Holland Landing United Church for the expenses related to the refurbishments of the Queensville church to accommodate the amalgamation of the Holland Landing congregation and their artifacts, along with essential safety improvements to be made to make the Queensville church a safer and more welcoming place of worship.

Expenses included in the above might include;

Amalgamated congregation and artifacts: modifications to sanctuary, painting, renovations to choir loft, replace choir gowns, update the front signage of church, youth and meeting room upgrades with chairs and tables

Essential safety & welcoming upgrades: toilet upgrades, removal of 2 unsafe chimneys, electrical panel, install new fire retardant ceiling tiles, replacement of outside windows, replace concrete walkway, replace carpet in sanctuary, replace soffits and gutters / drains, install outside walkway lights, fencing of church property, driveway and parking lot upgrades, general landscaping and memorial gardens.

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The disbursement of funds will be handled by Toronto Conference. Proceeds of sale will be forwarded to Toronto Conference by lawyer, Bob Sedore.

The disbursements might be: (subject to related Expenses)

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APPENDIX B: VCD Commission New Church Development Funding Committee Mtg 7th June 2011

Introduction:- Nancy Waterman, AI McNaught and Terry Davies met in Stouffville to discuss the following mandate:-

Mandate from last VCD meeting..."It was agreed that Rev. Nancy Waterman, Al McNaught and Terry Davies should meet as a sub-committee in order to better understand and develop a future funding policy regarding New Church Development."

It became quickly apparent that this mandate could not be met without taking into account the larger Strategic Issues facing the Presbytery and United Church. We broadened our discussion and provide the following as our initial thoughts on what we believe should become a major Strategic discussion.

- 1. Establishing a Strategy...The Presbytery needs to be in a position to approve an overall strategy on Church Development. We proposed that VCD Commission working closely with Congregational Life Commission develop this strategy, recognizing that both commissions are very involved in this challenge/opportunity. It is recognized that other Commissions will need to be involved and support the strategy.
- 2. Categorizing Pastoral Charge for level and nature of support needed from each commission. We propose the following categories for consideration:
 - a. New Church Development (Present existing)
 - i. New Hope and Painswick
 - b. New Church Development (Future) i. None at this time
 - c. Existing Church Development (Growth Locations)
 - i. Developing areas identified by Presbytery or Pastoral Charge. Support will be necessary
 - d. Existing Churches (Sustain)
 - i. No immediate action required
 - e. Existing Church Development (Potential Rationalization)
 - i. Opportunities for Amalgamations and Clusters
 - f. Existing Churches (Congregational Support Needed -may not be sustainable)
 - i. Assist Pastoral Charge to close or amalgamate
- **3.** Data Gathering and identification working with Congregational Life we can quickly identify the appropriate category for most churches. If we follow a typical "bell curve", we can expect the following:-

Category a and b	excluded	
Category c	10%	9 churches
Category d	30-40%	27 - 36 churches
Category e	35-50%	31 – 45 churches
Category f	10-15%	9 - 14 churches

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Assume total is 91 churches

4. Criteria for categorizing could include the following

- Financial stability
- State of Physical Premises
- Potential for expanding ministries and outreach
- Energy of Congregation
- Need to maintain presence in Community
- 5. New Church Development...it is understood that TUCC is undertaking a review of New Church Development projects of the last 5 years or so, seeking to draw out what worked, did not, commonalities etc. Nancy has been invited to become a Director of TUCC. We believe that the Presbytery should take no action on New Church Development until this analysis is complete.

6. Church Development Funding and Planning

Whether New or Existing Church Development, we believe the following key points should be part of our ongoing approach:-

- a. **Each Project Unique...**No two projects are the same and the criteria, requirements, planning and support should reflect this reality
- b. Planning & Budgeting...Each project should have a long-term plan of expectations and requirements. The time line can be up to 15 years. Budgets will normally be for 3 years, and need to be consistent with the Plan. Look at best practices in Not for Profit organizations.
- c. **Funding...**Some projects will require early funding and others as projects develop into new locations. Each timeline will vary as will the overall support that is needed.
- d. **Accountability**...All projects require hands on monitoring to ensure that agreed targets are being met in a way that will deliver the approved Plan.
- e. **Ministerial Support...**It is critical for success to have the right Minister/Team in place. We will need to work closely with Personnel Commission.

7. Capital Funding

Living Waters Presbytery has funding available through PTCC. However, there is not clarity around the amount that can be used in each year versus market investment to increase value.

a. Existing Churches Development

Based on the above categorization of Pastoral Charges, we should be able to identify funds needed and available through development, amalgamations etc. and create a priority list.

b. Current New Church Development

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We will need to address the tactical issue of additional support for Painswick in 2012 & 2013. We suggest that this proposal be developed in parallel but tabled in the context of the overall strategy.

8. Conclusion

We look forward to working with the VCD and Congregational Life to take these thoughts forward. We suggest a joint Strategic Committee be created for this purpose, following our meeting with Congregational Life on the 28th June. We propose that we target the end of the year for approval of the Strategy by the Full Court, following approval by the Executive.

- Amend the property boundaries of 127 Main Street, Unionville (the Central UC Manse) and 131 Main Street, Unionville (Central United Church actual building) to recognize the parking lot at the rear of 127 Main Street as part of the 131 Main Street property
- 2. Sell the reconfigured 127 Main Street property and house for approximately \$500,000

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3. The purchaser will also build a new fence and underground piped drainage from the Church parking lot through the 127 Main Street property to the Town drainage at the road.

f. Emsdale Pastoral Charge We have been notified by Joan Franklin that a buyer has been found for the Emmanuel church and manse. The property will be used for a school for the developmentally challenged.

- **g.** Grace United Church Barrie. Pauline Chappell reported that a congregational meeting has approved the sale of their manse. It has been appraised at \$250,000 to \$260,000. They intend to invest the fund for ministry housing.
- **h.** York Pines United Church is attempting to address their accessibility issues. They are applying for grants from Go Green and others for a new roof and insulation. We support their decision to apply to the Trillium Fund, as the church is an evacuation facility for the local school. Another source may be the "Jim Hansen Fund".
- **i. Ravenshoe United Church** has requested approval to apply to the modernization fund for a grant.

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Appendix "A"

Standard Operating Procedures for Engaging with Pastoral Charges

Excludes Procedures already covered by United Church Policies

1. Contact is made by a pastoral charge member concerning an issue that needs Presbytery involvement (this contact may be to a commission chair, a staff person, or any member of the executive)

2. The person initially contacted will immediately agree to help to review the issue, by saying, that if appropriate we will send you a listening team, within 30 days whenever possible.

The person initially contacted will verify that no other commission is currently involved. If there is already Presbytery involvement, this will be communicated to the caller who made the initial contact, and they will be asked to take part in that process.

If there is no current Presbytery involvement, and no other UCC procedure that would take precedence, the person initially contacted will identify the primary commission that needs to take the primary role, according to the commission mandates in the Presbytery Handbook.

3. That commission may identify other commissions, if any that need to be involved and together will set up the listening team, optimal three, but not less than two members of Presbytery.

4. Once the listening team is established, the Primary commission will inform the executive and the Personnel and Program Ministers. (by cc on email) to note a listening team has been established and which commissions will be involved in the listening team. Minimal information is given regarding the issues involved.

5. The listening team will meet with the pastoral charge group, which may include the Presbytery Representative. At this point no advice or recommendations are given. The goal is to listen, and to hopefully, identify a point person for the pastoral charge, to simplify the flow of information. Following the visit, a report is written to summarize the issues and identify what next logical steps might be.

6. The Primary commission will present the report to the Executive, and either the Personnel and Program Ministers or both (as appropriate). This step will provide the opportunity for the rest of the executive to be informed, share their expertise and allow for the involvement of other commissions if deemed appropriate.

7. An agreed action plan will be developed using the skills and expertise of the conference staff assigned to the Presbytery, as needed. These staff members may also need to seek advice from other levels of UCC staff, if so, the results will be communicated to the listening team.

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8. The primary commission proceeds with the agreed action plan, created by the listening team, in co-ordination with other commissions and in consultation with the Conference Staff assigned to the Presbytery, as the plan unfolds.

CHURCH DEVELOPMENT FUND GRANTS

A. NEW HOPE UNITED CHURCH

The commission received and considered the request of New Hope United Church for a 2012 Church Development Grant in the amount of \$40 000. The accompanying 3 year budget was reviewed and Catherine Hions provided a very positive verbal report about the progress at New Hope.

MOTION that whereas Toronto Conference, at the meeting of its executive on May 13, 2009 agreed to provide the funds necessary to complete the current program for existing church development fund grant recipients, provided these missions or congregations are deemed to be viable by the new presbyteries;

And whereas the Vision and Church Development Commission of Living Waters Presbytery has carried out due diligence in assessing the plans and the budget of New Hope United Church for the next three years;

Therefore the commission approves a church development grant of \$40 000 for New Hope United Church for the year 2012 and requests Toronto Conference to release the funds. Nancy Waterman/Ivor Roberts CARRIED

B. PAINSWICK UNITED CHURCH

The commission received and considered the request of Painswick United Church for a 2012 Church Development Grant in the amount of \$40 000. The accompanying 3 year budget was reviewed as well as the Goals and Objectives for 2012 and the Income and Expense Statement from January 2011 to August 2011. Irene Lowry outlined the more recent changes and the ongoing activities at both the Oasis and Terraces sites. Rev. Tom Lowry outlined how the

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Painswick trustees are actively exploring partnerships to extend the church's varied ministry to seniors in a new retirement home setting, with a specialized Memory Care unit, a children's daycare centre and a multi-functional worship facility on the Dean Avenue site. Construction is anticipated to commence in the spring of 2012.

Terry Davies reported that **Process Guidelines** (see **Appendix A**) have been presented to Painswick Trustees in anticipation of their new church development proposal. These guidelines would allow Painswick to bring the new church development project into effect satisfying the requirements of Presbytery and TUCC.

MOTION that the Process Guidelines that have been presented to Painswick Trustees (Appendix A) have the approval of the Visioning and Church Development Commission. Bill Hurdman/Ivor Roberts CARRIED [Irene Lowry abstained from voting]

The commission acknowledged that the development plan presented by Painswick trustees may present a change in their funding requirements but the commission will be supporting Painswick United Church throughout the process.

Terry Davies was thanked for his dedicated work with Painswick.

UPDATE ON FORMER HOLLY MISSION

Donald Spratt reported a problem with failure to file a form with the Canada Revenue Agency at the time of Holly's closing. Jody Maltby is looking after this issue.

CHATTELS

Donald Spratt expressed the need for assistance to move the Pathways chattels from TUCC and the Holly Chattels to the Guthrie Presbytery office.

[The commission took a break for supper. Rev. Nancy Waterman led us in a grace.]

NEW CHURCH FUNDING COMMITTEE

Terry Davies led us in a discussion of the report (see **Appendix B**) of the July 26th meeting of the New Church Development sub-committee which includes Rev .Nancy Waterman, Al McNaught and Terry Davies.

Development Strategy

Following up on the Strategy Development Approach approved at our last meeting, Terry tabled the first steps for working with the Congregational Life Commission date June 28th. Congregational Life Commission will be discussing the two proposals on Strategy at their meeting on September 17 2011.

Terry expressed concern that the absence of TUCC in the planning process could negatively impact the mandate of our Commission. There was agreement that we need to explore how better to utilize TUCC and, if necessary, Consultants. It was agreed that we need to make provision for funding in the 2012 Visioning and Church Development Budget.

MOTION that whereas the Commission has identified the need to create a Strategy for redevelopment, amalgamation, and support for congregations throughout the Presbytery and recognizes the need for professional planning in future development activities: Therefore we propose the creation of a Planning relationship with TUCC and the creation of a budget for 2012 for this purpose. [This motion is to be approved at the next meeting of the commission.]

APPENDIX A

Extracts of information/guidelines provided to Painswick in anticipation of a New Church Development Proposal

- 1. As you know, VCD Commission needed to get approval of the Full Court for the \$15,000 additional funding for 2011. Clearly we will need to get approval from the Full Court for the additional funding required for 2012 & 2013.
- 2. We are coming to the end of the Church Development Grants originally approved for Painswick. It is my personal view that we will need to obtain approval for a New Church Development Funding for the new location. I am assuming financial support for at least 10 years. This will not be an easy sell, given the limited funds available to the Presbytery.
- 3. Although the anticipated deal with DeMac anticipates a rent-free agreement, there will still be operating costs for our share of the Property Maintenance etc. There will also be the need for outfitting the space created by DeMac.
- 4. We have been working on an assumption of ground breaking in 2012 and opening the new Church in 2013. Until we have an agreement in place and approved, these dates are speculative and maybe even optimistic.
- 5. The deal with DeMac requires that the land be sold by TUCC at Book Value. When Donald and I met with Vince Alfano and Ron Ewart, it was made clear that for them to agree to a deal that is at Book Value, they would need several things:
 - a. An Agreement between Painswick and the Developer.
 - b. Establishing the Market Value to understand the
 - premium/discount.
 - c. Longevity of the agreement to protect UC, provided by their Lawyer, based on the terms of the Agreement
 - d. Longevity of the Church Congregation to use the discounted value created (e.g. will it be a viable congregation for 50 years?)
 - e. Approval of Living Waters Presbytery, with a commitment to support the development to ensure the above.
- 6. VCD Commission will need to approve before a proposal can go to Presbytery for formal approval...both for funding and longevity commitment. In order for VCD Commission to approve a proposal it must be involved in the process with the Developer and TUCC.
- 7. At that time, we will then be asking for approval to sustain the existing congregation in the interim. This funding may well have to be folded into the New Development.
- 8. Here are the dates of Presbytery Meetings for the coming year:
 - a. Sept 17th Presbytery Meeting...we will not need to get approval for \$40,000 grant as it can be approved by Commission on 13th.
 - b. Nov 15th Presbytery Meeting...last before March 2012
 - c. Mar 24th Presbytery Meeting
 - d. Jun 12th Presbytery Meeting...last of the year.

APPENDIX B

Living Waters...VCD Commission New Church Funding Committee Notes on Meeting on 26th July 2011

Present: Nancy Waterman, Al McNaught, Terry Davies Stouffville United 9.0 a.m. – 11.30 a.m.

 Development Strategy...Terry updated group on general openness to the idea of an overall Development Strategy which came out of the committee's first meeting on the 7th June and approved for development by the VCD Commission on 19th June.

Unfortunately, the Summer has made it difficult to arrange a meeting with Congregational Life, so there has been no real progress yet. Terry will pursue Jerry and Ted more vigorously after the long weekend.

It is hoped that the Strategy will allow identification and focus on Highest Potential Pastoral Charges, rather than reactive efforts which may be in lower potential opportunities.

We would include the creation of a Financial Model that would allow assessment of viability and sustainability of each congregation, including such factors as:-

- # of active members
- Income & Expense history
- Balance Sheet with focus on liquidity
- 2. Issues and Opportunities...Terry reviewed the outcome of a meeting where a process for Pastoral Charges to raise Issues and Opportunities, which will then allow a Listening Team to be set-up to follow through. The Team will be optimally 3 people from various Commissions. It is hoped that this will help to create more comfort with "Presbytery".

This process could also be used to stimulate initiatives from Ministers that may be multi-locational and lead to shared services, ministers, parish nurses etc.

3. Painswick...We discussed Terry's letter to George Allen of outlining the process needs to have the New Church proposal tabled and approved. It was identified that the anticipated budget shortfall for 2012 will need to be approved by VCD and the Full Court of Presbytery, which is dependent on the New Church proposal being in place.

The requirements for TUCC to sell the land at Market Value are clear and will require a formal agreement to be presented that guarantees long term life of the Church and the Congregation.

In assessing the plan for the new church in Painswick, and indeed future New Church Development elsewhere, it would be helpful to look at Northwest Barrie, which is a successful New Church Development from 20-25 years ago. How did it succeed?

- 4. New Church Development Funding...There is agreement that we need to support the two remaining New Church Development Projects, but with a determined end date. We believe that no other New Developments should be undertaken until the overall Development Strategy is in place and a review of what works has been conducted.
- 5. Capital Availability...The present available funding in PTCC for Living Waters is approximately \$1,500,000. This is expected to grow by at least \$1,000,000 in the next few months. Current guidelines for drawing funds allows 10% maximum amount up to three times per year (i.e. up to \$450,000 on current funding. It is also possible to request other funds. (i.e. less than 5% or over 10%). [note; At Al's suggestion a check of PTCC Web-site reveals some difference. A copy is attached for reference. There is also a note that Applications for Grants have to be in by Sept 30th!!]
- 6. Based on Terry's meeting with TUCC he expressed concern that we will be replacing experienced trained professionals with willing but perhaps inexperienced volunteers for planning activities. We should consider retaining TUCC as paid consultants for VCD and Presbytery.
- 7. VCD Commission will be meeting on Sept 10th at Painswick (TBD). The primary item on the agenda will be the approval of the previously allocated Grants for both Painswick and New Hope.

9. VISION/MISSION STATEMENT

Jodie introduced the vision statement and the background behind it. A statement of our vision and mission as Living Waters Presbytery is needed to guide the work of the presbytery. Such activities as reviewing applications for mission support grants, seeking grants from the Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation, setting priorities and making decisions are informed by the vision statement created by the presbytery.

Jody described the process through which the Vision Statement Task Group created the draft vision statement which included representation on the task group from all commissions, consultation throughout the presbytery and reviewing feedback. When creating a draft statement, the task group recognized that two statements were needed; a vision statement and a mission statement, hence the proposed:

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There was no discussion or revisiting the work, as this was part of the process. Rather, it was noted that the vision and mission statements once adopted should inform the work of presbytery, both as commissions and a presbytery as a whole. This is meant to be a living document which may need to be changed as we live with and into the statement. Commissions are reminded to keep this document in the forefront of their thoughts and hearts and work and to continue to give it a go and to introduce changes as they may become necessary.

MOTION: Donald Spratt/ Laurie Cook That Living Waters Presbytery adopt the following Vision Statement and Mission Statement, to guide the work of Presbytery:

Vision Statement

We believe that, with God as our centre, and Jesus Christ as our guide, we will be in relationship as Living Waters Presbytery so that we may be a Spirit-led, inclusive community offering encouragement and support, and embracing new ways to be the church.

Mission Statement

The mission of Living Waters Presbytery is to be in life-giving relationship with pastoral charges, missions, camps, outreach ministries, ministry personnel, youth and others in our presbytery, with the wider church and with community partners.

To fulfill that mission, Living Waters Presbytery will work so that:

- we engage in dialogue with pastoral charges as a priority so that ministry personnel and congregants feel heard;
- we seek justice;
- we celebrate God's presence;
- we encourage stewardship of time, talents, gifts and assets;
- we act as a resource and we share resources and learnings;
- we are transparent, consultative and accountable;
- we nurture the spiritual life of ministry personnel and lay people in our presbytery;
- we include and engage youth in shaping the church

It was noted that the published statements should include today's date (September 17, 2011) and the Living Waters Presbytery logo.

10. <u>REVISED HANDBOOK</u>

Pat Edmonds introduced the revised handbook. The draft handbook was sent to presbyters for feedback in August with any suggested changes or corrections to be made in writing. No concerns or suggestions other than typographical errors were received and as such Pat was prepared to entertain a motion to accept the revised draft handbook.

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Pat explained that the new handbook now contains the policies developed over the past two years and encouraged presbyters to consult the handbook for guidance, particularly if they are contacted by a pastoral charge seeking assistance.

11. Information from Toronto Conference Executive

Pat Edmonds reported on some of the work of Toronto Conference Executive. She noted that Toronto Conference is working on its Accessibility policy to meet the Customer Service Standards of January 2012. When completed, the policy will be shared with the presbyteries – and we may use it as a model.

She also reported on a message from Michael Blair, Communities in Ministry, General Council Office that there is a difference between equality and equity and encouraged members to consult the United Church website for information on educational opportunities in this area.

The Executive has invited presbytery nominations committee members and executive members to a consultation and learning event on recruiting, training and supporting volunteers to be held October 11, 2011.

Ian Fraser has been hired to evaluate the restructuring of Toronto Conference as part of the restructuring mandate. Presbyters will be given opportunities to share their opinions on the success of the restructuring project in the coming weeks.

Remits 4, 5 and 5a have been distributed to presbyters. These remits will be on the agenda for the November 15th meeting of Living Waters Presbytery.

Pat noted that we have all been sent requests from the Manual committee seeking to revise the manual These are meant to be individual responses. Kristy Hunter clarified that the goal of this revision is to have a smaller, easier to read manual. So get involved!!!!!

Ted Noted that the work of this commission is closely tied to the Vision and Church Development Commission, and together they are looking at a strategy for the work that sometimes overlaps the two. A plan for that is being presented to the commissions today.

j. Vision and Church Development – Terry Davies/Donald Spratt The Commission met this week to address the 2012 new church development budgets. This commission approved a \$40,000 grant to both Painswick Pastoral Charge and New Hope Pastoral Charge. These grants come from New Church Development funds as part of the presbytery's ongoing commitment to these sites.

k. Personnel – Jane Wetelainen

Jane noted that her commission fulfills the mission statement of our Presbytery Because they:

- nurture the spiritual life of ministry personnel and lay people in our presbytery
- encourage stewardship of time, talents, gifts and assets;

A Sunday School teachers workshop is being contemplated.

Karen Hilfran Millson attended the Green belt Festival in England with the UCC "Edge" tea,. This is a Christian festival focusing on faith, social justice and environmental sustainability and the arts.

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Note that EDGE runs webinars on a weekly basis and they are free. Information can be found at <u>www.united-church.ca</u>.

Meg Jordan is one of 3 recipients for the McGeachy scholarship. Meg's research project is entitled *For Earth's Sake: Playing the Story and Living the Practice of the Presence of God*, - exploring new language and story to connect what we are learning from science with what we are experiencing through the Spirit.

Holocaust Memorial Week in November: Barb tried to find a contact to get information about events but has so far been unsuccessful. 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people to come to events like this at least in pairs so that the knowledge and enthusiasm are not just found in one person.

d. Social Justice Circle

Susan Eagle may take on convening this circle.

This circle has not met since June. But there are some issues that have come up.

Kim Posno reminded everyone of the poverty series at Collier. Again, people should be encouraged to go with a friend so that the learning and enthusiasm can be spread around.

There was a reminder of the sign campaign brought up in the plenary session. More signs are available on request and congregations are encouraged to check out faithtoendpoverty.ca a website created by ISARC. ISARC's social audit snapshot has been published in book form and contains the stories of people living in poverty and those who provide services. There was also a reminder that the *Persistent Poverty* books are available at the presbytery office if congregations or worship leaders want to look at them.

At this point there was a note to remember that youth often feel very passionate about these issues and we should encourage youth in our churches to join our meetings as corresponding members so they can add their voice and vision to the work of our commission.

a. CHAPLAINCY ANNUAL REVIEW

ANNUAL REVIEW QUESTIONS FOR PASTORAL SUPPORT MINISTERS IN LIVING WATERS PRESBYTERY. June 28, 2011 At Central United Church, Barrie

PRESENT: (Rev) Nina Fulford Rick McKinley (Rev) Colin MacDonald Tina Bax Living Waters Personnel Commission Our Presbytery support ministers

OPENING: We opened with a devotion of John 10:1-10 (The vine and the branches)

FORMAT OF THE INTERVIEWS: We separated for 45 minutes. Nina interviewed Colin; Rick interviewed Tina.

Then we came together for further discussion.

Tina and Colin felt that the job description was accurate and that nothing need be added or removed at this time.

Neither had been overwhelmed by requests for support. It did not seem that those requiring support were choosing their chaplain because of gender. Most meetings were held in "neutral ground" somewhere between the person and the support minister. Sometimes meetings took place in coffee shops or restaurants.

Most contacts were the result of individuals calling with Rev. Todd McDonald giving a third party reference to each of them. In one case a group of three were supported.

Follow up visits were offered and sometimes extra visits were requested.

Support was given only to paid accountable personnel (as per job description) and they are well aware of their need to respect privacy.

Conflict resolution skills had not been called upon directly and both felt adequately well versed in the ethos and polity of the United Church and adequately prepared to handle all issues.

Attendance at Presbytery meetings was seen as invaluable in building trust and making themselves known to the whole Presbytery. The later presbytery meetings that offered longer lunch hours were more helpful to this process. They did not think the Commission structure was an impediment to their work and for the most part they felt direct contact was

effective. Tina had received a third party referral and said when she received it she made it clear she would reveal where the referral initiated (i.e. X is concerned about you and asked me to call."

Telephone costs have not been claimed since both chaplains have good long distance plans. Tina has claimed mileage but Colin's has been covered by his travel allowance as part of his charge's support of Presbytery. He was reminded that submitting mileage was available.

The current honorarium is adequate and they expected that as time went on they would be called to serve a few more people.

Both are ready and willing to continue this important support work and have access to the resources they need.

Their relationship with Todd (his job description includes acting as a liaison with them) has worked well and they find him responsive and knowledgeable.

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We addressed the need to raise their profile within the presbytery. We would like to see them include a brief column in the LW newsletter. They do have business cards. It was also suggested that they might "drop in" on commissions on occasion reminding everyone of their role.

Nina took a picture of the two anticipating it as part of the Newsletter if possible.

13. Budget

A copy of an email from Harry Ramsaran was circulated outlining the Personnel Commission expenses to date. The Commission has exceeded budget this year, mostly due to mileage claims. Harry Ramsaran has increased the travel budget item for next year by \$3,000 to \$10,000. As well, the Spiritual Development Commission would have a reduced budget next year of \$3,000, which would help offset the increase in the Personnel Commission budget. Jane expressed concern that such a change might reduce the Spiritual Development Commission's work.

A discussion ensued around the necessity of incurring such large travel expenses. It was suggested the Personnel Commission increase its budget by only \$1,000, so that the Spiritual Development Commission can increased its budget by a further \$2,000. Further discussion ensued on the details of the Personnel Commission budget.

Report from the Executive

Motions passed on behalf of the Living Waters Personnel Commission are attached as an addendum to these minutes.

14. Report from Personnel Minister.

There is discussion at the General Council level that the various pastoral relations matters be dealt with at the Conference level by a Conference staff person. Should this pass at General Council Executive, it would mean that much or most of the Personnel Commission's work at the Presbytery level would vanish. It is proposed that there would be one full-time person for each grouping of 75 pastoral charges across the country, roughly one staff person per presbytery. Should this proposal pass, the implementation would still need to be worked out. Continuing Presbytery work would be in the areas of pastoral oversight and relationships.

Discussion ensued on the various ramifications of this proposal for presbytery work, finances and the very nature of the United Church's culture.

Further discussion would be needed in the future, should this proposal pass. Todd indicated that he would bring further information to the next meeting.

Todd attended the conflict management course at Conrad Grebel College and found it very helpful.

Todd discussed the pastoral situation involved a transgendered incumbent minister who was in the process of a physical gender transformation. Zina Darling was been brought in as a consultant in the situation. She is also available as a consultant for diversity issues of any sort.

15. POLICY ON USING FUNDS COLLECTED AT COVENANTING SERVICES

15.1. This item was brought forward from the Educations and Students Committee as an item for discussion by the full Commission. There is \$2,400 currently in the fund.

MOTION: by Richard Moffat/Don Powell That the existing fund from covenanting service offerings be disbursed at the end of this year in equal amounts to our current students. **CARRIED**

There was discussion about the funds held by PTCC (Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation). Further information and clarification needs to be sought at to how these funds are allocated.

The two Divisions separated for their own meetings.

16. PASTORAL RELATIONS

16.1. Evergreen Pastoral Charge

Ted Daglish reported. The motions of the JNAC concerning an interim minister have been rejected by the congregation. Consequently, a new JNAC was formed. It includes the old committee and two new members. The possibility of the success of this committee is in jeopardy due to individuals appointed by the congregation. It appears that only a one day meeting will be required due to the work that has already been done. Ted feels that it will be difficult for him to continue as a Presbytery representative.

<u>MOTION</u>: by Paul Dempsey/Dennis Posno that Rev. Nina Fulford and Ted Daglish be appointed as the Presbytery representatives on the Evergreen Pastoral Charge JNAC, and that it be recommended that there be a reduced one-day JNAC process. **<u>CARRIED</u>**

There is also a request to bring in a student supply quarter-time. The candidate's husband is a member of the M&P Committee, and he will be required to resign due to conflict of interest.

16.11. Racial Justice Training update

16.12. Sexual Abuse Policy Training update

A decision needs to be made as to when and how to remove the good standing of ministers who have not completed the required training.

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9. <u>PRESBYTERIES OF TORONTO CONFERENCE CORPORATION</u> <u>PRESENTATION</u>

John Ostime, a director of PTCC, gave a presentation on the corporation, answering what does it do, what the corporation has done since its inception, and described the application process and financial status of the corporation.

PTCC was formed one year ago, funding from a number of different sources totaling 9.5 million dollars are managed by the board. The board comprises members from each of the four presbyteries, two of which are directors and two board members for a total of twenty members. Its goal is to be open and transparent.

Grant applications may be found on the corporation's website <u>www.ptcccorp.org</u>. Applications must be approved by the plenary of presbytery.

Living Waters Presbytery currently has 1.9 million dollars in its account. Annual interest, estimated for 2012 to be \$45,000.00 is transferred to the presbytery each year. Presbyteries may request grants against the capital for special purposes.

In 2011, two capital grants were approved by Living Waters Presbytery, each in the amount of \$15,000 to Painswick United Church and New Hope United Church respectively at the presbytery's June meeting.

Church Manse Modernization grants – The 2011 fund has been depleted, so there are no funds available for the remainder of this year. This affects three pastoral charges and the commission is looking at options

Constitution changes - Bracebridge, Trinity Newmarket, St Matthews Richmond Hill, and Unity have submitted constitution changes for the review of the commission.

Aurora United Church is looking into developing its five rental properties Stewart Memorial, Lake of Bays pastoral charge is seeking heritage status

c. Vision and Church Development – Terry Davies/Donald Spratt

Donald Spratt reported on developing a strategy to support congregations along with Congregational life, they will be utilizing Toronto United Church Council (TUCC) support and The Edge resources in some planning work.

The commission continues to support Painswick. A plan has been submitted to TUCC by developers. The plan involves a multi level building – with seniors housing, long term care, and church space.

d. Personnel - Jane Wetelainen

Jane noted the volume of work that the Personnel committee does. There are some proposed changes to the way Pastoral Relations work is done (going to General Council).

Whereas this bill actually comprises nine smaller bills, C-54; S-10; C-4; C-16; C-39; C-23b; C-5; S-7; C-56, that were introduced by the Conservative government during its minority rule, but were never passed and now will not have time for significant discussion, and

Whereas this will cost the provinces, territories and federal Government added billions of tax dollars, and,

Whereas the United Church upholds the ideals of restorative justice and the direction of this Bill is punitive and not restorative, and

Whereas places like Texas (who recently closed a prison due to lower prison population) and the UK have found the restorative, program based approach to be extremely more cost efficient and successful with regard to street safety and recidivism, and

Therefore be it resolved that we the Community Connections and Right Relations Commission of Living Waters Presbytery of The United Church of Canada , forward to The Federal Government of Canada and relevant media, our objection to the passing of Bill C-10 **CARRIED**

9. NEW BUSINESS

Fair Trade – Issue arose from poverty workshops at Collier. For example fair trade chocolate for Halloween. Fair Trade coffee available locally at Hamley's Coffee \$14/lb with 15% discount for church. If more than 10lbs per week it is \$8.50 per pound. Check fairtrade.ca. Encourage congregations to consider fair trade. Develop a presbytery wide strategy? Co-Chairs will request time on presbytery agenda for a guest speaker at next Presbytery Agenda. Meanwhile we will develop strategies for fair trade products in churches. Assigned to Social Justice Circle for action or email Glen with ideas. We will poll today during report and find suppliers. Can we co-ordinate with UCW or other church groups?

Occupy Movement – Mardi Tindal has issued a statement on Occupy. There is a local Occupy Barrie Movement. Occupy Toronto, London, Calgary etc. are all in the midst of being evicted. St. James Cathedral in Toronto has been very supportive. Occupy is an issue that seems to be resonating with many people for different reasons. It is not a church movement but there is much common cause. Discussion about the important presence of homeless people at Occupy sites. They were there first!!

Cluster Bombs – Received letter from Robin Wardlaw. Currently Canada does not use these but there is pressure to rescind this policy. This has been very quiet. There was a sense that even if this is late maybe we should act to remind government that we are watching.

MOTION We call on the Government of Canada to strictly adhere to the Convention on Cluster Munitions and enforce the ban on manufacture, distribution, and use of these weapons.

Action: This motion will be forwarded to pastoral charges along with a letter encouraging them to engage their MPs on this issue. A link to the AVAAZ campaign on this topic will be included. <u>www.avaaz.org</u>

Palestine - Information that a "Rosa Parks" like bus event is taking place was shared.

Report from Linda about Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). Linda did not spend all of the \$300.00 given to her. Expenses were \$260 and change. The balance will be returned to commission. Linda and other local attendees would be happy to talk to Presbytery. An article may be in Insight.

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TRC will be May 31, June 1, and 2 in Toronto. The theme will be intergenerational impact or trauma. We will be hearing from youth and adults. Cynthia Wesley-Esquimaux along with Council Fire will be taking the lead. The whole point of these events is education, respect, and engagement. It is hoped that the public will take advantage of this opportunity to really listen to the story. This is a joint effort between church and non-church groups.

There is hopefully another pre-event for youth at Georgina Island. They want to get a motivational speaker by the name of Eddie Robinson. The idea is to have aboriginal youth first then open it up for any interested youth. Linda is requesting that we forward the \$3000 pledged in May 2010 for this event instead. Glen mentioned the possibility of having bands that play on the Barrie station Sunday night on Rock 95. Maybe they can even sponsor them.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF October 26, 2011

Moved by Dennis Posno/Terry Thom that the minutes of October 26, 2011 approved with minor changes (regrets from Elaine Lush and late arrivals). **CARRIED**

4. PERSONNEL MINISTER'S REPORT

Todd had a power point presentation entitled "Effective Leadership and Healthy Pastoral Relationships". It covered all Pastoral Relations and Ministry & Personnel work including isolation, demographics, oversight and discipline, Pastoral Relations Policy reviews.

This arises out of concerns regarding our volunteer base being adequate to meet the standards of due diligence, consistency, justice and accountability. The existing system can't be "tweaked." Covenant and relationship building are not handled best through policy. Current system drains the time and resources of our volunteers.

Proposal

That the congregations would be responsible for discerning their mission and choosing a minister who fits the mission sees that the discerned mission actually happens.

That Presbytery be responsible for its mission, for collegiality and pastoral care of all ministers active and retired and that it support congregations regarding the clarity of their mission. That Conference be responsible for Pastoral Relations policy regarding credentials and employment standards. They would prepare position descriptions and conduct reviews. Staff would initiate and end relationships. Conference would also exercise discipline.

This proposal has deep implications because of the shift in polity from one court to another with staff taking over volunteer work. Formerly invisible costs would become visible.

Opportunities are that this would release time, energy, spirit into mission focused work Presbytery would become a forum of collegiality.

Such a system would provide consistency, quality, timeliness.

Search and selection would be more efficient with professional support.

Regular reviews by trained staff could better ensure ministry personnel are supported and accountable.

One Conference person would look after about 75 people. (17 new positions nationally.)

Our Response:

How can staff at Conference know people, background? There is a wealth of knowledge at local level.

Will compassion be lost?

Who will the staff person report to ?

How can decisions be appealed?

This seems to take power from congregations and Presbytery and is like an episcopal (bishop) system.

Presumably this is responding to needs.

Why is everything so complicated today? This adds more complication and eliminates the voice of those who know the churches.

Conference staff might work as a team and be able to use local people too.

Could this be a choice allowing some to "opt out" if their current system is working well? Would this cause more ministers to join a union?

Where will money come from? Some thought from the loss of key personnel at national level.

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Not addressed are students and discernment processes which would benefit from more standardization.

All are asked to send their concerns to Todd McDonald before next weekend.

5. **PASTORAL RELATIONS AGENDA** Paul Dempsey assumed the Chair.

(a) Evergreen Update: Nina Fulford and Ted Daglish are the new presbytery representatives on the second JNAC. Key people are away in November. A meeting will be scheduled in early December. Background material has been made available to Nina.

(b) Heritage Markham update

MOTION Linda Butler/Elaine Lush that the Presbytery representatives from the JNAC, Elizabeth Cunningham act as pastoral charge supervisor after December 31 until the new minister arrives. **CARRIED**

(c) Brown's Corners

They will not ask to reappoint Warren Schell on July 1, 2012. They will close and sell the church. A student might be sought to see them through the process. They are in contact with Vision and Church Redevelopment Commission.

(d) Collier Update

First round of interviews and visitations has occurred. Search committee meets on Dec 7.

(e) Severn Bridge update

Paul Dempsey reported that the congregation approved a call to Kathleen Taylor called at the October 30, 2011 meeting but the form has not been seen by Paul. Kathleen was advised that she could give notice. It is possible that the usual 90 days might be waived. If necessary a conference call might have to be arranged.

(f) Lake of Bays update

They have been conducting interviews and expect to make a decision by Christmas. They are using lay supply on Sundays.

(g) Trinity Newmarket update

JNAC recommended an interim for 1 ½ years but the Official board and finance committee believe they can't afford it. Andy Comar will meet with them. Leslie Sedore is serving as supply, and though trained for interim work she cannot undertake it without their permission.

(h) Knox Sutton update

Made choice to call but the person went elsewhere. Other prospects will be followed up. A 10 hours per week supply appointment will be considered at our December meeting.

(i) Central ADP

Central has sent notice of non-compliance. Todd reminded us that enrolment in ADP is mandatory for ministry personnel but lay staff may be paid by the local church. Most charges opt to put all staff on ADP. Those who do not register personnel in ADP will be charged a monthly fee. It was noted that recently some pastoral charges received in error a letter about non-compliance.

(j) Racial Justice/Sexual Abuse Workshops

Currently there are 12 ministry personnel NOT trained. A letter will be sent informing them that they have until Dec 31, 2012 to take training. After that they will no longer be considered "in good standing" and thus not eligible for calls or appointments. VAMs would lose their marriage licenses.

On line Racial Justice Training on Saturday May 5, 2012 and May 12, 2012 from noon to 2 pm. Registration will begin in December 2011.

A Sexual Harassment Workshop will be held on Wednesday, Oct 3, 2012, 9:30 to 4pm at Northern Waters Office in Alliston.

Further training will not be required unless there are policy changes.

MOTION by Dennis Posno/Linda Butler that Karl Burden be required to take Racial Justice and Sexual Abuse workshops by the end of 2012. **Carried.**

Those who took a recent workshops on Racial Justice were concerned about their effectiveness. Others reported the "on line" courses were better.

(k) Lesley Clare request to be retained on roll

MOTION byJane Wetelainen/Linda Butler that Lesley Clare be retained on the roll of Living Waters Presbytery. **CARRIED.**

A concern for pastoral care for those on disability was expressed, and it was noted that our retirees association keeps pastoral contact with those retained on the roll for disability.

(1) Sandford Zephyr With joy we received the report that the charge has decided to move Rev. Diane Bennett-Jones from part-time to full-time ministry as of Jan 1, 2012

(m) Regent Park/Forest Home

Jody Maltby, Todd McDonald and Paul Dempsey will meet next week with the Board to discuss the situation with their treasurer.

(n) King City They are still in search mode.

(o) Parry Sound Rural

The restorative care of the minister was discussed and it is noted that matters have been attended to by our Conference Minister for Personnel Support, Todd McDonald. Joe Gaspar is the pastoral charge supervisor.

(a) Lay Worship Leaders training and licensing A meeting of current LWLs might lead to setting up training in the Presbytery.

Camp Big Canoe 2011 Report

Bill Stevens reported that since his first year as the Director of Camp Big Canoe, this past summer was the most inspiring with many spontaneous events lead by the camp staff happening to create a very magical unique community during the summer of 2011. Many of these events were for the age group of 13 & 14 year olds who were looking for ways to break with authority, who thought they were doing so during the late evening "illegal" activities but were really participating in planned ones.

This past summer Bill had more first year staff than usual and reported that all staff worked <u>for</u> each other thus creating a very positive, smiling atmosphere for staff and subsequently for campers.

This past summer, there were 339 campers attended Camp Big Canoe. 69 campers were supported by camperships. Already registered for the 2012 camping season are 80 campers! Presbytery is encouraged to support Camp Big Canoe by talking to people who have children of camp age and distributing the camp brochures for 2012.

Commission Budget

For 2012, we have requested \$1000 above the 2011 budget for a total of \$8000 for carry forward the work of the Commission.

Ross Carson talked about an idea that had come from the cluster of churches to which York Pines belongs. The cluster was suggesting that the S.D. Commission hire two leaders to conduct seven Vacation Bible Camps around the Presbytery. The VBC would cost the hosting church \$500 with the balance of leaders' salaries coming from other sources such as "Seeds of Hope", etc. The VBCs would be geared to children ages 5 - 12. Ross Carson and Meg Jordan are the beginnings of a sub-committee to pursue the VBC idea. Others interested in being part of the sub-committee should contact Ross Carson.

Sunday School Teachers Workshop

Discussion with Kathy Harrison regarding the sponsorship of a Sunday School Teachers Workshop continues under the leadership of Nancy Knox, Ross Carson, Meg Jordan and Jody Maltby. The members of the Commission felt that spring would be the best time to hold such an event. It was also suggested that this same committee could further discuss the idea of VBCs organization.

Helen Bishop reported that Jody Maltby has been joining the visiting teams and has been a helpful resource to congregations.
- b. Muskoka Falls Pastoral Charge
 During its pastoral oversight visit, chair Wayne Moore requested a listening team visit the pastoral charge to help them discern next steps. Jerry indicated that he would speak with Audrey Brown about arranging for a listening team.

3. Property and Finance

- a. Severn Bridge Pastoral Charge Church Modernization Grant application -There was some confusion about whether a motion had been passed approving the grant application, and if so, whether the application had been forwarded to Toronto Conference for processing. Jerry indicated he would check and advise Patti Rodgers at the presbytery office so that the pastoral charge may be assured to have its application considered in the 2012 round of funding.
- b. Siloam Cemetery Board The presbytery has been contacted by the Siloam Cemetery Board with a request for assistance. The board is comprised of aging members who have operated the cemetery since the congregation closed in 1969. Jerry and Cora Brodie attended the board's meeting on October 23, 2011. Members of the community were invited to attend in the hopes that fresh volunteers may wish to take over some of the responsibilities of maintaining the cemetery. The board has contacted the municipality with respect to closing the cemetery and handing it to the municipality under the Cemeteries Act. Jerry asked that they provide a balance sheet, and to delay a

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decision to close to give the community members present an opportunity to consider continuing the operation of the cemetery.

- c. Mount Albert Pastoral Charge fence dispute. A resolution has been reached and Jerry has suggested that the pastoral charge apply to the contingency fund for assistance with the cost of legal fees.
- d. Aurora Pastoral Charge Jerry has been in communication with Aurora regarding their rental properties. The pastoral charge is contemplating developing the property for use as a chronic or homecare facility.
- e. Lake of Bays Pastoral Charge heritage status. A request came from Lake of Bays to have the Stewart Memorial United Church designated as a heritage site. Jerry has been in contact with the Municipality of Lake of Bays for clarity on their by-laws and has received a response. He has also been in contact with Eric Mathieson at the General Council Office seeking advice as to whether heritage designation is a help or a hindrance to a congregation. It is hoped that a policy may be developed by the commission at some point in the future. In the meantime, Jerry wished to do further research before responding to the request from Lake of Bays. There was discussion about the role of the commission is a decision making body, or a resource which assists the congregation is coming to its own decision.
- f. York Pines Pastoral Charge Application to Toronto Conference Accessibility Fund. An application was received from York Pines at the meeting.

MOTION That having received the application from York Pines Pastoral Charge, the Congregational Life Commission of Living Waters Presbytery approves the application to the Toronto Conference Accessibility fund for \$5,000.00 toward their accessibility project.

5. Other Business

- a. United Church Foundation Jerry encouraged members to become acquainted with the United Church Foundation as an investment vehicle for churches currently holding assets in long term investments. The rate of return is favourable.
- b. Congregational Name Change A request for a change of name came from Emsdale Pastoral Charge. There was discussion on the commission creating a policy around the process for changing the name of a pastoral charge. Jerry suggested contacting Unity or Heart of Muskoka Pastoral Charges to enquire as to the process they used. Jerry will speak to Jody Maltby about checking

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the files for these pastoral charges for processes used in the past. It was suggested that once a process has been developed that it go into the Living Waters Presbytery Handbook for future reference.

b. Community Connections and Right Relationships – Glen Eagle and Susan Eagle

The Social Justice Network of Ontario Conferences met this past week and compared what is happening in conferences across Ontario. They are planning to have a presence at Queen's Park in the form of a person who would be a reference for media, MPP's and others who are looking for SJNOC. It is felt this is necessary as there are no national church staff people to turn to for provincial matters.

Kairos met with the SJNOC. The Kairos focus this year will be on aboriginal issues. Kairos is trying to start a local group in Barrie.

ISARC Housing group is asking each Conference to hold meetings with MPPs regarding housing and poverty issues housing. The commission is looking for United Church contacts in each riding who would work on this objective.

Kairos has an excellent page of information on the situation in Attawapitskat

The Inter Presbyteries consultation group on Social Justice in Toronto Conference has decided to hold a workshop on Oct 27th, 2012 at Evergreen Brickworks (Toronto). The topic will be a "how-to" on advocacy and social justice issues.

The motion made at the November 15, 2011 meeting concerning the presbytery's opposition to Bill C-10 was forwarded to all of the members of parliament who have ridings in Living Waters Presbytery, and the office of the Prime Minister. Some responses have been received, all of which support the bill, but thank the presbytery for its comments.

c. Spiritual Development - Nancy Knox

The commission's fall work has been around Youth Ministry including the Confirmation retreats, Ubuntu service and Worshiplude trip. A church musicians event was held and well received In the new year events for pastoral visiting, and children's ministries will be held.

d. Men's Ministries – Ted Meyers reporting for George Bishop

Men's retreats will be held at Camp Big Canoe for fellowship, spiritual and physical work. Look for more information (both stay over and day opportunities will be available)

e. United Church Women – Helen Bishop

On November 28th the UCW Presbyterial gathered at Stouffville United Church for its Christmas meeting. There were 87 women present. In the morning a florist from Stouffville came and showed the women how to assemble Christmas arrangements. After lunch some of the ladies got Executive Dec 13, 2011

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into costumes to become part of the living nativity pageant led by Rev. Nancy Waterman. The presentation was warmly received. The next meeting of the Presbyterial will be held on February 13, 2012 at St. Matthews United Church in Richmond Hill. The guest speaker will be John Harries and his topic will be a study of various versions of the bible over the years.

- f. Vision and Church Development Don Spratt and Terry Davies
 - i. Brown's Corners nothing to report.
 - ii. Holly assets The Mapleview Avenue building owned by Toronto United Church Council is for sale. The presbytery owns 3-400 chairs which remain in the building. Many of the chairs are in need of repair. TUCC has asked that they remain in the building as assets to be included in the sale price. The commission has agreed that this is prudent. Ted noted that Camp Big Canoe would like 100 of those chairs. There is continued conversation with Canada Revenue Agency regarding some assets listed in a 2008 return. David Allen is hosting an "Exploring Ministry" event June 8-9 at Emmanuel for anyone who is interested in attending. Free lodging and board for ministers and the people they bring. More information to come.

Jane will work with Todd to draft a letter (to be sent in January) regarding mandatory training in Sexual Abuse Policy Awareness and Racial Justice for all in paid accountable ministry. Requirements must be fulfilled by Dec 31, 2012. Another Sexual Abuse Policy Awareness workshop will be held at Emmanuel in March. On-line Racial Justice workshop will also be offered.

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All Presbyters serving on JNACs, JSCs or other Presbytery meetings are urged to submit their claims monthly. It was suggested that a line be added to the form to reflect this requirement which allows for better budget control. If the budgeted amount is exceeded then it would be possible to request more funds but all were urged to be as economical as possible (car pools, not attending unnecessary meetings, using conference calls etc.)

JSCs should request eligibility reports when they have a short list (1-3) of candidates. Todd is able to communicate with other Personnel Ministers and will relay pertinent information to the JSC.

It was suggested that new ordinands who may now seek their own calls be coached on the process. In todays culture some will want to know why they were not considered a good match. Need to be reminded that pastoral relationship searches are spirit-led and involve more than credentials.

4. PASTORAL RELATIONS - Chaired by Linda Butler

- 4.1. Evergreen Update: Nina has called a first meeting of the new JNAC for Dec 19, 2011 at 6:30 pm. A one-day JNAC process will follow in early January. At our January 2012 meeting we will seek to provide a supply appointment.
- 4.2. Heritage Markham update: Rick reported that two people are being considered. The JNAC asks for an ordained minister but a resume from a DLM is very interesting. If this person were chosen it would be necessary to have a congregational meeting to change the JNAC. If they do decide to forgo the requirement for ordination it might be prudent that the vacancy be readvertised accordingly before issuing a call or appointment.
- 4.3. Collier Update: Should make a decision soon.
- 4.4. King City: no news
- 4.5. Lake of Bays update: They have a capable LWL supplying frequently. JSC expect to make a decision by Christmas.
- 4.6. Trinity Newmarket update: A special congregational meeting to be held Jan 15 to discuss the JNAC recommendation of appointing a trained interim. Leslie Sedore, current supply, would become the interim and could start to apply her interim skills.

- 5.6 **Training for Licensed Lay Worship Leaders:** Patti Rodgers has submitted a proposal for a training programme for licensed lay worship leaders. The committee will be studying this early in the new year and looking for volunteers to provide the instruction. Jane and George on track.

Objective of the Presentation:

To inform Visioning and Church Development Commission members, Congregational Life Commission members, and Executive members of Living Waters Presbytery of potential strategic approaches for supporting Congregations in the development of stronger more vibrant congregations by working with EDGE.

Welcome and Introductions:

Terry Davies welcomed everyone and introduced the presenters: Rob Dalgleish, Executive Director of EDGE, and Lesley Harrison, Consultant and Coach Coordinator of EDGE.

Opening Worship:

Rob Dalgleish led us in singing "Spirit of Life" with actions and Jim Keenan led us in prayer.

Presentation: Part 1 – Where the Church is Today

Rob Dalgleish opened with an" Awareness Test" to make us aware that we do not always see everything that is happening and in times of change there is a need to shift our focus. Rob made us aware of the fact that the church is undergoing the greatest change in the past 1600 years. He emphasized that all churches have been affected, not just the United Church. He referred to Phyllis Tickle's book "The Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why". Rob discussed "Organizational Theory" and the present need for considering relationships rather than things, flow of things rather than structure, trust and empowerment rather than command and control, and focusing on abundance rather than scarcity.

Rob emphasized that changes that have occurred in the church are mainly due to the fact that the world has changed and not due to anything specifically that the church has done.

Lesley Harrison helped us look at how much technology has grown recently and the related fears. She shared with us a "Framework of How Things Work" from modern to post-modern. In modern times the church focused on the road to truth and God's kingdom while in post-modern times there is more focus on mysticism, spirituality and many truths. Post-modern times allow more freedom and choice.

Rob had us reflect on "How Have You Experienced the Shift?" and many shared the impact that it has had on them.

Part 2 – The Role of EDGE for the United Church

Rob outlined how EDGE, under the umbrella of the National Church, is a network for Ministry Development, a "living web of new and renewing ministries" to assist presbyteries and congregations in making decisions regarding the future. EDGE has just completed its first year of existence in which it exceeded its mandate to have 300 participants, 30 key networks, 3 stories of engagement and \$30 000 revenue. It now has 20 consultants and 6 coaches.

EDGE is willing to work with presbyteries to identify regional possibilities and for a fee is prepared to offer Assessment and Development Tools for congregations in transition, congregations seeking renewal and congregations considering partnering or amalgamations.

At 7:45pm there was a brief refreshment break and at 8:00 pm the meeting was reconvened by Terry Davies.

Proposed Strategic Approach:

Terry commented on the decline of Christians in communities, the decline of United Church memberships, the decline of youth and younger adults in congregations and the aging of congregations. He shared with the group that after looking over 24 different annual reports of Living Waters congregations, it could be summarized that about one third were healthy, prosperous and growing, about one third were making it work with much fundraising, and about one third were struggling. Terry pointed out that although there are many different resources available to the presbytery including church websites, church publications, TUCC resources, Centre for Church Development leadership and the National Office's EDGE, there has been no way to capture these in one place.

Working with EDGE in a Network Planning Process will allow us to tap into all the available resources in an ordered manner.

Discussion followed regarding the value of Living Waters Presbytery engaging both EDGE and TUCC in helping the presbytery to develop a Church Development Strategy. Funding would need to be requested from PTCC to cover the costs. It was pointed out that the Vision and Church Development Commission has already budgeted some money for such a purpose.

MOTION that the Vision and Church Development Commission working with the Congregational Life Commission develop a Church Development Strategy for the Presbytery that will be responsive to the context of individual existing congregations. The Strategy will be developed in concert with resources available such as EDGE Network and TUCC. When this strategy is prepared, it will be shared with the full court of presbytery and congregations will be invited to be part of the program.

On November 15, 2011, the Community Connections and Right Relations Commission of Living Waters Presbytery passed the following motion, with a request that it be brought to your attention:

<u>Motion</u>

Whereas on Sept 20, 2011 Federal Justice Minister Rob Nicholson tabled C-10, the government's new crime bill, formally known as The Safe Streets and Communities Act. and

Whereas this bill actually comprises nine smaller bills, C-54; S-10; C-4; C-16; C-39; C-23b; C-5; S-7; C-56, that were introduced by the Conservative government during its minority rule, but were never passed and now will not have time for significant discussion, and

Whereas this will cost the provinces, territories and federal Government added billions of tax dollars, and,

Whereas the United Church upholds the ideals of restorative justice and the direction of this Bill is punitive and not restorative, and

Whereas places like Texas (who recently closed a prison due to lower prison population) and the UK have found the restorative, program based approach to be extremely more cost efficient and successful with regard to street safety and recidivism, and

Therefore be it resolved that we the Community Connections and Right Relations Commission of Living Waters Presbytery of The United Church of Canada , forward to The Federal Government of Canada and relevant media, our objection to the passing of Bill C-10 **Carried**

Nancy Knox called the meeting to order, welcomed everyone and then asked each person present to share a piece of scripture or hymn that related to where he/she was on life's journey today. Sharing time was followed by prayer.

The agenda for today was reviewed and additions made.

Camping Ministry Updates Camp Big Canoe

Bill Stevens reported that as a result of tree limbs falling on the hydro line and causing a very minor fire in the summer and another tree falling on hydro lines at Thanksgiving, the hydro lines on the camp property have been well cleared.

A new secured storage building for canoes, vehicles, etc has been built to the right of The Barn.

In 2011, 239 campers enjoyed a "magical" summer camping experience on site. There are presently 112 campers already registered for 2012 which reflects the previous good summer camping time.

At present, Bill Stevens, the Camp Director is interviewing and recruiting 37 staff members for the 2012 camping season. Thirty-six of last year's staff have re-applied.

An application has been made to offer a high school credit for the Outdoor Skills and Leaders in Training programs starting the summer of 2012. The program offered remains as in previous years but completion of more paperwork will be involved!

Bill asked for Presbytery's support in the following ways:

- make a link to Camp Big Canoe website on the Presbytery website (Patti Rodgers to be contacted about this request)
- provide a mailing list for all the churches in the Presbytery so that camp brochures can be mailed out to them (mailing list available online; brochures can be put in church folders for pickup by Presbytery reps at March meeting)
- informing churches of availability of speakers about Camp Big Canoe (put message on roll around/powerpoint presentation for viewing prior to Presbytery meeting)
- asking churches to mention Camp Big Canoe in their church bulletin each week (put message on roll around/powerpoint presentation for viewing prior to Presbytery meeting)
- support the use of church camping placemats at Presbytery lunches (in the process of being designed and printed)

Bill reminded the Commission that churches are free to support any camp within the Presbytery, not just Camp Big Canoe that has been assigned to Living Waters Presbytery. The important thing is that children go to camp! Time to speak about Camp Big Canoe at the next Presbytery meeting will be requested at the Executive meeting.

Discussion followed about the differences between a United Church Camp and any other/secular camp. Bill summed up the discussion with the idea that the counsellors at a United Church camp care about the individual campers with no judgement as to disabilities, physical appearances, behaviours, etc. All are treated equally and as themselves. Christian values are lived.

Youth Ministry Updates

Ubuntu Service

The Advent Ubuntu Service was not well attended.

Next one will be on Good Friday with the possibility of Mary Jo Leddy as guest speaker. Monica Moore is looking for Youth groups to participate in the event.

Worshiplude

There is still room on the bus for Worshiplude this weekend.

Inter-Presbytery Confirmation Classes

Plans by the team of Monica Moore, Jody Maltby, Andrea Wheaton, Nancy Knox, Andy Komar, Ruth Noble and Dennis Posno are well underway. Fifty-five youth have already registered. The first weekend gathering will be February 24-25 at Midland United Church. The second will be at Muskoka Woods Camp on April 20-22. This activity was originally a combined effort by Northern Waters and Living Waters but has become a Living Waters supported event. We wondered how long Northern Waters will wish to share responsibility for the event. There was some discussion around the idea that youth participation is directly related to leader participation.

Youth at Conference

There will be a Youth at Conference event this year although a leader is yet to be named. There will also be a Children at Conference event with Audrey Brown as leader. Children will be those of delegates only and will sleep with parents or guardians at night. More details to come.

Youth Mission Interest

Pat MacDonald reviewed the preparation and origin of the 2010 Youth Mission. She would be interested in leading a Living Waters Presbytery youth mission in the future. At the end of February, she is leading an adult group from Burton Ave UC to an isolated community in Nicaragua and working directly with the Moravian Church there who are partners with the UCC. She will look into the possibility of taking a presbytery youth group on a similar mission in the future. The Commission will revisit the idea at the March meeting when Pat returns.

Children's Ministry Updates

Workshops on Godly Play

Previously, Dalston-Crown Hill UC has told the Commission that they would be willing to host a Presbytery sponsored Godly Play workshop. Meg Jordan has since followed up with Amy Crawford, our specialist in Godly Play workshops and tentatively planned two – one on Saturday, April 14 at York Pines UC with Ross Carson coordinating the event and one on Saturday, April 28 at Bracebridge UC with Nancy Knox coordinating the event. These two locations will provide easy access for both northern and southern churches in our Presbytery.

The aim of the workshop is to support people leading children's worship and will provide an introduction to the Godly Play curriculum.

A soup and sandwich lunch will be offered by each host church – donation baskets provided. Meg will confirm with Amy Crawford regarding format and cost; Nancy will prepare the flyer. Information needs to be out to the congregations as soon as possible as well as put in church folders for March Presbytery meeting. Meg will promote the event at the March Presbytery meeting also.

LUNCH BREAK Set up of Children's Ministry Facebook page

Following lunch, Nancy Knox shared an email request from Andrea Gaspar, Parry Sound area, regarding the set up of a Living Waters Children's Ministry Facebook page. Discussion followed concerning who would administer it, the use of photographs, and the format of the group – open/closed. Jody Maltby provided a copy of the Social Media guidelines from the UCC (available on UCC website). The Commission determined that accountability and the need to follow the guidelines were most important. Having a volunteer willing to administer such a site was wonderful as long as the guidelines were followed. It was felt that both the Presbytery Office and Andrea Gaspar should share the job of administrator of the Facebook page and that the Living Waters Children's Ministry Facebook page should be linked to the Living Waters Presbytery Facebook page. Audrey Brown will be asked to assist with the setup.

Vacation Bible School

Ross Carson added more information to the previous discussion at November's Commission meeting:

Vacation Bible School should be a full day program with the provision of before and after child care available. Host churches would be needed to offer the program on a weekly basis. Two Presbytery trained leaders would be provided to lead the camp at each church; their salary to be paid by the host church. The hiring and training of the potential staff would take place over the winter of 2012/13 for operation in the summer of 2013. Host churches would also need to provide room and board for the Presbytery leaders.

Ross will contact Ruth Noble about the Ottawa Vacation Bible School program she has knowledge of.

A poll will be taken at the March Presbytery meeting as to the interest in a Presbytery-based Vacation Bible School program. Follow up will be provided.

Spiritual Care and Visitors Training

Ross Carson has attended a meeting of the York Region Parish Nurses' support group, spoke at the meeting and has had email contact with Carol Rose-Kudelka, a member of the York Region Parish Nurses' support group. The group is interested in developing a two-hour program that could be offered on a Saturday morning or an evening. The program would assist in developing good visiting skills; increase understanding of the dynamics of health, illness and grief; promote the importance of confidentiality; and, develop active listening skills.

The Commission is interested in pursuing this training opportunity. Ross will contact them and find out how far afield they are willing to travel to present the workshop and its cost. Further details at the March meeting.

Other Business

Jody Maltby was contacted by Aldo Di Giovanni regarding a Christ – like presentation he was willing to give based on the question "How would Jesus respond?" He was unable to provide Jody with details. The Commission decided not to pursue the offer and Jody will inform the presenter as to our decision.

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Since a donation was given to Five Oaks last year, Ross Carson thought that it would be a good idea to have the Director of Five Oaks speak to the Presbytery at the June meeting. Nancy will make this request of the Presbytery executive at their next meeting.

Pat MacDonald wondered about the Commission organizing spiritual retreats/information. Discussion followed. It was thought that a team should be gathered to facilitate this idea. Further discussion will take place at a future meeting.

Presbytery Meeting Timing A process is needed regarding how to determine the timing future meetings.

Living Waters Vision Statement

We believe that, with God as our centre, and Jesus Christ as our guide, we will be in relationship as Living Waters Presbytery so that we may be a *Spirit-led, inclusive community offering encouragement and support, and embracing new ways to be the church.*

Statement of Strategy – Forging Forward in Spiritual Abundance

To create a planning process that caters to the needs of individual congregations and provides encouragement and support for those wishing to respond to changing population levels, demographic profiles and cultural shifts, employing facilitation resources and tools available through various areas of the United Church such as EDGE and TUCC. To better position Living Waters to set priorities for support and funding.

A. Supporting the need for Change in Existing Congregations

- Enable the community to be led from a place of Spiritual Abundance rather than Scarcity
- Respect the diverse viewpoints of the congregation

1. Fully Facilitated Process

In Partnership with EDGE work with individual congregations that are ready to energetically look for new ways to celebrate Christianity.

The process will provide facilitators and tools to lead the congregation to a new Mission over a period of 12 to 18 months

There has to be determination on the part of the congregation and awareness that the process will require considerable work and present challenges to the community.

Funding for this work will be substantially by Presbytery, but also require a contribution from the congregation.

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2. Support Tools for congregations

EDGE will assist congregations to acquire tools that will allow some individual analysis and discernment on the potential for the community. This preliminary process may lead to the decision to move into a Fully Facilitated Process:-

- Environics led review
- Natural Church Development Survey & Reports
- Other Tools (TBD)

Funding of these tools will be jointly by congregation and Presbytery

B. Supporting Presbytery Reconfiguration to reflect Change in Population areas.

Every year there is a shifting profile of each congregation's community. These changes are particularly prevalent in the light of ever declining church attendance, as Urban areas expand and people leave smaller Rural communities.

Regular assessment of these changes provides understanding of both the opportunities and challenges for congregations.

1. Identifying opportunities for expansion and relocation

Congregations may have the opportunity to flourish by the	
expansion of their existing facilities or by relocation (sometimes in	concert with
other congregations).	

Working with TUCC and the congregation(s), these opportunities be examined and support will be given to bring these into effect.

2. Supporting potential mergers

The changes within the area of congregations may provide that merging two or more congregations will provide the best opportunity to create a healthy merged entity.

There is clear evidence that merging one church into another existing church rarely works in long term.

The potential of closing two churches and creating a new single location will be considered and may provide the best opportunity to create a New Shared Mission, without baggage. A healthy new energised congregation is more likely to result.

This work will involve considerable care and energy and require support from other commissions (CL, Personnel) and potentially TUCC.

will

3. Group Ministries

Examine the potential of Group Ministries of several congregations as a new approach to optimise the varied strengths of congregations and ministers.

4. Supporting closures of churches, where necessary

When there is no other alternative, closure of a church may be decided working with the congregation. VCD and CL will work with the congregation to accomplish this in the best possible manner.

5. New Church Development

Where new population centres emerge, New Church potential will be examined. It is assumed that most of these opportunities will be connected to (1) & (2) above.

In order to optimize the potential of the above strategic areas, we will collaborate with:-

- Congregational Life and other commissions
- National Church
 - EDGE organization www.edge-ucc.ca
- TUCC www.tucc.ca
 - Real Estate and Planning
 - Centre for Church Development Leadership

D. EDGE Full Process Criteria

Congregations will be invited to become part of the Pilot in 2012. We will need to establish Criteria for selection. Criteria may include:-

- Various size congregations
- Rural and Urban
- Different geographic areas
- Strongest willingness to go the whole way

E. 2012 Potential

The following are initial assumptions for planning purposes

We will work with EDGE and they have indicated that they will provide part of this work on a Pro Bono basis...assume our part \$5k (from existing budget)

- Aim at 5 Pilots for full process @ \$6k each, less a contribution of \$2k from congregation. Presbytery cost <u>...\$20k</u>
- Identify and make available components from EDGE for other congregations...
 - 10 Environics Study @ \$200 each...Presbytery cost <u>\$2k</u>
 - 5 NCD Surveys and Reports @ \$600 each, less contribution

of \$200 from congregation...Presbytery Cost <u>\$2k</u>

3. Supporting Presbytery Reconfiguration

- a. Relocation and expansion of Churches
 - Potentially 2 Area Plans through TUCC @ \$15k each...\$30k

4. Budget Implications

i. <u>PRESENTATION ON REMIT 6:</u>

Jane Wetelainen, Chair, Personnel Commission led us through the process of voting for Remit 6. She reminded us that each of our Pastoral Charges also must vote on this Remit. The study material has been available from the national church for many months.

Jane gave us a brief background on the statements of faith of the United Church – the first is the 20 articles of faith in the Basis of Union, noting that each generation has made an addition to our formal words of subordinate clauses. These being: The 1940 Statement; The New Creed; The Song of faith.

This remit is testing the will of the church to include each of the additional subordinate clauses into the Basis of Union.

Questions for Clarification

Clarification was sought as to how to transmit votes on the remits. It was noted that a form was sent to each pastoral charge, in September, these pastoral charge forms are also on the available to download from: <u>http://gc40.united-church.ca/downloads/remit_06</u>

Each Presbytery also transmits their voting forms to General Council.

Clarification was sought re: the issue of essential agreement. When people are entering into the order of ministry, they must be in essential agreement with the Basis of Union – how does this affect essential agreement?

One implication of acknowledging more than one subordinate standard is that the standards would be seen to be "in dialogue" with one another. For example, when presbyteries examine candidates for ministry to determine whether they are "in essential agreement with the statement of doctrine" (The Manual 026(c)), both presbyteries and candidates would take into consideration all of the faith statements the United Church acknowledges as its formal doctrine. (from http://www.united-church.ca/files/beliefs/statements/our-words-of-faith.pdf)

Clarification re: Does a Presbyter vote the same way as their Session voted? It was noted that our understanding of voting within church courts is that one would vote one's conscience while being be open to the leading of the Holy Spirit

Discussion ensued as to the historical value of the 1940 statement of faith – recognizing that it is dated in regards to language. We are not voting on the theology of the statement, but its inclusion as part of our faith statement process.

In that the United Church of Canada was formed by an act of Parliament- will this be discussed in Parliament? – or reported to them?

No. The federal Act that established the United Church made reference to subordinate standards as follows:

That nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed to limit the independent and exclusive right and power of the United Church to legislate in all matters concerning its doctrine, worship, discipline and government, including therein the right and power from time to time to frame, adopt, alter, change, add to or modify its laws, subordinate standards and formulas, and to determine and declare the same or any of them, but subject to the conditions and safeguards in that behalf contained in the Basis of Union.1 (from: http://www.unitedchurch.ca/files/beliefs/statements/our-words-of-faith.pdf)

Does this song of faith fully explain the beliefs of the United Church? Reminder that all are to be used together.

If the standard is these have become part of fabric of the United Church of Canada, the song of faith does not meet this criteria – it is not well enough known nor used enough yet – to be a part of the fabric of our church yet.

Point of Order: Phillip Cable asked the mover to respect the debate and not respond to each speaker.

The debate continued along its natural path. Discussion as to the merits of including a statement that is still not well known – both as a challenge to us to begin to know it....and to the realities of including old statements – that we really don't use either. A reminder that the song of faith was passed by a General Council (2006)

Point of order a Request for a ballot was made. Harry Ramsaren and Bruce Chappell acted as Scrutineers to count the ballots 67 yes, 13 no.

d) Community Connections and Right relations – Glen Eagle

Glen reported that the commission is involved in ongoing work which includes these three ongoing issues:

e) Spiritual Development – Ross Carson

Ross noted that Nancy Knox is currently on tour in Israel

Ross updated us on Five Oaks. Mardi Tindal has discerned that she will not return to her position as director of Five Oaks education and retreat centre. Watch for the call for applications.

Confirmation: 54 confirmands are attending our Presbytery confirmation event. The February weekend was cancelled due to weather but the April event will cover all the necessary topics.

Workshops: Ministry with children workshops April 14 and April 28 watch for flyer – they were in the presbytery packages today, and also they were sent to all pastoral charges through our presbytery office. This event is open to all interested. It is a response to many of our common problems associated with ministry with children. Note that these events are north and south and we hope that this will enable people to attend either. The event will be led by Amy Crawford who will give an introduction to Godly Play. There will also be an alternate session for those not interested in Godly Play. Note these workshops will be held no matter what. Everyone is invited. This is a good place for people who might want to learn to tell stories to children of spiritual nature acknowledging changing language and images. Please come, even if you have to come at the last minute.

Youth: Ross called on Jody Maltby to report. She noted that a flyer re: Ubuntu service to be held on Good Friday at St Paul's Orillia has been sent out. This service features youth leadership from many different churches. Music leadership will be from Awesome Revelation from Westmount church. Adults are welcome to attend as long as they behave themselves.

Youth to AGM: We approved five youth to participate in AGM Conference. We still have 10 spots available if you know of youth ages 15-25, who would like to participate in a fully integrated program. Youth will participate in decision-making processes at Toronto Conference. Please contact Jody if you have interested youth.

General Council Youth Forum: This program runs in conjunction with General Council. We have until May 1st to name a Youth Forum participant. They do not vote but work with Council and also as part of a separate program. Please contact Jody for the nomination form.

Children's Summer Ministry: Please look for a survey in your pastoral charge presbytery folder. The Commission is seeking your input re: future possibility of a presbytery "travelling" VBS. Please find this survey and respond.

Pat MacDonald reported on her congregation's trip to Nicaragua. She reminded us of the work we do with the Moravian church there, through the M and S fund, and noted that in giving we are changing lives. The commission will consider youth mission possibilities there.

f) UCW – Helen Bishop

Presbyterial met in February at St Matthews. Rev. John Harries was the speaker with his collection of bibles in honour of the KJV 400^{th} anniversary. Helen reminded us to check our family Bibles – there may be treasures abounding there. Many things may be tucked away within the pages.

50th Annivesary Celebration of the merging of the WMS and WA to become the UCW. In honour of this there will be a celebration at Northwest Barrie United Church on April 16th. The women are invited to wear gold. The guest speaker is Eleanor Wood, a humorous storyteller.

g) Men's Ministries – Helen Bishop on behalf of George Bishop

Spring Roundup April 20-22 at Jackson's point. David Wilson, the Editor of the Observer, is speaker. Saturday will involve a discussion re: Why AOTS?

The Men's Ministry group is working with Camp Big Canoe and will be working on two days in June to help clean up the camp.

h) Vision and Church Development – Terry Davies

Terry Davies presented the Forging Forward strategy of the commission.

This is a new strategy that was passed by commission on Feb 28th.

The concept is that we are forging forward in spiritual abundance.

The word forging was carefully chosen. We are wanting to create something that is hard and resilient and acknowledging that change won't be easy.

The commission is partnering with Edge from the national church and with TUCC as well. The emphasis is on working with the existing congregation to facilitate the process to move in a new direction, to move away from a place of scarcity to spiritual abundance.

This is a 12-18 month process and involves a great deal of work. It is intended to be primarily funded by presbytery. The commission will come to June plenary with this proposal.

This opportunity will be available to each congregation. The congregation must be ready to give up the past and to move into the future. There will be a series of workshops at which congregations will have a chance to hear more about it. They will need to have detailed understanding to move forward and can then self identify as ready to go ahead. There will be an initial pilot project of 5 for this year. There are a series of tools that they can use. The Natural Church Development survey and process are a foundational piece of this process, as well as Environics.

Some congregations may want to use some of the tools as a starting point and then maybe they will do the whole process in a future year. Please note that congregations will not bear

the lions share but will be supported by presbytery. Please expect this information in the next few months. Prayerfully and carefully consider if this is the right timing for your congregation.

More than Franchises – Terry is looking for 4 others interested in going. Please speak to him or Jody if you are interested. They need to know by March 31 to get good rate.

SPIRIT SIGHTINGS

Chair Pat Edmonds noted the following: Introduction of Mary Jane, our temporary administrator.

Pat asked for prayers for Terry Dunlop's family and for Linda Parsons's husband.

Pat celebrated our ministers with significant anniversaries of years of service: Dorothy Wilson 55; Bob Rumble 55; Dennis Posno 40; Ross Carson 35; Susan Eagle 35; David Vipond 35; Walter Franklin Hearne 30 years; Jane Wetelainen 25 years.

Pat noted the banner and how much our congregations have responded to it. She asked us to indicate if we would like to purchase one for our congregation to please let her know. The more we order the better the price.

Court broke for lunch at 12:00 p.m. with Pat leading us in grace.

Court reconvened at 1:10pm

v. TORONTO CONFERENCE RESTRUCTURING – Pat Edmonds

Pat presented some highlights from the Toronto Conference Review survey that folks were invited to participate in. She noted that clearly two problems were primary; one was distance the other was communication. She noted that there are no real solutions to these problems and reminded everyone who feels far from us to invite us to come to your church.

There were comments that I would go to presbytery if I knew when and where it was. A reminder was given that we send out the invitation asking us to reply and we then send out the agenda. Please read your presbytery mail!!!

Saturday meetings are an issue for some. One person said they prefer Saturday meetings. Pat noted that we promised that we would give a year of combining Saturday and late aft/evening. The next meeting on June 12 will be the year end of that experiment. After that you will be given an opportunity to vote on your meeting time preference. We will base our decision re: future meetings on those ballots. Please watch for those and send in your vote.

Pat also noted some positives, including

- The availably of staff in our presbytery office.
- The use of a worship team and more singing.

- The development of the mission statement and vision and that all were able to participate in the process.
- The Handbook good to foster understanding of our process and purpose

Regarding decision-making: many like the new structure of decisions in commissions and find it empowering with a better sense of ownership and it also eliminates voting on motions without knowing all the facts for each. Note: if you feel like you do not know what is going on, please read the minutes of the commission. This is how we are communicating with each other.

Meeting Balance: Some want more business, some want more inspiration and education. We are trying to do this as much as possible. Today is a good example of a good balance. Business in morning – inspiration in afternoon – thus we leave uplifted.

Pat reminded us that we are still a work in progress. We are making a gallant effort to work within the new structure. We are still feeling our way. It is still a bit messy, but all births are and this is the birth of a new thing.

She noted that 50% of people responded. This is a great response number for a survey.

Pat reminded us that some recommendations that will be reported on from this process at the Toronto Conference AGM will not apply to us as they are general and reflect policies from other presbyteries.

vi. CAMP BIG CANOE PRESENTATION Ruth Noble presented on behalf of Bill Stevens

Forty-four staff have been hired. They have their first meeting on March 25. One hundred fiftynine (159) campers have registered so far compared to 132 a year ago. They have 200 beds, so there is room for more.

<u>Partnerships:</u> <u>TUCC</u> Coordinates Donation Opportunities to the Camping Opportunity fund.

Here is a poem written by Antony Bigby a 16 year old from 2009

I know this camp called CBC, they have a tree that named Mulchy the people there are awesome beyond belief. in the lodge where food's served for the day, comes a rowdy call of "Adam Bayes" and everything around you is hallelujah. There's just so many things to do, like swimming, sports and canoeing too And I'd never heard of roofball before I came here. Out trip, crafts, and polar bear, 'what's your morning if you're not there?' I can't believe it's over already, that's no hallelujah. Remember in the haunted tent, when around in circle the foosteps went. and the fear was just as real as Braden Durdle. Well we said our prayers to the Lord above, and hope descended like a dove, we made it through the night with hallelujah. Many times I've been here before, I've seen the lake, been to the store Truth is that it never really gets old. When I'm taking part in morning watch, In my life lies another notch The memories come rushing back to me with hallelujah. The fires dying and the flames grow cold. The light is slowly losing hold And the stars above are putting on a dance show. I can hear the loons at the end of days. While moon's aglow in a holy blaze, And the wild winds are whispering ...hallelujah. Look around the circle here, At the face which you now hold dear, They'll always have a place within you heart. Now take their hand and hold it tight, feel the warmth enjoy the light, And know you'll never be alone again...hallelujah. Though many tears may fall from saddened faces. We'll never really leave this place,

The Spirit of the CBC lives on within us. So lift your head, break out in song, let your voices ring out strong, With a wondrous and a holy Hallelujah.

vii. GENERAL COUNCIL COMMISSIONERS PROPOSAL – George Moore

George has been part of a group of GC40 commissioners who at their own expense and on their own time have been gathering. George thanked us for being here today and invited us to thank each other. George introduced a proposal to strengthen the office of the Moderator to better serve the UCC (Appendix A).

Rationale: Back in 1925, the uniting churches set forth in the Basis of Union the substance of the Christian faith, as commonly held among the churches, in twenty Articles. Article IX (The Manual, Section 2.9) states:

Of Regeneration. We believe in the necessity of regeneration, whereby we are made new creatures in Christ Jesus by the Spirit of God, who imparts spiritual life by the gracious and mysterious operation of His power, using as the ordinary means the truths of His word and the ordinances of divine appointments in ways agreeable to the nature of man.

George shared his journey that brought him to being a part of this proposal, including being part of a profound experience at 39th General Council in which the work there was a call to purpose. As he understood that call it was not only for the triennium, it was a call to purpose that was to give the church direction way down the road. What came out of this was that the spiritual status quo is unacceptable for our immediate time and needs.

At GC 40 a more holistic UCC resolved to move church to a deeper relationship with God. Yet there is a sense that the Spiritual relationship of our church is lacking.

In 1929 Sir Jospeh Flavelle wrote: "There is a disappointing lack of power in our Christian lives "This United Church, so successfully merged in all the mechanical processes, has, so far as one can observe, produced no deep consciousness of spiritual character, enlarged and enriched by new opportunities."

The question that the proposal asks is, is it possible that in strengthening the role of the moderator we can move us onto a deeper faith?

George then referred us to the proposal, as attached to the agenda. He made it clear that this was about the office of the moderator and is not an attack on the office of the General Secretary. The intention is to strengthen the office of the moderator to enable our spiritual nurturing.

Discussion: Question re: Clarification that the moderator is also our CEO. Is the hope that the

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moderator could speak with greater authority for the church in ecumenical matters? It was noted that the moderator already speaks on our behalf but this would strengthen their authority.

Concern re: polity: We are congregationally based so how does one person speak on all our behalves? Is this top down? Almost papal. It was noted that we do not recognize infallibility as a reality of the Moderator. Although we are congregational, we are also national, thus we must speak nationally.

George spoke personally of the need for a rudder for our spiritual boat.

Comments: Pastoral oversight re: bishops compared to other denominations. Presbytery is that bishop so how do we strengthen one office (moderator) when every other authority is conciliatory? It was noted that much of the proposal involved the wisdom of esteemed elders, a group of former moderators who work as mentors.

Clarification re: what power change does this represent? Isn't the moderator already the spiritual head of the church? Don't we all share the perception of our moderator as our spiritual head? We discussed when we have felt connected by the moderator and spiritually cared for, but realize and appreciate that different people bring different gifts to the moderator, and thus our connection to that is very personal.

Clarification re: intent not to question the work of the moderators but how that work is determined by shared wisdom and thus further empower the moderator to share their more feelings of spirituality, to make explicit something that is more implicit at this time.

Clarification re: hierarchy, consistency of messages. If the Moderator changes every three years how do we get consistency? The hope is that this can evolve gradually as positive evolution, not one person speaking but the common wisdom of the "elders."

Comment: Spiritual growth needs to be congregational; concern that this is about keeping the institution alive. One person cannot do this, it is too episcopal; called on our reformation heritage. We are all spiritual leaders.

viii. CCRR PRESENTATION ON PALESTINE/ISRAEL

– Wendy Gichuru

Partners in Mission: Title: Program Coordinator Africa & Middle East

Susan Eagle introduced the topic with the note that the action taken by the 40th General Council related to Israel and Palestine said in part: Recommend that the United Church Conferences, presbyteries, congregations and community ministries immediately enter into consultation, dialogue, study and prayer, and then take appropriate action toward ending the illegal occupation of Palestinian territory, and enter into conversation as to how to move the two peoples toward reconciliation (including, but not limited to economic boycott).

The Community and Right Relations Committee has became aware that this will be an issue at General Council 41, so they have invited Wendy Gichuru today to inform us with her expertise on the broad horizon of the myriad of issues.

Wendy Gichuru spoke to us, in part saying:

GC 40 nominated a task group and they will be bringing a report (to be released before GC possibly in May). Many in the United Church do not engage in the issue or are not comfortable of having a particular point of view. They are either polarized or confused. She acknowledged that the issues are very complex and confusing – we are all struggling with this issue.

However, we have a commitment to justice to walking with those oppressed and marginalized. So although it is not a straightforward issue, we must struggle with the issue of justice.

Wendy gave us a historical overview of United Church mission and partnership.

She reminded us that the United Church concept of mission has transformed into mission with justice. Thus we respond to requests for solidarity and justice. We continue to understand what it means to be in mission with justice.

She made us aware of the shared memory of what that journey may have looked like. Mission used to be one way. We went to other places, and decided we knew best. We have learned through our own history that this is not the right way. We need to receive a well as give. We understand that there is something for us to learn as well. It is a process and journey that we continue today. Effective mission requires boldness in gospel work with others, costly service for Christ, commitment to stewardship.

We have learned some lessons. In the 1920s we sent 600 missionaries to others. We are now wanting to bring others to accompany us. With partners, we are understanding the costly service for Christ, costly solidarity.

We acknowledge the polarized debates on the Palestine/Israel issues. We understand that sometimes we make a stance and this causes a tension. We recognize the tension this caused with our Jewish friends. We are involved with others for God's mission. However the reality on the ground is that in Palestine, Israel is in violation of international Law. The context of the problem is the 6th year of occupation on Gaza strip, the rocket attacks, ongoing expansion of settlement in west bank, the interrupted peace talks, the continued building of the separation wall. They have just agreed to a unity government

The international framework, Canada's long standing view on Palestine/Israel. Is that in support of International law? We believe in a 2 state solution and want to negotiate a settlement. This is in line with what the United Church believes.

UN resolution 242 called for Israel to withdraw from land occupied in 1967 after war. However, they continue to occupy some of this land and they have been removed from some.

International law prohibits governments from destruction of settlements and home demolitions. Occupying power cannot move its own citizens into occupied land. They cannot remove, homes, they cannot damage property. All of these things have been done.

The current United Church policy speaks to these violations under international law. We are in support of self-determination that Palestine become a sovereign secure state, including the west bank, east Jerusalem, and the Gaza strip. We acknowledge that Israel has a right to be recognized as an independent. However, Israel has not defined its borders. We seek a peaceful resolution to shared state

The United Church is committed to Summary of UC policy.

- 1. Centrality of partnership...
- 2. Engagement in interfaith dialogue
- 3. Gospel imperative for justice making

What are we called to do? We are called to faithful public witness; to listen to stories and experiences, to deepen our understanding, to do social analysis. We acknowledge that this issue continues to polarize us. How do we speak in love to one another when we disagree? We must move from apathy and fear to action.

Following the presentation, a good discussion ensued re the big picture as Isreal sees it and as others (US and Canada etc.) see it, acknowledging that the middle ground has not yet been found. So how can we make a difference?

This is a large problem and we acknowledge it. We are asking Isreal to respect the pre-67 borders. The challenge to them is to take a risk for peace. We need to assure them that they are secure. We acknowledge the legitimate fears of Israel but still say Palestine cannot be held unjustly responsible for the reality of the threat from other countries. This is an urgent faith justice issue now for us.

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The question was raised, what other churches are speaking out for justice? Both Presbyterians and Anglicans will be discussing this this summer. UCC has been the boldest on this issue. We are a leader on this issue in our country. We have been asked by civil groups not to take a step back. We hear a lot of the criticism toward the UCC for this stance. Why don't we hear the other voices who are saying thank you? These voices are the Independent Jewish Voices Canada who have formed an umbrella group. They would like to be a formal partner of the UCC and they have written directly to the moderator encouraging us to speak boldly. Their website is: http://ijvcanada.org/

Susan Eagle thanked Wendy and reflected on her experience at GC 40 reminding us that The CCRR commission has brought this issue as the beginning of a conversation. There is no proposal or resolution on this issue, just an opportunity to learn more.

PROPOSAL TO GENERAL COUNCIL

Title:	Church Regeneration: Strengthening the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer
Origin:	A Group of Toronto Conference Commissioners to the 40 th General Council via Living Waters Presbytery
Financial Implications: Staffing Implications:	Low to moderate Additional staff in the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive
Source of Funding:	Various

Toronto Conference General Council Commissioners propose that the 41st General Council 2012:

1. Approve the establishment of the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer that is separate from the Office of the General Council General Secretary and Chief Administrative Officer in recognition of the unique nature of the position of Moderator; affirmation of the ongoing priority of matters of a spiritual character in The United Church of Canada; and initiation of vital church regeneration from our denominational spiritual centre;

2. Direct the Executive of the General Council to determine the mandate and functions of the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer that would encompass but not be limited to the following:

2.1 That the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer be occupied by the Moderator who is elected to be the spiritual head of the church (*Manual* Section 511), the presiding officer and the chief executive officer (*Manual* Basis of Union 8.5); 2.2 That the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer serve as the focal point for:

- leadership in matters of a spiritual and theological nature
- nurturing faith and spiritual growth in individuals and the church community
- General Council decisions concerning spirituality and theology
- concerted efforts directed to church renewal and transformation
- assisting the General Council and the wider church in the development and maintenance of a long-term vision of The United Church of Canada as the context for planning;
- enhancing the roles of the learning centres and schools of theology for life-long learning for church members and non-members;
- fostering a system of congregation-based spirituality groups, from music to covenant groups;

2.3 That an Advisory Committee composed of former Moderators be associated with the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer;

2.4 That the work of the Moderator and the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer be supported by the Office of the General Secretary General Council and Chief

Administrative Officer; the responsibilities and duties of the General Secretary General Council be continued as in *The Manual*.

Background:

Purpose: to strengthen the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer in order to have in our church structure a denominational spiritual centre that enables church regeneration, makes an ongoing long-term impact on the entire church, and strengthens relationships with other faiths and denominations.

A church in decline is a church in need of renewal and transformation. At its beginning in 1925, The United Church of Canada had approximately 8,000 congregations, 600,000 members and 3,800 ministers. Church membership peaked at 1,064,000 in 1965. It has declined steadily ever since, reaching 510,672 in 2009.

Now is time for The United Church of Canada to build anew for Canada of the present and the future. We are a smaller church now than when we started. In contrast, Canada's population of 9.3 million in 1925 grew to 33.7 million in 2009. Population projections indicate that in 2036 Canada will be a country of between 40.1 million and 47.7 million people. By 2061 Canada will have between 43.0 and 63.8 million people. In this 41st General Council year of 2012, The United Church of Canada is facing the future with 0.5 million members.

The formation of The United Church of Canada in 1925 through the union of three denominations was an extraordinary achievement. *The Manual* in its historical section notes that "the actual negotiations leading up to the consummation of Church Union on June 10, 1925, began 26 years earlier, when the Presbyterian General Assembly, on the request of its Board of Home Missions, appointed a committee 'to confer with other evangelical churches, having power to enter into any arrangement with them that will tend to bring the overlapping now complained of may be prevented.'" Subsequent meetings with the Methodist Church and The Congregational Churches of Canada led to the union.

In 2006, the 39th General Council held its triennial meeting in Thunder Bay. The meeting was especially planned and designed to look forward into the 21st century and discern what the church might be in its next generation. The outcome of the 39th General Council's discernment process for the future church was *A Call to Purpose: A Message from the Church to the Church*.

The key message in the four statements in *Call to Purpose* was "We long for a deeper relationship with God." We lacked, however, a coordinated response in which all our congregations could discuss *Call to Purpose* and develop a vision of the church for the 21st century. Most profoundly, a formal discernment of the heartfelt statement "We long for a deeper relationship with God" means that the spiritual *status quo* is unacceptable and due for change.

In 2009, as a direct follow up to the 39th General Council and its discernment of *Call to Purpose*, the 40th General Council in Kelowna adopted a denomination-shaping proposal entitled "A More Holistic United Church of Canada." Based on Call to Purpose and grounded on the Great Commandment to love God and one another as expressed by Jesus (Matthew 22:37-40), the resolution pledged to dedicate resources to moving the church to a deeper relationship with God.

With the passage of time since the 39th General Council in 2006 and *Call to Purpose*, it is becoming increasingly evident that the United Church has not developed the capacity to envision and develop a more spiritual church. The capacity is not only lacking in its structure, organization and processes; the capacity is lacking in its ethos. This state exists in spite of the well-deserved reputation of the United Church of being a leader in matters of social justice and social action.

The Canadian historian Michael Bliss has recorded some of the history of the origins and early years of the United Church in his biography of Sir Joseph Flavelle, *A Canadian Millionaire: The Life and Business Times of Sir Joseph Flavelle (1858-1939)*, published in 1978.

Sir Joseph Flavelle was a Methodist who from humble beginnings in Peterborough became a great Canadian businessman and philanthropist. Sir Joseph Flavelle was one of the "founding fathers" of The United Church of Canada. According to Bliss, it was in March, 1904 that 26 prominent Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational ministers and laymen met for lunch at the Toronto home ("Holwood") of Sir Joseph Flavelle. They informally discussed the possibility of organically uniting their denominations. Flavelle was one of several speakers in favour of union. They resolved to hold further meetings. Twenty-one years later, the meetings culminated in church union on June 10, 1925. Flavelle was always much involved in church financial and organizational matters. He was a member of the Commission on Permanent Organization and also, with other lay people, lobbied the government for the passage of the United Church of Canada Act.

Bliss writes of the thoughts of Sir Joseph Flavelle:

The United Church did not seem to him to be fulfilling the highest hopes of its founders, hopes expressed at that first luncheon in Holwood in 1904. As a perennial member of central committees handling church funds, Flavelle shared the deep concern in the late 1920s when givings to support missionary and general denominational work fell far short of both budget targets and reasonable expectations. He knew there were explanations for the financial problem—the rise of competing social-service organizations like Rotary and Kinsmen, disillusionment with missionary work, the general postwar determination to enjoy a higher standard of living. Still, he felt that the shortfall in contributions was also a sign of his church's inability to influence its members' lives. *"There is a disappointing lack of power in our Christian lives," he wrote in 1929. "This United Church, so successfully merged in all the mechanical processes, has, so far as one can observe, produced no deep consciousness of spiritual character, enlarged and enriched by new opportunities."* (Italics added)

The United Church still has "no deep consciousness of spiritual character." In over 85 years as a denomination the church has undergone a variety of evolutionary changes in organization and process. However, it has not developed a strong denominational spiritual centre in its structure and a system that has a steady and growing impact on the entire church and our relationships with other faiths and denominations.

At the same time, our Canadian culture, although now part of a more closely connected globalized world of seven billion people, is characterized by widespread indifference and

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ignorance about world religions. This applies not only to the basics of Christianity but also Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam and Judaism.

There is much that the United Church can do with a strengthened Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer. In our church polity, the General Council is the chief governing body of the United Church and the Moderator is the elected chief executive officer. The duties of the Moderator are to give leadership, especially in spiritual things; to visit throughout the United Church, giving guidance and counsel and report to the General Council and its Executive; to be the primary spokesperson for and representative of the United Church; and to preside at meetings of the General Council, its Executive and its Sub-Executive. The enhancement of the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer would incorporate functions that are needed by the church and the General Council in the 21st century to deal with priorities beyond the capacity of a single person, the Moderator, who is in office for three years. The Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer is the logical place through which the General Council can address the necessities of long-term church regeneration and leadership as well as accountability to the rest of the church. Additional resource requirements would be low to moderate.

Back in 1925, the uniting churches set forth in the Basis of Union the substance of the Christian faith, as commonly held among the churches, in twenty Articles. Article IX (*The Manual*, Section 2.9) states:

Of Regeneration. We believe in the necessity of regeneration, whereby we are made new creatures in Christ Jesus by the Spirit of God, who imparts spiritual life by the gracious and mysterious operation of His power, using as the ordinary means the truths of His word and the ordinances of divine appointments in ways agreeable to the nature of man.

The decisions of the 39th and 40th General Councils speak of regeneration. The Holy Mystery at the heart of religion is the source of its origin, renewal and endurance. Structural changes with the Office of the Moderator and Chief Executive Officer will provide a path to the renewal and transformation that are urgently needed for the United Church to thrive.

What is the role of the Administrative Assistant in supporting the work of the commissions?

The Administrative Assistant...

• Formats and distributes to presbytery members minutes of all commission meetings and conference calls as written by the commission secretaries and approved by the commission chairs;

• Prepares cheque requisitions when requested by commission secretaries and forwards them to the chair of the commission and the treasurer for approval;

• Sends all correspondence in the name of Living Waters Presbytery at the request of commission chairs. Where these are not standard letters to pastoral charges, the commission is expected to draft the letter and provide addresses;

• Books and tracks registrations for events;

• Tracks receipt of annual reports, accessibility policies and other congregational policies as required.

• Continuously updates the presbytery directory, including the commission lists in consultation with the commission secretaries and nominations committee

• Maintains a master list of presbytery events.

• Distributes a correspondence log monthly.

9. Accountability of commission and chairs

What are our expectations about how commissions and their chairs will function?

• Commissions will meet regularly and frequently enough to conduct their business in a timely manner.

• Minutes will be taken at all meetings, including conference calls, by a recording secretary. Minutes will be in the acceptable format and provided to the Presbytery Administrative Assistant in a timely manner.

• Where pastoral charges require support from a commission, either with a specific task or from a listening team, the chairs will delegate this work to a member of the commission rather than trying to support all charges themselves.

• Commissions will respond to requests from pastoral charges in a timely manner.

• When communication is required between commissions and with staff, this will occur in a timely manner.

• Commission chairs will fulfill their responsibilities as outlined in the handbook, including attendance at executive, commission and plenary meetings.

What challenges do commissions face in meeting these expectations? And How can we support one another so that we can meet these expectations?

• Finding dates when a majority of commission members can attend

• Consider setting dates well ahead, even for a whole year (meetings can always be cancelled if not needed)

• Define "staff" more broadly to include voluntary staff to increase ownership and accountability

• Can an executive member wear two hats (e.g. commission and UCW)? This might impact on ability to get quorum.

• If chair of commission cannot attend is it appropriate to find "any warm body" from commission to attend Executive or is this a body where specific knowledge and history is required?

• Chronic absence from Executive is different than occasional, unexpected absence.

• If chair(s) consistently not attending executive, there is an accountability issue.

• Congregations need to understand the frequency of presbytery and commission meetings so they will not have unrealistic expectations of how fast decisions can be made.

• Presbytery needs to identify deadlines for proposals and requests for time on agenda that are well in advance of presbytery meeting.

• Staggering amount of info that comes in emails – people are overwhelmed

• Those who are dedicated to presbytery are also dedicated in other areas of life.

• Can we get bulleted decisions so we don't have to read minutes of each commission? The commission chair/secretary are invited to identify highlights for a cover page to attach to minutes, similar to what General Council Executive does.

• Do we need an Executive Secretary for the presbytery?

• Can we have more conference calls and fewer in-person meetings

• Explore on-line technology for conference calls that will allow people to indicate when they wish to speak and will allow for voting buttons. Need to provide proof of savings in money, time and environment.

Big themes:

People are overwhelmed

We need to make minutes more accessible

We still need to improve communication

We need to get better participation at meetings and deal with non-participatory members.

Two further things to think about.

Restructuring report made it clear that Accountability measure must be built in. We need a process for working with those who are not able to meet our expectations.

September 2012 we need to determine the best time for executive to meet – we meet each month that Presbytery does not.

DRAFT Standards of Practice for Licensed Lay Worship Leaders Living Water Presbytery

Toronto Conference, The United Church of Canada

(approved by the Personnel Commission, Living Waters Presbytery on date April 25, 2012)

Introduction and Purpose

Living Waters Presbytery is grateful to God for the willingness of lay people who come forward to offer their faith, insight and skill as worship leaders in congregations. The following document outlines the standards of practice for Licensed Lay Worship Leaders who serve in Living Waters Presbytery. It is the hope of the Presbytery that these standards of practice will both encourage, honour and inform the members of the Laity as they share their gifts and express their faith while meeting the vital need of a congregation to gather for worship.

The following standards of practice are divided up into four sections: The United Church of Canada Policy on Licensed Lay Worship Leaders, Preparation and Licensing, Ongoing Support and Renewal of Licensing, and Stewardship of Lay Worship Leadership Resources. In three sections, key questions are posed and answers provided.

A key resource for the preparation of these standards of practice is Licensed Lay Worship Leader: Guidelines for Preparation, January 2011, The United Church of Canada.

The United Church of Canada Policy on Licensed Lay Worship Leaders (from The Manual of The United Church of Canada (2010), Section 344)

The Presbytery shall make enquiry as to the ability, character, and doctrine of a person recommended by a Session or Church Board or Church Council to be licensed as a Licensed Lay Worship Leader, and shall conduct a written examination on the course of study required by the appropriate General Council working unit. Upon successful completion of these requirements, the Presbytery shall issue a licence to the person on the prescribed form. The Licensed Lay Worship Leader shall be recognized at a public service to be held under the direction of the Chairperson of the Presbytery.

- Presbytery Direction: The person licensed as a Licensed Lay Worship Leader shall i. function under the direction of the Presbytery.
- ii. Transferability: A Licensed Lay Worship Leader transferring membership in the United Church from one Pastoral Charge to another Pastoral Charge in the same Presbytery shall continue to be recognized as a Licensed Lay Worship Leader. A Licensed Lay Worship Leader transferring membership to a Pastoral Charge in another Presbytery shall not function as a Licensed Lay Worship Leader until recognized as a Licensed Lay Worship Leader by that Presbytery.
- iii. Renewal of License: The license of a Licensed Lay Worship Leader shall be renewed each year at the discretion of the Presbytery within the jurisdiction of which such Licensed Lay Worship Leader is a member in good standing of a Congregation.

Preparation and Licensing: *What are the educational requirements to be licensed?*

An individual will be considered for Licensed Lay Worship Leader after completing successfully a course of study set out by the Education and Students (E&S) committee of Living Waters Presbytery or receiving that education from an approved institution. Such institutions are Five Oaks (Licensed Lay Worship Leaders training program), Emmanuel Collage, Calling Lakes Centre.

If a lay person has received training outside any training course offered by Presbytery, are they exempt from Presbytery training, and if so, what criteria covers a decision to be exempt?

An individual may be exempt from Presbytery training at the discretion of the E&S Committee of Living Waters Presbytery. An individual's education would be evaluated using the Licensed Lay Worship Leadership: Guidelines for Preparation, January 2011.

When seeking licensing or renewal, will there be an interview for Licensed Lay Worship Leaders and if so, what questions will be used?

When seeking licensing and renewal, all individuals will be interviewed by E&S Committee of Living Waters Presbytery using questions developed by E&S committee. The E&S committee will use questions that explore the ethos, theology and worship practices of the United Church of Canada.

Will an exempt lay person be licensed simply by an interview?

Yes; please see question number 4.

Ongoing Support and Renewal of Licensing *Will there be annual meetings with LLWL for support?*

Annual meetings with Licensed Lay Worship Leaders for support are recommended.

Will there be annual interviews for renewal of licenses?

Renewal of licenses will be done annually. The interview schedule for Licensed Lay Worship Leaders will be determined by the E&S Committee. Interviews may not happen annually.

What kind of reporting do you require from the LLWL?

In order to exercise stewardship of LLWLs, at the time of renewal of the license, the License Lay Worship Leader will be asked to provide the E&S committee of Living Waters Presbytery with a complete list of the dates and locations of services of worship led in the past year (including funerals), and include three orders of service (bulletins), with sermons for those services.

Stewardship of Lay Worship Leadership Resources

The following questions provide parameters for what a Licensed Lay Worship Leader can and cannot do.

How many Sundays can a Licensed Lay Worship Leader lead worship in one Pastoral Charge?

The Licensed Lay Worship Leader may cover three consecutive Sundays a month, to a maximum of ten services per year, in one Pastoral Charge. Alternatively, the Licensed Lay Worship Leader may lead services for one complete month in a six month period in one Pastoral Charge. If asked to lead worship for more Sundays, the Licensed Lay Worship Leader is to seek the approval of the appropriate committee of the Presbytery before agreeing to do so. *Are Licensed Lay Worship Leaders to be remunerated? What is the remuneration when leading worship in a multi-point Pastoral Charge?*

The Pastoral Charge is expected to remunerate Licensed Lay Worship Leaders in accordance with the "Worship Leadership and Preaching" rate, including travel, in the current *Salary and Allowances Schedule* issued by General Council each year. It is to be noted that this rate is a minimum. When leading worship on a multi-point Pastoral Charge, it is intended that the

Licensed Lay Worship Leader would receive above the minimum rate, but not necessarily the full rate for each worship service.

What is the remuneration when leading worship in own Pastoral Charge?

When leading worship in the Pastoral Charge where their membership is held, it is expected that Licensed Lay Worship Leaders receives the mandated.

Are Licensed Lay Worship Leaders expected to provide pastoral care?

No. It is expected that the Licensed Lay Worship Leader will refer any requests or requirements for pastoral care (counseling, home visitation, hospital visitation) to the called or appointed Ministry Personnel, or the Pastoral Charge Supervisor for follow-up.

May a Licensed Lay Worship Leader conduct a funeral?

Yes. However, the conduct of funerals within a Pastoral Charge (including a funeral home), is to be arranged in consultation with the called or appointed Ministry Personnel or the Supervisor of the Pastoral Charge. If the Licensed Lay Worship Leader conducts a funeral, s/he must ensure that the information about the service is entered in the Burial Register of the Pastoral Charge.

Can a Licensed Lay Worship Leader conduct a marriage and sacraments?

Licensing does not include permission to preside at the sacraments or license to perform marriages.

What disciplinary action will be taken if a LLWL operates outside these parameters and how will that be enforced?

Disciplinary action may be taken by E&S committee of Living Waters Presbytery if Licensed Lay Worship Leader's conduct is outside the policies presented here.

Does Presbytery require a Police Records Check?

Yes. A level one Police Records Check is required for initial licensing, and every 5 years thereafter.

May a LLWL wear a stole or clergy collar?

No. A stole and a clergy collar are reserved for those who are ministry personnel, called or appointed to a Pastoral Charge.

7. REPORT FROM PERSONNEL MINISTER, Rev. Todd McDonald

7.1 M&P workshops There were 34 participants from LW representing 13 Pastoral Charges. In the evaluations, ¼ of the group requested conflict mediation guidance as a future topic.

7.2 Shared Ministries: Jenny Stevens of Hamilton Conference has studied shared ministries and Northern Waters have asked her to provide a new model for study. Currently there is an increase in ½ time ministries and fear that the loss of Full Time personnel means a change from future oriented leadership and mission focus to survival strategies. Part-time ministry often means a reduction in participation in Presbytery and wider church. Jenny is developing circuit rider model that would be of immediate use while further responses are being studied. This might lead to letting go of buildings, sharing of worship space. It has been suggested she give a Conference wide workshop. This is a paradigm shift from the traditional one minister/one charge expectation. It was noted that we already are using some "circuit riders" but what is needed is a new definition of a pastoral charge. UK and Australia are using clustering models. In NWP, Shallow Lake has made a covenant with Wiarton for 13 hours per week (this crosses presbytery boundaries). The church needs to focus on people not buildings.

7.3 Supervised Ministry Education Sites: An orientation event was held with Jean Becroft representing Living Waters. Queensville, Heritage and Virginia are now trained.
