- 1. **Call to Order and Prayer** Fran Ota called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with a prayer.
- 2. **Minutes of June 25, 2015** meeting MOTION: Beth Moore/John Joseph Mastandrea Moved that the minutes of the June 25, 2015 meeting be approved. CARRIED.
- Leaside United Church Fran Ota advised that the Mission Articulation Program team had approved the church's Mission Articulation Plan. The Position Description was reviewed and it was agreed that it generally reflected the mission objectives identified in the MAP report.

MOTION: John Joseph Mastandrea/Beverley Bennett - Moved that the Leaside position description be approved.

CARRIED.

MOTION: John Joseph Mastandrea/ Beth Moore - Moved that a vacancy be declared at Leaside United for the position outlined in the position description and that Dale Hildebrand be authorized to sign the pastoral relations forms on behalf of the PRMS Team.

CARRIED.

4. Role of PRMST – Fran reported that she had attended a meeting that morning with Marg Walker, who is now Chairing the reconstituted Congregational Health Team and Anne Shirley Sutherland. She said that there had been a lot of discussion about how the issue of the financial health of congregations should be addressed when the MAP report and position description are being reviewed in preparation for the declaration of a vacancy. She suggested that a three year financial projection should be requested as an accompaniment to the MAP or the position description and recommended that a discussion of this issue and plans for a joint meeting with the Congregational Health Team be agenda items for the September meeting of the PRMST. 5. **Malvern Emmanuel United Church** – Fran advised that she had accepted an appointment to the Keswick-Ravenshoe Pastoral Charge in Living Waters Presbytery and would therefore be leaving Toronto Southeast Presbytery and resigning her Presbytery positions. She reported that Rev. Joan Smith had recently moved back to Toronto and was willing to assume the position of Pastoral Charge Supervisor at Malvern Emmanuel United Church.

MOTION: Larry Beech/Beverley Bennett – Moved that **Rev. Joan Smith** be appointed as the **Pastoral Charge Supervisor** of Malvern Emmanuel United Church.

CARRIED.

It was noted that Ian O'Neill will be leaving his ministry appointment at Malvern Emmanuel United Church at the end of June, 2016 as he needs to complete his internship and cannot do it at that church. The congregation needs to complete its MAP report during the upcoming church year so that a vacancy can be declared when he leaves.

- 6. Bathurst Street United Church The Team was advised that Cameron Watts is an admittand who will be providing ministry at Bathurst Street United Church during Ralph Wushke's sabbatical from September 1 to December 31, 2015. Martha ter Kuile is willing to serve as his mentor but is not able to take on the role of Pastoral Charge Supervisor. John Joseph agreed to contact Frances Combs, who is a Voluntary Associate Minister at the church, to see if she is willing to serve as Pastoral Charge Supervisor. It was agreed by consensus to appoint her to this role provided that she is willing to accept the position. Beth Moore agreed to forward a copy of the Pastoral Charge Supervisor handbook to John Joseph so that he could provide it to her.
- Birchcliff Bluffs United Church The Team was advised that the congregation was intending to request the appointment of a ministry student, Kelly Colwell, to provide supply ministry from September 21 to November 22, 2015 and that a Pastoral Charge Supervisor was therefore required. Beth Moore advised that Rev. Leslee Alfano had agreed to serve in that role.

MOTION: John Joseph Mastandrea/Beverley Bennett - Moved that **Rev. Leslee Alfano** be appointed as **Pastoral Charge Supervisor** of Birchcliff Bluffs United Church, beginning immediately and continuing until November 22, 2015.

8. Other Business:

PRMST Chair – Fran advised that John Joseph had agreed to serve as Acting Chair of the Pastoral Relations and Ministry Support Team during her 10 month appointment to the Keswick-Ravenshoe Pastoral Charge. It was noted that more Team members are urgently needed and that Randy Naylor, as Chair of Nominations, would be approaching potential Team members. A few names were suggested.

September 15 Presbytery Meeting – The Team is responsible for leading worship and presenting an accountability report at the September 15 Presbytery meeting. Fran Ota advised that she would attend the meeting and that she has prepared a draft of a worship service and presentation incorporated together, with five or six of Sylvia Dunstan's hymns featured. It was noted that we need to confirm the length of the presentation, as five or six hymns will take up more than half an hour themselves unless we just sing one or two verses of each. It was agreed that the presentation would be finalized at the September meeting of the Team.

 Manor Road United Church – The congregation needs a representative of the Team to chair a congregational meeting on Sunday, August 16, 2015 which was being held to deal with some financial issues.

It was agreed that there was a gap in the current process in that a review of the congregation's financial position was not included in any step of the process. It was agreed that in future when a congregation is requesting the declaration of a vacancy, the MAP Team will include a financial review as part of its review of the congregation's MAP report. If the MAP report and financial review are satisfactory, the PRMST will be requested to proceed with the declaration of a vacancy.

7. Preparing for an inter-presbytery conversation with Settlement and Pastoral Relations on the issue of multiple appointments:

Anne Shirley Sutherland reported that questions had arisen concerning the practice of reappointing a supply Minister at the request of a congregation after the initial one year appointment rather than moving to the declaration of a vacancy and a call. She noted that a meeting of Conference staff and committee representatives would be held on October 27, 2015 to discuss this issue.

8. New Business –

CALL TO ORDER

Tom Clarke called the meeting to order at 4:05 pm

DEVOTION

The devotion was led by Tom Clarke. He spoke about the harvest from his garden and provided us with samples - beets, carrots, cherry tomatoes, Swiss chard and rhubarb. He equated the gardening cycle is to church life – it is necessary to decide what type of harvest is desired before developing a plan. Just like a garden trusts that nature (sun, rain, animals) will provide the necessities of life to grow, so does a church trust that there will be a harvest at the end of its endeavours. Tom closed with a prayer from Isaiah 61:11.

APPOINTMENT OF SECRETARY

Fred Angus volunteered to provide minutes for this meeting.

1. Approval of Agenda

There was one change to the previously circulated agenda which will be addressed by Thomas Clarke and Anne Shirley Sutherland under Other. **MOVED and SECONDED that the agenda be approved as amended.**

MOTION CARRIED

2. Approval of Minutes

The draft minutes of the June 8, 2015 meeting were circulated – no corrections required. **MOVED by Nick Walker and SECONDED by Johmann Kwong that the minutes of June 08, 2015 be approved. MOTION CARRIED**

3. Business Arising

- i. Update re City Initiatives on use of church property: Tom Clarke reported that there has been no response by the City of Toronto to date.
- ii. Follow-up on Values and Insurance data: Al Morson no update to report.
- iii. Property Taxes follow up to Toronto Southeast Presbytery letter of July 7th (copy of letter attached as Appendix "A"). Excerpts from Section 9.2 of the Financial Handbook for Congregations (2010) Property Tax, are attached as Appendix "B".

Because of a recent City of Toronto realty tax assessment to Manor Road United Church, the Finance and Property Team decided to publicize this risk which has been ignored by many churches in the past. If a church, as landlord, enters into a commercial lease with a for-profit tenant, it could

be assessed property taxes on its commercial activity. Manor Road United Church was recently assessed \$14,259 in property taxes because a Montessori school was one of its long-term tenants. Manor Road has taken steps to manage its risk in all future leases.

4. Treasurer's Report

- i. End of Year 2014: Clyde Harris reported that he was still waiting details necessary to confirm his 2014 end of year statement.
- **ii. Current Year to Date 2015:** Clyde Harris submitted his report for the period January 01 August 31 2015 for information, attached herewith as Appendix "C".
- iii. Assessments: No report this month
- iv. Other: Clyde advised that there will be a Church Rental Policies seminar to be held at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Ajax, on October 24 2015. Ten local ministry units of Toronto Southeast Presbytery have signed up for this activity.

5. New Business

i. 4:45 Order of the Day – St. Mathew's United Church (SMUC) Re-Development Planning: Two employees from Edge, Carla Langhorst and Kris Tavella were welcomed to the meeting. Carla, Manager of New Initiatives at Edge, is also a recent member of SMUC and in this connection introduced SMUC's visioning with respect to engaging existing and future community partners in economic opportunities, (28-30 renters), so that SMUC can become financially sustainable. SMUC hopes to raise \$7-\$8 million in order to pay for renovations (\$5 million) and provide a \$2-\$3 million investment pool to fund future programming costs. SMUC has a membership/adherent base of 120-150 persons and averages 50 persons at most Sunday services.

Team members were provided with a copy of Carla's e-mail of September 3, 2015 to Tom Clarke which introduces this topic, attached as Appendix "D"; and a copy of the SMUC Request For Information (RFI) Responses received by SMUC from seven developers. The RFI Responses is attached as Appendix "E". The team was also presented with excerpts, (primarily financial), from SMUC's 2014 Annual Report and its 2015 budget. Discussion ensued about the use of manse funds and the short timeline of five years to translate a vision into reality. The Chair thanked Carla and Chris for their presentation and they left the meeting.

6. Updates on Other Property and Financial Matters

- i. Metropolitan United Church (Met): Correspondence was received from Met's Chair of Trustees that it has accepted a Letter of Interest from another developer, Concept Properties Ltd., concerning the redevelopment potential of Met's property. It would appear that negotiations with Verdiroc Development Corporation, Met's existing developer, have been suspended.
- **ii. Closure of Sale of Manor Road United Church to City of Toronto:** The sale did not close in July as expected and is being held up pending the completion of a due diligence report by the City of Toronto concerning easement rights with respect to water lines under the property to be transferred. It is expected that this delay will be short term.
- **iii. PTCC correspondence:** Copies were provided to the team members for information only and have not been appended to these minutes

7. Other

 October meeting date: The team's scheduled meetings normally occur on the second Monday of the month. However, because Thanksgiving falls on the second Monday in October, our October meeting date was rescheduled to October 19th. This date is no longer acceptable because it is the date of the Federal Election Day. Discussion ensued and consensus reached that an October meeting could be suspended unless a pressing matter were to arise.

- 2. Vice-chair position: Thomas Clarke advised that he may not be available to chair the next meeting and suggested that the team consider electing a vice-chair person on a permanent basis. No person was willing to stand and it was suggested that a member could be appointed to conduct a team meeting if the Chair was unavailable to do so and that this could be done on a meeting-by-meeting basis.
- 3. Anne Shirley Sutherland briefly reported that she and Tom Clarke have put forth a proposal to the Executive to establish, TASK GROUP TO PLAN WITH NEW AND REDEVELOPING MINISTRIES. Specifically, the request is "That the Executive of Toronto Southeast Presbytery create a Working Group to consider funding plans for new or renewing ministries, giving priority to the Tamil Ministry; and that the Task Group develop fuller "Terms of Reference" which would be brought to the Executive for approval."
- **8.** Adjournment There being no further business the Chair declared the meeting ended at 6:00 pm. The Chair closed with a benediction from Thessalonians.

 - 2. New Ministerial Salary Plan and Manse Funds

Although the summer lull is upon us, I want to provide you with some information that could be important for your congregation plans and administration in the coming year and into the future.

1. TAXES ON CHURCH PROPERTY:

We take for granted that property taxes are not assessed on our churches but in fact some use of church properties can lead to them being assessed and liable for municipal taxes. This has happened in other municipal jurisdictions and recently a congregation in this presbytery received an assessment notice.

Background: That this can happen should not be a surprise and you will find an excellent summary of the situation in the Financial Handbook for Congregations 2010 which can be downloaded from The United Church of Canada General Council website via this link: http://www.united-church.ca/files/handbooks/financial.pdf . Chapter 9 Paying Taxes starts on page 175. As the handbook explains provincial law general exempts places of worship from municipal property taxes and that extends to uses of the property generally understood to be a related activity of a worship community, things like religious education, fellowship, community service, etc. The exemption, however, depends not on who owns the property but the use of the property. In particular where a part of the church property is rented or leased primarily for income purposes, it may draw the attention of the assessor and as a result be assessed for tax purposes.

Assessment is the responsibility of MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) the same folks who assess our homes. We are not aware that MPAC is aggressively targeting church properties but their attention may be drawn to your congregational property if you have had a major renovation requiring a building permit or you make inquiries about the tax status of the property.

What If You Are Assessed: If your property is assessed you may be able to appeal the amount of assessment based on the percentage of space and time it is used for church related uses vs non-church related uses. This may reduce the assessment but it is unlikely that the assessment will be removed completely. It may or may not make a difference if the tenant is a charity or a not-for-profit corporation.

<u>Can You Protect Yourself</u>: For some time Finance and Property has recommended that when congregations undertake leases or use of space agreements, they include a clause making the tenant or user of the space responsible for any taxes that may accrue from that use. Here are two such sample clauses.

- If, after the date hereof, the Church is required to pay municipal taxes on the whole of its property or the part thereof which is used by XXXXX XXXXXX Inc. then XXXXX XXXXX Inc. shall, when so required by the Church, forthwith pay to the Church, XXXXX XXXXX Inc.'s proportionate share of such tax as reasonably determined by the Church, plus HST thereon, in addition to the compensation otherwise payable by XXXXX XXXXX Inc. hereunder.
- In the event that the Landlord is required to pay realty taxes on all or any part of the Property or the Landlord's insurance premiums are increased due to the operations of the Tenant at the Premises, the Tenant shall be responsible for the payment of such realty taxes and/or the amount of the increase in insurance premiums and the amounts payable shall be paid to the Landlord as Additional Rent. If, during the Term or any Renewal Term, the Landlord is required by law to collect and remit Harmonized Sales Tax or any other taxes on the Rent, the Tenant shall pay such taxes to the Landlord in addition to the Rent.

Sharing Information About Assessment: The Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery would like to hear from any congregation in the Presbytery that has been assessed for property tax. In particular we want to receive any details of the assessment notice, of the determination of the amount of assessment and of any appeal of that assessment. This information will be compiled and be available on request to any congregation who may be facing similar circumstances.

2. <u>NEW MINISTERIAL SALARY PLAN AND MANSE FUNDS</u>

Congregations who are known to have "manse funds" have already been advised of this matter. This information is provided here in case there are congregations who are not on the list of "manse funds." <u>If this information raises questions, please contact the undersigned.</u>

The Finance and Property Team recently addressed the question of what happens to

"manse funds"; i.e., funds held by congregations, usually and properly the Trustees, from sale of manses or other assets where the income is to be used to support the costs of housing allowances, when housing allowances are no longer part of The United Church of Canada new ministerial salary plan. Since the restricted use of these funds was originally established by presbytery, only the current presbytery can alter that restriction. In matters of congregational property and assets, Finance and Property is mandated to act for the Presbytery and Trustees are to take direction from the Presbytery.

At its meeting of May 11, 2015, Finance and Property adopted the following motion:

That where Toronto Southeast Presbytery or a predecessor presbytery has restricted the use of a fund to the payment or support of a ministers housing allowance solely or in part:

- 1. That effective the cessation of payment by the congregation of a ministerial housing allowance, the restriction is amended to remove reference to "housing allowance" and to replace any such reference with "ministerial salary or salaries",
- 2. That all presbytery restrictions on the use of capital will remain unchanged,
- 3. That congregational Trustees are directed to note this direction in their records,
- 4. That where congregational Trustees wish Presbytery to adopt a motion specific to the fund they hold and its historic restriction, they be invited to forward such a request including the wording of the historic restriction to the Finance and Property Team, and
- 5. That the Chair of the Finance and Property will write to the Trustees of the aforementioned congregations advising them of this motion.

If this is new information and your congregation holds such funds this motion applies and it would be appropriate to add the congregation to those listed as holding "manse funds." In that event please contact me through the Presbytery Office.

Excerpts from the Financial Handbook for Congregations (2010) – pages 175 - 177

9.2 Property Tax

Congregations do not "own" the property on which their church stands. The property is instead held "in trust" for The United Church of Canada according to the Trusts of Model Deed in *The Manual*. In this way, each congregation of the United Church theoretically owns property nationwide.

9. Paying Taxes

However, the local congregation is the body with whom local government communicates about assessment for property taxes, lot levies, user fees for services, utilities, and fines for breaches of bylaws.

In terms of congregations as property owners, assessment and taxation practices vary widely across the country. Pastoral charges and related bodies that are reviewing their own specific situations need to examine local bylaws to determine exactly how they are treated.

In general, church properties are exempt from or pay minimal property tax.

9.2.1 What Taxes?

Local governments may generate revenue through

- · flat-rate water or utility charges
- special levies on assessed property
- mandatory user fees for services such as garbage pickup, parks, and recreation
- · licences or fees related to regulated activity
- · lot levies on new developments to fund local infrastructure costs
- call-out charges for police, fire, or ambulance service
- · fines for breaches of bylaws

There are two types of property tax assessments: (1) general and (2) special levies or assessments, which generate revenue to finance particular projects. Local officials may circulate detailed assessment notices to all occupants of assessable properties, even those that are indirectly affected, or they may issue general summaries only to the owners of property.

A municipality is likely to place a congregation's properties on the tax-exempt list or to provide tax relief on general property taxes. It is least likely to do this on user fees. Practice varies on specific levies. Congregations are wise to monitor local developments. In some areas, municipalities routinely review their assessment rolls and issue assessment notices to all ratepayers, including churches. A congregation that receives an assessment notice in a routine review may wish to confirm with local officials that it remains on the municipal list of exempt properties. Being exempt from property tax at some point does not necessarily mean a congregation will always be exempt from property taxes on buildings used for church-related purposes.

9.2.2 On What?

The basis for taxing property is its use, not its ownership. Local officials provide categories of use in planning or assessment bylaws or in the more specific wording of zoning and tax bylaws. Because the basis for taxing a property or exempting it from taxes is use, it is crucial that the activity that goes on in church properties be scrutinized.

In all provinces, congregational or church-related properties are exempt from property tax if they are used as "places of worship" or "cemeteries." Despite the narrow terms used in the law, congregations can use their properties for other religious purposes without jeopardizing the tax-

exempt status of their property—for example, for Christian education, fellowship, and service or outreach activity. This is true even if the municipality classifies a building's official use as community recreation or cultural usage for assessment purposes.

Using other properties for religious purposes is more complicated. Residential use is generally taxed, so manses are taxed in most provinces. Some programs—midweek groups or recreation programs, for example—may look very much like programs run by non-church groups, whose use of properties is taxed. In municipalities that tax properties used for recreation or by private clubs, local authorities may not distinguish between churches and private clubs for the purposes of taxing properties.

Congregations may also find their property taxed in areas where authorities tax service and education activity, such as daycare, Montessori schools, tutoring, retraining, or economic development work. Congregations may also be taxed on some of the uses of buildings used for both religious and non-religious purposes. For example, in some communities, congregations have redeveloped their properties to provide for both non-profit and commercial uses in addition to the traditional religious use. Congregations that do this increasingly find that they do not escape property taxes on "non-religious" uses of their property.

9.2.3 For What?

Local revenues pay for local government services: planning and development, roads, utilities, emergency fire, police, public health, environmental, sewer, solid waste disposal, and a range of local recreational or general civic activity. Local revenue is supplemented by provincial and federal government grants in transfers that are often called the "MUSH" (municipalities, universities, schools, and hospitals), and "grants-in-lieu" (of taxes) paid by Crown bodies.

The funding of education or social services remains the key variable in local taxes. Each province allocates the tax burden of financing these activities differently, with some relying more on general revenue sources and less on local property taxes, and vice versa. Local school boards and councils exercise some discretion. Different ways of building their budgets determine the total tax burden, the rate, and the base in general or specific levies.

The "downloading" of work and responsibility from provincial to local governments puts additional pressure on municipalities to raise more money. So, properties that have been exempt from the local tax base, including congregational properties, are under review, especially where congregations also depend on the services that are supported by local revenues.

Anne Shirley expects that we will have completed 85% of the MAP's before Christmas.

They are setup to do the 'due diligence' piece of pastoral relations and congregational health work - to look at the finances of the congregation before signing off on MAP's that will be used in declaring a vacancy.

The overall piece for the MAP process was \$50,000, there is more money left, but no application had been made for Phase 2 even though the Executive approved it. Anne Shirley will get the application for the balance of funds underway.

There was some feedback about how the processes worked in some congregations that there are different levels of depth and they create a document that builds with time.

There is a question around the four presbyteries coming together for the second level iterations that would be consistent across the conference.

CALL TO ORDER

Tom Clarke called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with a brief prayer

APPOINTMENT OF SECRETARY

The Chair asked Fred Angus to provide minutes for this meeting.

1. Approval of Agenda:

MOVED by Aubrey Peterson and SECONDED by Al Morson that the agenda previously circulated be approved as corrected in order to eliminate item 5, Adjournment. MOTION CARRIED

2. Approval of Minutes:

Consideration of the minutes of the September 14, 2105 meeting is deferred to the November 9, 2015 regular meeting.

3. Approval of Bedford Park United Church (BPUC) request re reinvestment of funds from the sale of church lands: The Chair noted that BPUC Trustees are holding the net proceeds of sale of 100 Ranleigh in the amount of \$4,997,754.94 pending the presentation of a plan of distribution for the approval of the TSP Finance and Property Team, (F&P). The F&P motion of November 3, 2014, approving the sale and preliminary distribution, directed that the funds be held *"in secure accounts and investment instruments that are short term (not longer than 6 months or cashable on short notice) and that are not subject to capital loss"*. The funds were initially invested in 3 equal T-Bills with terms of 6, 9 and 12 months. As the T-Bills matured the interest rate available dropped. BPUC advised that the June maturity was put into Toronto United Church Council (TUCC) Investing in Ministries Fund (5 year term yielding approximately 4%). This appears to have been done without consulting F& P. BPUC is asking that the second T-Bill be reinvested in other instruments and for a longer term as per their resolution in Appendix A.

Questions were raised by the F&P team members about:

- i. How will the risk of capital loss be mitigated?
- ii. Are the TUCC investments locked in?
- iii. What kind of guarantees are available in the bond market?
- iv. Is there a final overall plan about the use of the \$4.9 million proceeds of sale?

The original draft motion was presented to the team for consideration. It was discussed and redrafted.

The revised draft was presented for the Team's approval. Wayne White declared a conflict of interest and indicated that he would abstain from voting. The motion was duly moved and seconded and there being no further discussion it was put to the vote and carried.

MOTION RE REQUEST OF BEDFORD PARK UNITED CHURCH RE VARIANCE TO PERMITTED INVESTMENT OF FUNDS FROM SALE OF CHURCH PROPERTY

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team in its motion of November 3, 2014 directed the Trustees of Bedford Park United Church (BPUC) to hold the balance of net proceeds of the sale of 100 Ranleigh Avenue in the amount of \$4,997,759.94, pending the presentation of a plan of distribution for the approval of Finance and Property Team, "in secure accounts and investments that are short term (not longer than 6 months or cashable on short notice) and that are not subject to capital loss", AND

WHEREAS the Trustees of BPUC have requested by letter dated October 15, 2015 that the direction be varied to permit consideration for investment in provincially guaranteed GIC's and bonds as well as blue chip corporate bonds and higher yielding investments with terms of up to 3 years, AND

WHEREAS the Trustees of BPUC have already committed one-third to the Investing in Ministry Fund of Toronto United Church Council for five years,

IT IS MOVED BY Clyde Harris AND SECONDED BY Nick Walker that Finance and Property Team

- 1. <u>Approve</u> the request of the Trustees, AND
- 2. Thereby vary the direction given to the Trustees of BPUC in the motion of November 4, 2014 to permit holding the net proceeds of sales in secure investment instruments of terms up to 3 years or cashable without loss of any of the original investment including provincially guaranteed GIC's and bonds as well as investment grade corporate bonds subject to the condition that the first call on any income generated by the investment of the balance of net proceeds of sale will be to make up any loss of the original capital, AND

Re: Bedford Park United Church Investments Variance on the Investment Restrictions

- Ref: (a) Motion passed by the Finance & Property Committee of Toronto SE Presbytery on 3rd November 2014
 - (b) Email from D. Joyce to T. Clarke dated October 5, 2015

The following is a formal request from the TRUSTEES of Bedford Park United Church ("BPUC") to consider our request for a variance to the investment restrictions as set out in your motion (ref. a).

As background you may recall that in keeping with your requirement for ".... Investment

instruments that are short term and that are not subject to capital loss....",in Dec/14 the BPUC Trustees invested \$4,971K in Fed. Gov. T-Bills, 1/3 of that amount in each nominally 6 month, 9 month term (payed 0.59%) and 12 month term (paying 0.84%). Following a discussion on or about the 24th of April 2015, between D. Carlton (Chair of BPUC Trustees) and yourself the 6 month T-Bill (\$6M) that came due on the 2"d of July 2015 was reinvested at TUCC (5 year Term) and is expected to pay interest in the range of 4%.

The T-Bill interest rates available now are significantly lower than they were in Dec./14. For example 9 month Federal Gov. T-Bills are only paying 0.088% and 12 month T-Bills are paying 0.14%. In view of these very low rates, we felt we had no option but to look at the expansion of the investment criteria in order to get a reasonable rate of return, otherwise we could/would be criticized for irresponsible investment management.

In order to reinvest the 2nd of those T-Bills (\$1,66M) that came due on_hthe 27th Sept/15, we want to:

- (a) as regards capital preservation ,in addition to GIC's that fall under the CDIC insurance coverage of \$100K per financial institution/division, investigate the use of Provincially guaranteed GIC's and bonds as well as bonds from corporate blue chip companies (eg. one of the federally regulated Canadian banks). I am quite sure we can structure a portfolio for the full amount that will be in complete compliance with your requirement for capital preservation.
- (b) as regards investment term in order to achieve a higher investment rate of interest, we want to extend the time frame to consider the use of investment instruments with a range of terms of 1,2 and 3 years. During these longer terms the use of, for example monthly GIC's would provide a steady flow of investment income.

- Current Year to Date 2015: Clyde Harris submitted an interim report for the period January 01 October 22, 2015 for information. A suggestion was made that, because Clyde Harris was not at this meeting, discussion be deferred until our next scheduled meeting.
 MOTION: Aubrey Peterson/Wayne White that the financial report for the period January 01 October 22, 2015 be received and discussion deferred to the November scheduled meeting.
- iii. Assessments: No report this month

6. New Business

i. 4:35 PM Order of the Day – Glen Rhodes United Church (GRUC) Re-Financial Concerns and Future: The Chair welcomed Rev. Robin Wardlaw and Ann Temple, GRUC Chair of Council, to the meeting. Tom prefaced his remarks by describing this part of the meeting as a discussion between Glen Rhodes and the F&P Team. He noted at the outset that GRUC's PTCC grant application was received on October 22, 2015 and has been turned down by the PTCC Review Team as being premature. The PTCC Review Team's refusal to recommend approval does not preclude another application at a future date after further deliberation by GRUC.

Team members were provided with a copies of GRUC's 4-yr financial forecast, and the Annual Reports for 2014 and 2013. These copies have not been appended to these minutes because they were received as familiarization documents for the team members' use.

Ann Temple reviewed the GRUC 4-yr financial forecast, noting that unrestricted cash reserves will likely be extinguished sometime in 2017 or 2018 unless manse funds can be accessed for operating costs, excluding clergy salaries. This prompted a question from a team member who asked for clarification about the encroachment of capital in the manse funds. GRUC admitted that manse funds have, for many years, been used to pay that portion of the minister's salary attributable to the housing allowance amount, regardless if from manse fund principal or interest. Tom Clarke reminded Glen Rhodes about the TSP letter of July 7, 2015 sent to all pastoral charges which, in part, discusses "New Ministerial Salary Plan and Manse Funds" and reminds local ministry units that the capital portion of manse funds is, under normal circumstances, expected to be preserved.

Other questions followed:

- i. What is the fair value cost of the GRUC food programme? (Approximately \$350,000 per annum if the notional cost of volunteer time valued at minimum wage is considered).
- **ii.** Has the GRUC congregation considered an amalgamation or other similar model to extend its life?
- iii. GRUC is in a covenanting relationship with five or six other East End United churches; however, no covenanting relationship currently exists between these East End United churches and Toronto Southeast Presbytery. If such a relationship were to exist, would Presbytery funds be available to assist in a new way of doing church?
- **iv.** Has the GRUC executive approached outside agencies such as the City of Toronto to determine if financial assistance for its food bank programme is available?
- **v.** Has the congregation considered selling its building and moving to a new location in order to sustain its food bank programme?
- **vi.** Has the congregation investigated other sources of capital grants to assist with renovations to its building in order to be fully accessible? These types of grants may be available from the United Church and others, such as the Trillium Fund.

The Chair thanked the two GRUC guests for their candour and encouraged them to continue to look at alternative solutions and to return with future proposals. The guests departed.

7. Updates on Other Property and Financial Matters

- i. Closure of Sale of Manor Road United Church (MRUC) to City of Toronto and Property Tax Issue: Correspondence was received from Jill Stapp, MRUC Chair of Trustees advising that the sale of their two lots to the City of Toronto closed on November 4th 2015.Jill 's memo also indicated that:
 - Tender documents have been forwarded to the construction trades and construction is expected to begin early January 2016.
 - The MRUC Chair of Outreach will be contacting the TSP F&P Team to discuss ways by which the \$125,000 proceeds of sale allocated to the MRUC outreach programmes can be used.
 - The lease of space to Caterpillar & Co. has not been signed pending clarification of a potential property tax assessment by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation, (MPAC). MRUC has included a clause in its lease passing any property tax liability to its tenant but Caterpillar is unwilling to commit to this lease until it has clarification from MPAC.
 - MRUC has engaged a law firm to act on its behalf with respect to any negotiations it has with MPAC. It has had an initial meeting with MPAC and negotiations are ongoing.
- ii. Request from Wexford Heights United Church to attend a Trustees' meeting Sunday November 22 to answer questions and clarify the process re severance and sale of manse: Tom Clarke agreed to attend on behalf of the TSP F& P Team and suggested that other team members might wish to attend. Aubrey Peterson and Wayne White indicated their intention to accompany Tom.
- **iii. PTCC Grant Requests to be submitted to Plenary:** Grants have been reviewed by the PTCC Review Team and the F&P Chair is satisfied that funds are available:
 - \$7,200 from the 2015 5% Capital Grant to support College Street United Church's Portuguese Ministry Pontes De Graca Church.
 - \$15,000 from the 2016 5% Capital Grant to support the completion of Toronto Southeast Presbytery's MAP programme.
- **8.** Adjournment There being no further business the Chair declared the meeting ended at 6:07 pm and closed with a benediction.

<u>From Catherine O'Brien of General Council Office staff,</u> forwarded by Dale Hildebrand, regarding changes to Education and Students processes: The Candidacy Pathway changes approved at General Council 42 (2015) need to be approved by remit before they are implemented. Current processes remain in effect, except for those Conferences approved for candidacy pathway pilot projects. Any changes, if enacted through remit, would not take effect before 2018.

<u>Paul reported on a conversation with Wanda Chin, Emmanuel College registrar.</u> For students who become candidates before graduation, we get annual reports, and on graduation the students receive the testamur. For those who become a candidate after achieving their MDiv, we do not receive any academic information from the College, nor do such students automatically receive the testamur. These candidates should apply for ordination through the General Council Office by September of the year before they seek ordination. General Council Office then contacts Emmanuel or other college they attended which is authorized to provide UCC testamurs. That contact triggers feedback from the college to E&S regarding any concerns for their ministry and the granting of their testamur.



Wexford Heights United Church (WHUC) Trustees meeting of Sunday, November 22, 2015: Wayne White reported that he and Tom Clarke attended the WHUC Trustees meeting to answer questions and clarify the process re a possible severance and sale of the WHUC manse. A legal issue might arise because of the use of a shared driveway by the manse and the church-owned cemetery, Zion-Wexford Cemetery. WHUC's investigation is on-going.

4. Treasurer's Report

- i. End of Year 2014: Clyde Harris reported that he is still waiting for some information from Toronto Conference in order to close the books.
- **ii. Current Year to Date 2015:** Clyde Harris submitted an interim financial report for the period January 01 November 30, 2015 for consideration.

iii. Dewi Sant Welsh United Church (DSWUC) request for approval of Toronto Conference Property Renovation Fund grant: DSWUC has applied for a \$5,000 grant from Toronto Conference Property Renovation Fund (Accessibility) to assist with a feasibility study of its facilities in order to comply with current accessibility standards – copy of application attached as Appendix "C". The Team determined that the application is incomplete and therefore only gave a conditional approval; subject to the Presbytery Administrator receiving the missing documentation. **MOTION:** Winston Roach /Aubrey Peterson that having reviewed the accessibility grant application by Dewi Sant Welsh United Church in the amount of \$5,000 from the Toronto Conference Property Renovation Fund, the Finance and Property Team, acting for Toronto Southeast Presbytery, approves said application subject to confirmation by the Presbytery Administrator that a copy of the DSWUC Accessibility Policy has been filed with Presbytery and directs the Treasurer to sign the necessary approval.

CARRIED.

The Treasurer completed the document which Anne Shirley Sutherland will convey to the Presbytery Administrator to be forwarded to Toronto Conference upon completion of the missing documentation.

iv. Knob Hill United Church (KHUC) request to be named a potential beneficiary under the terms of the Glen Ayr Seniors Transportation Fund: An informal request was received from Brian Coker, KHUC Chair of Finance, that, because a member of its congregation who was formerly a member of Glen Ayr United Church qualifies for transportation assistance, an application is made herewith. The terms of reference for the fund require that Presbytery establish and maintain a list of congregations who would be potential beneficiaries of the fund. WHEREAS the Trustees of Beach United Church, having been directed by THE COUNCIL to do so and meeting on December 8, 2015, have requested the approval of Toronto Southeast Presbytery to proceed with this major repair as per a copy of the trustees resolution dated December 8, 2015 and attached as Appendix "D", AND

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team is mandated to act for Toronto Southeast

Presbytery in matters of congregational property requiring the approval of the Presbytery in accordance with The Manual 2013 Section G 2.2 and G 2.3,

Minutes of the meeting of the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery, held on Monday, January 11, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. at Toronto Southeast Presbytery Offices, 963 Pharmacy Ave., Scarborough, Ontario, with Thomas Clarke, Chair, presiding.

PRESENT: Thomas Clarke (Chair), Fred Angus, Joan Chinnery, Clyde Harris, Rev Johmann Kwong, Al Morson, Aubrey Peterson, Winston Roach, Wayne White, Anne Shirley Sutherland (Staff Support).

REGRETS: Nick Walker.

CALL TO ORDER

Tom Clarke was welcomed back and called the meeting to order at 4:10 pm

DEVOTION

Joan Chinnery read several passages from the book, "Real Good Church: How Our Church Came Back from the Dead, and Yours Can, Too", written by Rev. Molly Phinney Baskette. Rev. Baskette is the lead pastor of the United Church of Christ, First Church Somerville, MA. This book, about congregation revitalization, is a practical manual about everything that First Church Somerville did over a decade to reverse its death spiral and become a healthy, stable, spirited, and robust community. Rev. Baskette writes with an easygoing style and a sense of humour. One particular passage that Joan read piqued the team's interest and prompted a member to ask for a repeat about leadership skill - "disappointing people at the rate they can tolerate". Joan closed the devotion with a prayer.

APPOINTMENT OF SECRETARY

Fred Angus volunteered to provide minutes for this meeting.

1. Approval of Agenda

Tom Clarke advised that he was in receipt of two requests for grants from The Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation (PTCC) that he wished to add to the agenda under the heading, "Other". These two items were not circulated to team members prior to the meeting. There was consensus that the draft Agenda as previously circulated be amended to include the two PTCC requests.

2. Approval of Minutes of December 14, 2015 meeting

MOTION: Fred Angus/Winston Roach: To approve the December 14, 2015 F & P minutes as circulated.

CARRIED.

The Chair advised all in attendance that there was an error in the above minutes with respect to the reference about the two transportation funds monitored by Presbytery. These two funds: "Glen Avr Seniors Transportation Fund" and "Iondale Heights Seniors Transportation Fund", are separate from each other and further, that the request from Knob Hill United Church should only be referenced to the Glen Ayr Seniors Transportation Fund.

Discussion ensued and it was agreed that the December 14, 2015 minutes should be amended to remove the notations about the londale Heights Transportation Fund from the December 14th minutes and that the minutes of the January 11, 2016 meeting note this correction.

MOTION: Clyde Harris/Al Morson that the minutes of the December 14, 2015 meeting be amended to remove all references to the londale Heights Transportation Fund.

CARRIED.

3. Business Arising

- i. Update re City Initiatives on use of church property: Tom reported that there has been no response by the City of Toronto to date.
- 2016 Budget: Clyde Harris, TSP Treasurer, submitted an update to the 2016 TSP budget presented at our last meeting revised from a deficit of \$7,600 to a deficit of \$11,074. Copies of the revised budget, (attached as Appendix A), were distributed for discussion. Questions were raised about the Team's oversight role and its encouragement to committees to carry out their plans. A motion to recommend submission to the TSP Executive was suggested.

MOTION: Clyde Harris / Al Morson that the Finance and Property Team approves the 2016 TSP budget and recommends it to the Toronto Southeast Presbytery Executive.

CARRIED.

4. Treasurer's Report

- i. End of Year 2014: Clyde Harris reported that he is still waiting for some information from Toronto Conference in order to close the books.
- ii. Current Year to Date 2015: Clyde Harris submitted a preliminary financial report for the year ended December 31, 2015 for consideration, (attached as Appendix B).
 MOTION: Aubrey Peterson / Johmann Kwong that the preliminary financial report for the year ended December 31, 2015 be received.

CARRIED.

- **iii.** Assessments: Clyde Harris reported that three local ministry units were slow payers.
 - Wexford Heights United Church pays monthly and advises that "cheques are in the mail".
 - Metropolitan United Church is behind one payment. Metropolitan has been contacted and has promised to pay.
 - Glen Rhodes United Church is behind one payment. Glen Rhodes advised that payment was made in November and promised to replace it if the original is not found.

5. Update

i. Malvern Emmanuel United Church (MEUC) change in pastoral relations

MEUC requests financial assistance as a result of an unanticipated change in its pastoral relations with its student supply minister because of an event precipitated by London Conference. Toronto Conference was advised by London Conference that the student's candidacy had been terminated and, consequently, was forced to terminate his appointment to MEUC. This change in the MEUC pastoral relations was approved by Toronto Conference Settlement and Pastoral Relations Committee on December 15, 2015. Presbytery has advised MEUC to pay the student 90 days pay in lieu of notice. Accordingly, MEUC hereby requests financial assistance to reimburse it for the cost of the termination pay settlement and the extra (replacement) cost of weekend supply to March 15, 2016. Team members questioned if the estimated \$4,000 cost to reimburse MEUC for supply should be shared by London Conference, Toronto Conference, and Toronto Southeast Presbytery. Toronto Conference has suggested that the costs be shared \$1,500 Toronto Conference and \$2,500 Toronto Southeast Presbytery.

MOTION: Wayne White / Winston Roach that the Finance and Property Team recommends to the Toronto Southeast Presbytery Executive that Malvern Emmanuel United Church be paid \$2,500 from the Presbytery Fund for Congregations in Urgent Need to cover thirteen weeks of weekend supply during the severance period of their former student minister.

CARRIED.

6. New Business

Order of the Day – Lawrence Park Community Church (LPCC) Presentation and i. **Request re Redevelopment of their south parking lot:** The Chair welcomed two visitors from LPCC, Blaine Tigert, Chair of Council, and Doug Steiner, Chair, Board of Trustees. Blaine introduced the topic: a request for approval to proceed with a lease/repair plan to revitalize its 72 space commercial parking lot at the south-west corner of Bayview and Dawlish Avenues. This proposal does not include the small 22-car parking lot adjacent to the church. The commercial parking lot is currently leased to Sunnybrook Hospital weekdays for the use of its staff. Sunnybrook has excess parking space on its own grounds and has expressed an interest to terminate its lease with LPCC. This can be done by either party on 60-days notice. The commercial parking lot also requires substantial repair.

LPCC has reviewed its options and determined that it would be more beneficial to enter into a new arrangement with another parking lot operator. Toronto Parking Authority, (TPA), A TPA lease would provide the following benefits:

- A substantial increase in annual net revenue earned, (4-5 times current level).
- TPA will provide financing at a 5% interest rate, repayable over five years, which • will permit paving and lighting repairs to occur at an estimated cost of \$155,000).
- TPA will provide project management to effect the necessary repairs.
- TPA will provide day-to-day parking lot management at a reasonable rate.
- Parking spaces can be set aside for church use on a flexible basis, (an increase in church parking space that is not otherwise available).
- LPCC will be able to replenish some of its trustee funds. •

Team members found the proposal acceptable and suggested that a motion is in order. The Team Chair indicated that the purpose of today's meeting was to approve LPCC's request to enter into a management fee contract with TPA and to draw up a lease. He cautioned the visitors that LPCC must return to Finance and Property to obtain its formal approval prior to executing the lease.

MOTION RE LAWRENCE PARK COMMUNITY CHURCH (LPCC) PARKING LOT

WHEREAS the Trustees (TRUSTEES) of Lawrence Park Community Church, having been directed by the Church Council at its meeting of November 24, 2015 to do so, have determined to enter into an agreement with Toronto Parking Authority (TPA) for the upgrade and operation of the south parking lot of LPCC, AND

WHEREAS the said TRUSTEES, meeting on January 8, 2016, have by resolution (attached as Appendix C) requested the consent of Toronto Southeast Presbytery to enter into a leasing agreement with Toronto Parking Authority, to make the necessary repairs and funding arrangements. AND

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery has reviewed the leasing agreement and other documentation in support of this project, AND

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery is mandated to act for Presbytery in matters of congregational property THE MANUAL 2013 G2.3, including leases, and major renovations,

IT IS MOVED BY AI Morson AND SECONDED BY Joan Chinnery, that Toronto Southeast Presbytery consents to the request of the Trustees of Lawrence Park Community Church

- 1. To enter into a leasing agreement with the Toronto Parking Authority for a term of five years with an option of a further 5 years under terms set out in the TPA Management Fee Proposal Document provided;
- 2. To undertake necessary repairs to the parking lot, including but not limited to paving, curb work, lighting, plantings) at an estimated cost of \$155,000 to be funded by (TPA) as a loan at 5% interest repayable at any time without penalty over 5 years;
- 3. To use the annual revenue of the lease to the benefit of LPCC as set out in the resolution of the TRUSTEES as follows:
 - a. The first \$150,000 of net proceeds of the lease received in each fiscal year will accrue to the operating funds of LPCC;
 - Not more than 66 2/3rds of any net proceeds of the lease in excess of the above \$150,000 in the same time period will accrue to the operating funds of LPCC;
 - c. Any balance remaining from the net proceeds of the lease in each fiscal period will accrue to the funds held by the TRUSTEES.

The Chair thanked the visitors for their participation and they left the meeting.

- 7. Other
 - i. The Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation (PTCC) United Church Amending Agreement to the Operating Agreement. The Chair advised team members that PTCC required an update to the existing operating agreement between PTCC and each of the four presbyteries of Toronto Conference. Consequently, an amending agreement will be presented to the Toronto Southeast Presbytery January 19th plenary for its approval. The team received this item for information purposes only.
 - **ii. PTCC Grant Applications.** Two grant applications have been received and are reported to Finance and Property for information.
 - a. From Anne Shirley Sutherland on behalf of Presbytery for \$10,000 as an Up to 5% Capital Grant to move forward on the "Hope Initiative" to identify new ministries in that facility. Anne Shirley briefly outlined the history and nature of the request.
 - b. U-Talks (formerly "Ideas Festival") is requesting \$3,333 to complete a three event session sponsored by three congregations, Ebenezer United Church, Toronto Chinese United Church, and Knox United Church, Agincourt. The initial grant request was for \$5,000 but only 1/3 was approved by Presbytery pending a review of the first event. The remaining two events are scheduled February and May and Presbytery will be requesting that the balance of funds now be released.

These requests will be reviewed by Executive and Executive may decide to bring to the Presbytery January 19th plenary for approval.

The purpose of bringing PTCC grant requests to Finance and Property is to allow us to exercise oversight of this source of funding and, if necessary, advising on the availability of funds to meet the grant requests.

8. Adjournment – There being no further business, the Chair declared the meeting ended at 6:15 pm and closed with a benediction.

CALL TO ORDER

Quorum being achieved, the Chair called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm

DEVOTION

Wayne White opened the meeting with a prayer. Wayne spoke to us about David Wilson's interview with our new moderator, Jordan Cantwell, as reported in the October 2015 edition of the UCC Observer. He also shared personal recollections about Jordan who he and his wife, Rev. Barb White, (retired), had met on two other occasions.

3. Approval of Minutes of January 11, 2016 meeting

Nick Walker noted two errors requiring correction - the Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation acronym should be corrected to read PTCC and the header for Appendix C should be corrected from "the 8th day of February, 2016" to read "the 8th day of January. 2016". MOTION: Fred Angus/Johmann Kwong: To approve the January 11, 2016 F & P minutes as corrected. CARRIED

4. Business Arising

None.

5. Treasurer's Report

- i. End of Year - 2014: Clyde Harris again reported that he is still waiting for some information from Toronto Conference in order to close the books.
- End of Year 2015: Clyde Harris submitted a preliminary financial report for the team ii. member's interest. It is noted that this report is in its early stages and it was agreed not to disseminate the report at this time.
- iii. Current Year to Date – 2016: No report at this time.
- iv. Assessments: Clyde Harris reported that there are still tracking issues with three local ministry units, (LMU), that had submitted their Fall 2015 instalments but receipt has not been confirmed by Toronto Conference. It is too early to report on 2016 assessments.

6. New Business

i. Order of the Day – St. Mathew's United Church (SMUC) re presentation and discussion about their redevelopment plans to provide affordable residential housing while retaining their site as a community hub: The Chair welcomed two visitors from SMUC, Perry Marshall, Chair, Board of Trustees, and Carla Langhorst, a church member and New Initiatives Manager, Edge. The team had previously met Carla at their September 14th 2015 meeting. At that time Carla first introduced us to SMUC's visioning with respect to engaging existing and future community partners in economic opportunities so that SMUC could become financially sustainable. This visit is a follow-up to that meeting and in preparation, the team was provided with a background paper titled, "St. Matthew's Pathway Forward". This document outlined the due diligence procedures that SMUC had undertaken in order to discern its future.

Projects envisioned were:

- Retain ownership of the property and self-fund a residential rental development at market rates. Development costs were estimated at over \$26 million which was concluded as not being feasible.
- Secure a development partner and build a market value condominium project whereby the church would buy back church space as well as purchase some residential units to rent out at subsidized rates. This option is a possibility.
- Sell the property whereby SMUC becomes the lead tenant and engages other community-minded organizations to create/continue as a community hub. This option has the endorsement of SMUC's local city counsellor.

Current thoughts are that a residential housing project and a community hub buy-back development are not mutually exclusive, consequently, SMUC intends to combine the two projects as one. It is anticipated that SMUC will be moving forward with a RFP, (request for proposal), from those developers who have expressed an interest through the previous RFI, (request for information), process which was conducted over the past two years. Carla and Perry entertained questions from the F & P team and indicated that the development timeline will likely extend to 2019. The F & P chair advised them that Presbytery will require a pro-forma budget projected to 2019. or beyond, and will require assurance from SMUC that it has the manpower and finances to complete the project. SMUC intends to seek a \$30,000 loan to pursue its RFP process. Likely sources are the Toronto United Church Council, (TUCC), and the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, (CMHC). Tom Clarke advised the visitors that their trustees will be required to return to the Finance and Property Committee with a request to proceed if a loan is to be advanced and also with a development proposal before any agreement can be put in place. Tom thanked the visitors for their attendance and they left the meeting.

ii. Approval of Grant Requests to Toronto Conference Property Renovation Fund:

Grant requests were received from the following local ministry units:

- Eastminster United Church, (\$5,000 accessibility),

IT IS MOVED by Nick Walker AND SECONDED by Johmann Kwong that Toronto Southeast Presbytery approve the Brimley-Steeles Montessori School Lease between the Trustees of Ebenezer United Church, and 2508066 ONTARIO INC. operating as Brimley-Steeles Montessori School, as per the terms and conditions of the leasing agreement.

- iv. Order of the day Wexford Heights United Church (WHUC): Request to approve a plan to severe the existing manse from the rest of the church property with intention to sell the manse. The Chair welcomed two guests from WHUC, Bob Erikson, Chair of Trustees, and Kelly Cook, Chair of Finance, to our meeting. Team members are in receipt of copies of the request to Presbytery, (appended to these minutes as Appendix C), and other supporting documentation about the manse property and church finances. WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery is mandated to act for the Presbytery in matters of congregational property transactions as per The Manual Section G2,

IT IS MOVED by Winston Roach AND SECONDED by Joan Chinnery that Toronto Southeast Presbytery approve the proposed severance of the WHUC manse at 1 Ellington Dr. from the balance of church property with appropriate easements as may be determined and any necessary applications to municipal authorities and with the intention of eventual sale subject to

- 2. The TRUSTEES of WHUC requesting approval of an offer of purchase and sale and plan of disposition of the proceeds of sale

The property will need to be severed and an easement established to provide Wexford Heights access to the north side of the church, the cemetery and provide parking access to the severed property owner. We have been provided with a preliminary survey of these projected changes which I have attached. There will be a slight change on this draft with respect to how much easement needs to be granted to the adjacent property owner. But for the purposes of this communication, what is attached should be sufficient. We have also retained the legal services of A. Beth Moore Professional Corporation. A preliminary discussion with City of Toronto planner is also pending to review what we are proposing to do.

Appendix C - Correspondence from Wexford Heights United Church requesting approval to sell its manse, located at 1 Ellington Drive, Scarborough, dated March 9, 2016, page 2 of 2

Due to the complexity of this transaction, we anticipate that it will take an elongated period of time to get through the pre-requisite steps of property severance and easement establishment. There are also costs associated with the transaction that Wexford will need to cover. Albeit these will all be recoverable from the proceeds of the sale, it will put a strain on existing available funds.

On Tuesday March 8, I spoke with Ron Ewart from TUCC to discuss the possibility of bridge financing. Wexford currently has a registered mortgage on title to the Property as of November 9, 2015 for a total principal of \$180,000. Of these funds, we currently have approximately \$67,000 owing. This leaves a remaining \$113,000 to potentially work with. Ron has suggested that Wexford could consider a bridge financing plan, based on quarterly interest only payments, with a timed period to cover what is anticipated to be the duration of the pre-sale and sale period.

We recognize that this bridge financing will need to have congregational approval. The scheduling of Congregational meeting will be done in the near future. With Rev. Diane Bennett-Jones joining us as at March 15, 2016, it will now be much easier to facilitate such a meeting.

We are asking that the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery, approve in principle, the option for bridge financing as outlined above. We will need to go through all the required governance steps and provide the supporting documentation. By seeking this approval in principle now we can work a number of steps in parallel.

At the time of writing this letter, we have yet to engage interviewing agents. We have engaged the services of a real estate specialist who will provide us a property evaluation. I will have this information available for the meeting on March 14th. Without having a view to sale value, it is not possible for us to provide a definitive list on the disbursement of the funds. At a high level, the following items would need to be taken into account:

- Retirement of all long-term debt and bridge financing
- All costs associated with sale transaction
- At minimum, housing allowance portion of ministers' salary for 2016
- Pipe organ repair \sim \$30,000
- Installation of fence on north side of cemetery

If there is additional information that you require prior to the meeting on March 14, please let me know. I understand that you will notify us as to what time this topic will be on the agenda. If we could be slated near the end of the agenda, that will provide greater flexibility for both myself and possibly Bob Eriksen to also attend. Both of us work during the day so we need to ensure adequate time to get to the meeting.

Thank you for the continued support of the matters of Wexford Heights.

The CCC has been bringing together the denominations of Canada since 1944 and currently has 25 denominations, representing more than 85% of the Christians in Canada. One of our newest members will be of great interest to our hosts here at this Hindu Temple - the Mar Thoma tradition from India which is a lively, progressive denomination full of young people.

It is good to have an opportunity to up-date those of you who might not know of a couple of new developments at the CCC.

- The new reality that the 60 year old Canadian Theological Students Conference, part of whose funding comes from monies raised in the name of Howie Mills, is now embedded in the CCC.
- The honouring of Ruth Tillman and the 100th anniversary of CGIT by raising funds for an internship in her name to translate CGIT values into the current context.

In terms of new Inter-faith developments, nationally and internationally,

- The Canadian Interfaith Conversation.
- The Interfaith Leaders Summit to parallel the G20.
- International interfaith summits centred in Doha, Qatar, Vienna (with some funding from Saudi Arabia) and Dubai, U.A.E. bringing the U.N. and faith leaders into dialogue.

And finally some challenges for us all.

- The fact that though some Christian denominations are in decline, Christianity is the fastest growing religion in the world, and there are many denominations in Canada that are large, growing and thriving.

Report from Round Table re Malvern Emmanuel

A consultation was held on March 23, 2016. Douglas duCharme, Paul Hutchison and Lynella Reid-James attended on behalf of the Executive, Ron Ewart and Janet Marshall from TUCC and Anne Shirley Sutherland, TS support staff.

Background: The question had been posed by the Toronto United Church Council to the Toronto Southeast Presbytery about Presbytery's wishes or intentions regarding new, future or ongoing ministry in the Malvern area. Currently property discussions are taking place with the Malvern Emmanuel congregation and they have begun their MAP process. Since this seems to be a time of transition, doing some more comprehensive planning into the future seemed in Order. The question went beyond the current congregation and so the first conversation included only TUCC and the presbytery. Presbytery representatives included persons from the Executive and Mission Strategy.

Discussion included sharing information about the area, property issues, presbytery's capacity to support new initiatives and the research required to make an informed decision about presbytery's interests in further support for ministry in the area.

The gathering concluded that the original outreach ministry in which presbytery engaged has been enhanced considerably by a number of large service providers moving into the area. We observed also that opportunities to experience Christian community in other mainline denominations such as with the Presbyterians and Anglicans is present close by. We further acknowledged that presbytery resources in doing research or undertaking new ministries was very limited.

The conclusion and recommendation to Mission Strategy and the Executive is that we undertake no new initiatives in the Malvern area and thereby indicate to the Toronto united Church Council that we will continue to support the current congregation and their ministry but have no further or additional plans.

Separate conversations will continue between TUCC and the congregation about property issues and with the presbytery regarding their future congregational plans.

Motion: It was moved by Clyde Harris seconded by Lynella Reid-James, that on the recommendation of the Mission Strategy Team Toronto Southeast Presbytery undertake no new initiatives in the Malvern area and thereby indicate to the Toronto united Church Council that we will continue to support the current congregation and their ministry but have no further or additional plans and this decision be conveyed to Toronto United Church Council. **CARRIED**.

The Executive noted that they will wait for further information when the MAP has been completed and a meeting has been held with the congregation.

Nominations Report (from Randy Naylor)

The crowd sourcing at the last Plenary meeting raised 3 names in nomination for the role of Chair of Presbytery. Having contacted all three, I regret to report that none are able to accept the nomination as they are already heavily committed to life within their own congregations as well as each of the three is involved currently in other areas of the life of Presbytery.

A number of names proposed for chair of committees or membership on committees have also declined indicating that the demands of their congregational work prevent them from taking on anything in Presbytery.

Several people have said yes to positions and there are several others who have yet to respond or are 'thinking' about saying yes. These will be brought to the June plenary.

There was considerable discussion about the issue of leadership in the presbytery.

Report and Recommendations Regarding Funding PTCC Grant Requests

Tom Clarke presented a report from the Finance and Property Team about the two applications for PTCC grants. The report is attached as Appendix A.

Following discussion, the following motions were passed:

 - 1. Regent Park Community Ministry (formerly West Don) and
 - 2. Toronto Southeast Presbytery Social Justice Project

The PTCC Task Group mandated to review applications for PTCC Grants from Capital reported to the Executive on March 8, 2016, that further consideration was needed for the above two projects particularly the source of funds and that advice be sought from Finance and Property Team who have overall responsibility to manage Presbytery financial assets.

Finance and Property, meeting on March 14, 2016, reviewed the financial requests and the criteria for the PTCC Grant categories: 5% Annual Capital Grant, 10% Capital Grant, and 20% Capital Grant. This report sets out our understanding of the issue and how Presbytery may wish to proceed.

THE PROBLEM: Both grant requests are large and were requested from the 5% annual
capital grant as follows:Social Justice Project\$278,426 for 3 years from late 2016 through 2019

 Regent Park Community Ministry
 \$203,935 for 2 years from late 2016 through 2018

The problem which is clearly illustrated in the attached table, prepared by Nick Walker, is that in 2017 and 2018 the amounts requested exceed the expected funds available in the 5% Capital Grant category. Any one of them sourced from the 5% Annual Grant category would use much of the funding capacity at this grant level which is the one that can be used for the widest variety of requests. In the chart, note that the prorating of the request across the calendar years is based on our understanding of the currently approved funding and the year in which the grant funds would be required.

ANALYSIS:

- 1. The Regent Park Community Ministry is clearly a church development project and as such should quality for a 10% Capital Grant request but there are issues with such an application.
 - a. There can only be one grant request per project; i.e., you get one ask although the funds can be used over a number of years. That being so it would be prudent to ask for as much as may be available in the year of request.
 - b. Funds may not be sufficient to fund the Regent Park Community Ministry over a reasonable multi year period at the proposed full time staffing.
 - c. However, assuming the new Toronto Conference superfund is up and running in 2017, a grant request in support of up to \$100K per year could

be made provided Presbytery puts in 1/3rd the cost of the project. The 10% capital grant could then be spread out over a number of years.

- 2. If the Regent Park Community Ministry is to function as an ongoing new church/new ministry project it needs to have a multi-year business plan with presbytery support that declines over time. The Regent Park Community Ministry project will eventually need to find other funding as part of a longer term business plan. Has it looked at funds from General Council, under some of its new initiatives?
- 3. The Social Justice Project cannot be funded from a 10% capital grant because it does not fit the church development/church redevelopment requirement.
- 4. The Social Justice Project started with seed money from a congregation and then received a PTCC grant but has never been funded at a full time level. Does TS Presbytery really see this as a full time position? Should churches involved in the network not contribute to it? If it is a Full Time (FT) Toronto Conference position, why is rent assessed? Why is this person not working out of a conference office?
- 5. In 2016 if you combine Mission and Service, Net Annual Income Grants and St Enoch's Fund and cull the list, TSP is currently granting \$219,000 to outreach or social ministries The Social Justice Project is proposing to add \$88,000 per year to that. Recognizing that the former expenditures might be classed as "downstream"; i.e., dealing with results of inequity and the latter might be classed as "upstream", dealing with causes of poverty and inequity, Presbytery should decide what portion of its "fortune" should be allocated to one or the other and in total.
- 6. The Social Justice Project started as an exercise in building networks among social justice groups in various congregations. Is there a risk of the advocacy work being elevated to a professional level and does that fit with the presbytery mission?
- 7. PTCC has made a significant amount of money available for those who seek grant support for their project and such requests will increase in number and scale. Should grants be made simply because we have funds available or because the request supports the broader aims and priorities of the presbytery? Clearly the larger capital grants available through PTCC are reserved for church development/church redevelopment initiatives.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2. That the Regent Park Community Ministry grant application be returned with a request that it be resubmitted as a 10% Capital Grant Request for multi-year funding totalling approximately \$287,000 and supported by a business plan of 8 to 10 years showing how other revenue sources and grants might be used,
- 3. That the Social Justice Project be engaged by Presbytery Executive or a review team on several issues:
 - a. The need for a full time position serving just this presbytery
 - b. Alternate funding models
 - c. How does this project fit into the presbytery mission and governance, And that however it be resubmitted, it fall under the 5% annual capital grant, subject to funds available and other funding priorities.

Possible actions and our responses were discussed, should Toronto Conference become an affirming ministry.

Some ideas for an Affirming process were presented as follows. Each group could put out a request for those interested in the topic and start working on what it means. Liturgically, LMUs can recite the promise/statement that they made, before each meeting and evaluate it at the end. The conversations involved are helpful to the whole congregation. In recruiting inquirers, E&S could ask all about their attitude toward affirmation. Affirmation sharpens the intentionality of what one does. Contact Ann Hepburn or the presenters if you have any other ideas.

- The Centre for Christian Studies for diaconal ministry asks us to remember them as an alternative for inquirers, during discernment.
- Five Oaks is stopping their programming in the fall of 2016. To date they have offered LLWL training. E&S will look for other alternatives: e.g. Emmanuel, presbytery etc. who may provide this training.

6. New Business

i. Bedford Park United Church, (BPUC) – Financial Statements and Investment of Property Fund: The Trustees of BPUC are required to submit an annual statement of its investments resulting from the sale of its property at 100 Ranleigh Ave. pursuant to a motion approved by the F & P Team on October 16 2015. This October 16th motion also varied a restriction on the type of investment vehicles available for use in response to concerns by BPUC about deteriorating interest rates. Accordingly, financial reports of the investment funds for the year ended December 31 2015 were extracted from the BPUC 2015 Annual Report and submitted to the F & P Team for its consideration. It was noted BPUC has complied with the requirement to preserve the original capital invested.

MOTION: Clyde Harris / Johmann Kwong that the report be received for information. CARRIED.

- ii. Request from Justice and Global Issues team, (JAGI), for additional \$4,000 funding: Tom Clarke shared correspondence received from George Bartlett, Secretary for the JAGI team, requesting funding to support the cost of conducting a survey of the 54 communities of faith in Toronto Southeast Presbytery. Tom suggested that the F & P Team could deal with this matter as part of its PTTC deliberations later in the meeting Team members concurred.
- iii. Order of the Day West Hill United Church (WHUC) Proposal: Guests had not arrived and so Tom Clarke suggested that we move to a discussion about updates and return to the West Hill matter later in the meeting.

7. Updates

- i. PTTC grants:
 - Regent Park Community Ministry, (multi-year funding approximating \$287,000). Discussion deferred pending report from the PTCC Application Review Team.
 - Kimbourne Park United Church, (2-year funding approximating \$17,706). Discussion deferred pending report from the PTCC Application Review Team.
 - Presbyterian Church Republic of Korea visit, (\$10,000). Discussion deferred pending report from the PTCC Application Review Team.
 - TSP Justice and Global Issues committee, (\$4,000). Discussion deferred pending a further update from the team secretary, George Bartlett.
- ii. U-Talks, (formerly Ideas Festival): A \$5,000 grant from the PTCC 5% fund was conditionally approved at the June 16 2015 TS Plenary to fund speaking engagements at three events, one each at Knox, Ebenezer, and Toronto Chinese United Churches. One third was initially authorized to be disbursed with 2/3 only after an assessment of the first event. All three events went ahead as scheduled. Clyde Harris indicated that Ebenezer United Church, the member entrusted with holding the funds, reported that there is a small financial surplus

after completion of all three events. Clyde asked the team's advice as to what Ebeneezer should do with this surplus. It was suggested that these funds would be returnable to Presbytery unless Presbytery were to authorize a transfer of the funds to a future event. It was also suggested that there should be some accountability to PTCC. Clyde indicated that Ebenezer was prepared to hold these funds in abeyance until instructed otherwise.

- 8. Order of the Day West Hill United Church (WHUC) Proposal: Tom Clarke welcomed two visitors from WHUC, Board Members Randy Bowles, (Chair), and Dennis Hollingshead, (Member-at-large), to the meeting. The purpose of their presentation is for the F & P team to obtain an understanding about what is being proposed and for the team to offer guidance as to the process. The Team had been provided with a copy of WHUC's 2014 Annual Report and a copy of a current proposal to explore the possibility of the sale of church lands and building. This proposal is being entertained because WHUC requires capital repairs to the roof of its building and resurfacing of its parking lot, (resurfacing costs could include an excavation to determine the cause of a sink hole). The estimated cost of repairs could approximate \$600,000, an amount beyond the congregation's ability to selffinance. The Chair advised the WHUC visitors that its presentation was incomplete because the WHUC 2015 Annual Report had not been filed with Presbytery and consequently the 2015 financial statements were not available to the F & P team for perusal. Randy Bowles indicated that the WHUC 2015 Annual Report is available and he would ensure that a report is filed with Presbytery. A general discussion ensued about matters of advice that may be required such as real estate, appraisals, surveys, urban planners, (land use), business forecasts, and the TSP approval process. The Chair explained the Dentonia Park / Hope United model as an example of space sharing with another neighbour congregation. The visitors were thanked for their attendance and encouraged to report back at a future meeting when their plans could be crystalized. Randy Bowles and Dennis Hollingshead left the meeting.

- **10.** Adjournment There being no further business, the Chair declared the meeting ended at 5:51 pm and closed with a benediction.

Call to Order Martha ter Kuile

Martha called the meeting to order at 4:10 and acknowledged that we are on the traditional territories of the Mississauga Anishnabeg, Haudenosaunee and Wendat Indigenous people. She called the meeting to order in the name of Jesus Christ and by the authority vested in her to deal with such business as properly comes before it.

Check-In

Members of the Executive shared recent good experiences. Martha offered an opening praver.

Agenda Review

MOTION: by Marg Walker / David McMaster that the agenda be accepted as presented with the letter from West Hill to be added as new business.

CARRIED.

Previous Minutes:

Members had not had a chance to review the minutes and so these will be approved at the April meeting.

Business:

1. Discussion re: Program Minister's Work for 2016 2017

Anne Shirley presented a work plan which identified her work in several areas, including working with teams and congregations to strengthen their ministries. The executive supported her emphasis on supporting healthy congregations.

There was some discussion about Anne Shirley's work with the executive and it was noted that it as has been different with each chair and secretary and will evolve.

Anne Shirley reported that there will be new work in Phase 2 or the Mission Articulation Plan which will be shared at the June plenary meeting, hosted by the Congregational Health Team.

2. Discussion about processing the Remits

There is considerable background information and material available both for presbyters and congregations about the remits. The executive felt that the meetings should inspire lively conversations at the plenary meetings.

The process for the plenary meetings will include ensuring that presbyters have advanced information available; an overview by Allan Hall; comments from GC42 Commissioners; discussion and a vote.

It was agreed that the process used in September be reviewed and revised if necessary for the following plenary meetings.

The concern about support for conversations within congregations was discussed and it was felt that the ministry personnel and lay presbyters will lead the work in the congregations, possibly following the presbytery process.

It was suggested that presbyters could be asked in September to share the process that their congregations will use. The question of follow up with congregations will need to be considered.

3. Report of the task group to review the PTCC Grant system for the presbytery and make recommendations to the Presbytery Executive

Douglas duCharme, Hannah Lee and Marg Walker met and began by reviewing and updating the 2011-001-EP: PTCC Grant Application Practice. A report, including recommendations is being developed for the June Executive meeting.

4. Report from PTCC Review Team

The PTCC Review Team reported on their discussions about several applications. Recommendations for the Social Justice Project and the PROK were approved for presentation at the June plenary meeting. The PTCC Review Team will bring recommendations about the Regent Park and Kimbourne Park applications to the June executive meeting.

Social Justice (\$119,000).

The team agreed to fund the project at the current staffing (sixty per cent) until the end of 2017. The Review Team recognizes the challenge and change of focus from congregations and so would like to then discuss sharpening the review so that the focus is clearer as well as revisiting and assessing the direction and hoped for outcomes.

PROK visit – application from Executive (\$10,000 - 2016).

This application was approved but there were questions about how it meets the criteria. Team understood it to be mandated by the Executive.

MOTION: by Sharon Aylsworth / Lynella Reid-James that the executive of Toronto Southeast Presbytery, on the recommendation of the PTCC review team accept the recommendations for the Social Justice and PROK visit applications and forward them to the June plenary for approval.

CARRIED.

5. Report from Congregational Health Team

Marg Walker reported that visits to Dentonia Park and Bathurst Street United Churches are being completed. Meetings to share the reports of the Visiting Teams will be held with the congregations at the end of May.

Three members of the Congregational Health Team and Anne Shirley visited with about 60 members of West Hill United Church. They shared their journey over the past months and their concerns for the future. They cannot talk about West Hill without including Gretta.

963 Pharmacy Ave.

The members of West Hill were passionate about being a part of the United Church of Canada. The congregation members share a broad range of theology and accept each other where they are. The outreach ministry of the congregation is wide-ranging. The CH Team were thanked for coming to listen and the congregation were very gracious in accepting that the CH Team members did not have answers for many of their questions.

Nominations Report (Randy Naylor)

Randy noted that there has been a good response from Committee members and chairs of committees who will be continuing next year. He is continuing to contact presbyters about other positions. It continues to be a challenge to find a chair of presbytery. Several suggestions were discussed.

A nominations report will be presented at the June Executive meeting which will be recommended to the June Plenary meeting.

ii. Current Year to Date - 2016: Clyde Harris submitted a 2016 interim financial report as of May 31 2016 for discussion.

iii. Assessments: Clyde Harris reported that three congregations are currently in arrears and that steps have been taken to bring them into compliance.

6. New Business

i. Lawrence Park Community Church, (LPCC) request for approval of Lease with Lawrence Park School Ltd., (LPSL): The Chair noted that no members of LPCC would be in attendance; however, the documentation provided by LPCC is complete and selfexplanatory. Consequently, he deemed that an informed discussion should be able to take place. The Trustees of LPCC have requested Presbytery's approval to surrender the existing leases with its tenant, LPSL, and to enter into two new leases with the same tenant, LPSL. New leases are required due to a change in control of LPSL and are at the insistence of the new owner, Bright Path Kids Corp., (BPKC). LPCC has entered into an indemnity agreement with BPKC to further protect its interest as a landlord. The Trustees of LPCC request to Presbytery for its approval is attached as Appendix B. Discussion ensued and consensus reached that a motion would be in order.

WHEREAS the Trustees of Lawrence Park Community Church (LPCC) have negotiated two leases with Lawrence Park School Ltd for 5325 square feet of space on the lower level of LPCC and common areas and for two Sunday School rooms A & D, AND

WHEREAS, the Finance and Property Team has reviewed the proposed lease agreements, AND

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery is mandated to act for the Presbytery in matters of congregational property transactions as per The Manual Section G2,

IT IS MOVED by Wayne White AND SECONDED by Al Morson that Toronto Southeast Presbytery approve the Lawrence Park School Leases between the Trustees of Lawrence Park Community Church, and The Lawrence Park School as per the terms and conditions of the leasing agreements.

MOTION CARRIED

ii. Order of the Day – Metropolitan United Church (MUC) Lease and Renovation: The Chair welcomed three members of MUC to the meeting: Bruce Peckover, Chair of Trustees, Vera Taylor, Board Chair, and Tex Perley, Chair of Property. Bruce Peckover summarized the history of its development projects and provided us with an update about the newest one.

In 2000 MUC selected Lancer Developments as a partner to develop its property to the north of the Church. The basis of the agreement was a long-term land-lease. Lancer would pay Met rent for the use of the land and build and manage a development. At the end of the lease, this development would revert back to Met. The initial development was a 37-floor high-rise residential rental property, scheduled for completion in 2005. Because of the two-year delay in obtaining the City of Toronto and neighbouring stakeholder approvals, the requisite CMHC approvals, and later, the downturn in the economy in 2008, Lancer was unable to fund the development and proceed as planned. Lancer attempted to garner new partnership arrangements over the following four years but was not successful and its exclusive development rights lapsed November 01, 2012.

Met proceeded to look for a new developer and in December, 2013, received the approval of Toronto Southeast Presbytery to enter into a new ground lease agreement with Veridoc Development Corporation with the intent to refresh the Lancer project, recognizing that some of the previous development agreements might have to be renegotiated. It was subsequently determined that the Lancer project no longer provided for an unrestricted flight path for air ambulances approaching the St. Michael's Hospital helipad and that any high-rise development by Met would now be limited to 21 storeys. Accordingly, Veridoc designed a new 21-storey structure which will have reduced income potential. Veridoc, in order to protect its position, drastically revised the financial formula for Met's future cash flows. Met was unable to renegotiate a better deal, and, faced with Veridoc's intransigence, prepared to allow this opportunity to lapse.

Veridoc had, over the years, been unwilling to challenge St. Michaels' Hospital assertion that its helicopter flight path could not be altered, despite opinions to the contrary. Consequently, Met decided to reopen discussions with St. Michael's Hospital on its own and hired an aeronautical consultant to assist with its negotiations.

Early in 2016 Met entertained a proposal from Concert Properties Ltd. to construct a 300,000 square foot residential rental building with retail at grade and two commercial underground parking garages. Concert proposed to operate the residential building while the Toronto Parking Authority, (TPA), will operate the public garages. Concert and Met were successful in obtaining St. Michael's Hospital's approval to an amended flight path which would permit a 26-storey building to be built on the north portion of Met's property. Met's Board and Trustees have agreed to Concept's proposal and now seek Presbytery's approval to enter into a formal agreement with Concert Properties Inc. Bruce Peckover summarized the proposal as follows:

- i. Met to enter into a 99-year head lease with its developer, Concert Properties.
- ii. Met to agree to a 99-year less one-day sublease between Concert and the Toronto Parking Authority, (TPA) regarding the north and south parking garages, (see below).
- iii. On the north side of the church property, fronting on Shuter Street, Concert to construct a 26-storey rental residential building with at-grade retail space approximating 4,200 square feet and four levels of underground parking, one of which to be reserved for the use of the residential building and the balance for public parking to be administered by the TPA, (North Garage).
- iv. On the west side of the church property, fronting on Bond Street, Concert to relocate and reconstruct the parsonage in accordance with the requirements of the Heritage Easement Agreement registered as No. AT1687114.
- v. On the south side of the church property, fronting on Queen Street, Concert to construct a four-level underground parking facility, (South Garage), to be administered by the TPA.
- vi. Concert to reconstruct the park to the south of the church, (McGill Square), in keeping with the plans and specifications previously approved by the City in 2005.
- vii. Concert to renew the landscaping of the Church Lands and install a new circular driveway on the Church Street frontage for vehicular access to the Church.

Met United will, upon execution of the head lease, receive an immediate capitalized rent payment of \$3,500,000 plus HST to be used for renovations to the north end of the church building, interior painting of the sanctuary, chemical cleaning of the building exterior, and repairs to exterior stairs. The value of the capital improvements to the existing church property, (items numbered iv, vi, and vii, above), to be undertaken at Concert's expense approximates \$10,000,000.

Tom Clarke provided the F & P Team with a draft motion for discussion. Minor corrections were suggested and the following motion presented:

WHEREAS the Trustees of Metropolitan United Church (THE TRUSTEES), having obtained consent from Toronto South Presbytery entered into a development agreement which subsequently expired after 10 years, AND

WHEREAS in 2008 the Church House at Metropolitan United Church, 56 Queen Street East, Toronto, Ontario, was demolished to allow for the expansion of the parking lot from 90 spaces to 120 spaces and renovations were made to the church building to enable the redevelopment of the north portion of the property, AND

WHEREAS THE TRUSTEES engaged Deloitte Real Estate for the purposes of conducting a full Request for Proposal (RFP) and selection process for a new development partner for the north portion of the property held in trust by Metropolitan United Church, AND

WHEREAS, working with the real estate division of Deloitte and Craig Carter of Fasken Martineau, the lawyer for Metropolitan United Church, the Development Selection Sub-committee of THE TRUSTEES recommended that the "Best and Final Offer" from Verdiroc Development Corporation (and Greenwin Inc.) with Campus Suites Inc. (and Suite Life Inc.) dated November 11, 2013, be accepted, AND

WHEREAS, the approval of Toronto Southeast Presbytery for the said lease and development of MUC lands was given at the November 9, 2013 meeting of the Finance and Property Team but the Trustees of MUC did not accept a revised offer presented, AND

WHEREAS the Trustees and the Official Board of Metropolitan United Church meeting on May 25, 2016 (Appendix C) have considered the recommendation of the selection sub-committee and endorsed their recommendation to accept the Offer to Lease from Concert Real Estate Corporation (Concert Properties) and authorized the Trustees to proceed to finalize an agreement, subject to the approval of Toronto Southeast Presbytery, AND

WHEREAS the Trustees and Official Board of Metropolitan United Church have determined to proceed with necessary capital improvements funded from the capital payments contained in the lease agreement, AND

WHEREAS the members of the congregation of Metropolitan United Church and the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery have been kept informed as the process moved forward, AND

WHEREAS the Finance and Property Team of Toronto Southeast Presbytery has the authority to act for Toronto Southeast Presbytery in matters related to Congregational Property Transactions as set out in the Manual 2013 Section G 2.3,

IT WAS MOVED BY Wayne White and SECONDED BY Joan Chinnery that Toronto Southeast Presbytery approve and consent to the request of THE TRUSTEES to

- 1. The approval of the Official Board and Trustees of Metropolitan United Church of the Agreement to Lease between the Trustees of Metropolitan United Church and Concert Real Estate Corporation for a proposed development of Metropolitan United Church Lands," which is a multi-phase project comprising
 - a. A 26 story rental apartment building;
 - b. At grade retail space of approximately 4,200 square feet;
 - c. A 4 level underground parking facility the first three levels of which will provide 200 to 250 spaces for public parking;
 - d. Relocation and reconstruction of The Manse in accordance with the existing Heritage Agreement with the City of Toronto;
 - e. A 4 level parking facility for 250 to 300 cars under the south lawns;
 - f. Reconstruction of the park on the south lands;
 - g. Landscaping of the balance of the church lands including the construction of a circular drive on the east lands and surface parking for church use on the west lands.
- 2. The acceptance and execution of the OFFER TO LEASE BETWEEN THE TRUSTEES FOR METROPOLITAN UNITED CHURCH "MET" and Concert Real Estate Corporation, "Tenant", and the proposed Final Lease Agreement set out therein which is subject to due diligence by the "Tenant" and in the event of significant modification of its terms, the further approval of Toronto Southeast Presbytery, all in accordance with the lands defined and terms set out in said OFFER, including but not limited to the following
 - a. the lease of land for a term of 99 years;
 - b. capital payments accruing to \$3,955,000;
 - c. capital improvements including move and refurbishing of the manse, re landscaping and replacing of heritage fencing estimated as \$9,553,000
 - d. estimated parking revenues in years 1 to 10 of \$1,100,000
 - e. other matters summarized in the lease review and analysis,
- 3. The plan of disposition of the \$3,955,000 in capital received and request for approval of capital expenditure (listed in Appendix D) in excess of \$100,000 and summarized as follows:

Appendix B – Copy of Lawrence Park Community Church Trustees' motion of May 15th 2016

TRUSTEES OF LAWRENCE PARK COMMUNITY CHURCH

WHEREAS Lawrence Park Community Church (the "Church") has an existing lease, as landlord, with The Lawrence Park School Ltd., as tenant, (the "Tenant") of 5,325 square feet of space on the lower level of the north side of the Church building (the "Lower Level premises") that was entered into in June 2013 (the "Main Lease") and a further lease, as landlord, with the Tenant of Sunday School Rooms A and D in the upstairs area on the west side of the building (the "Upstairs premises") that was entered into in June 2011 (the "Ancillary Lease");

AND WHEREAS the owner of all the shares of the Tenant is proposing to sell same to BrightPath Kids Corp.("BrightPath") and Bright Path has requested that, in conjunction with the sale, the Main Lease and the Ancillary Lease be surrendered and new leases of the Lower Level premises and the Upstairs premises be entered into with the Tenant (the "New Leases");

AND WHEREAS the approval of the Trustees is required for the New Leases, each of which contemplates an initial lease term of approximately ten years and, at the Tenant's option, one renewal term of five years;

AND WHEREAS the Trustees believe that the New Leases would be in the best interests of the Church;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. In conjunction with completion of the sale of shares of the Tenant to BrightPath, the Trustees enter into a surrender of lease agreement in respect of each of the Main Lease and the Ancillary Lease and enter into the New Leases;
- 2. The surrender of lease agreements and the New Leases shall be in or substantially in the respective forms currently settled by Dentons Canada LLP with counsel to BrightPath, with such changes therein as may be approved by the Trustees, the execution thereof by any three of the Trustees of the documentation in final form to be deemed to be evidence of their approval; and
- 3. The execution and delivery of the surrender of lease agreements and the New Leases and of all other acknowledgments, directions, notices or other instruments that may be necessary or appropriate and the taking of all such other steps and action as may in their discretion be appropriate by any three of the five Trustees on behalf of the Trustees shall be deemed to be valid action on behalf of the Trustees

3. Development Update

i) Offer to Lease Approval

Vera Taylor referred Trustees and Board members to the Offer to Lease (version 13) that had been circulated prior to the meeting. She briefed attendees on a conversation with lead negotiator Bruce Peckover, in which he indicated that the agreement was final except in some fine details and that a vote to proceed (or not) would be appropriate. The details that remained to be settled related to payment of ongoing legal fees, the developer's request for a lease term of longer than 99 years, and the reluctance of the developer to fully share and Development Charges reductions negotiated with the City.

The developer asked for assurance that Metropolitan United Church has the legal authority to sign the agreement. Tim Gorley and Vera Taylor reported that they had studied the United Church of Canada Manual, and it states that the individual congregations have the right to sign leases for congregational property. Furthermore, the approval of the governing presbytery would be obtained. They asked if the joint group felt it necessary to audit the developer; there was general agreement that this would not be necessary.

The basic deal was outlined as a capital payment of 3,955,000 (inclusive of HST) which would be used by Met for renovations to the north end of the church building, completing the painting of the interior of the sanctuary, chemical cleaning of the exterior of the building, and repairing the exterior entry steps to the building. Met is eligible for a 50% refund of HST paid for the above, and this refund will be added to the budget to cover these costs (and provide an additional contingency). Concert will also make approximately 10,000,000 of capital improvements to the Manse (subject to a Heritage Easement Agreement – 2005 – with the City), and fully relandscape Met's property following construction. Met will receive 1,250,000 in annual income under the Land Lease made up from parking revenue from the commercial parking operations to be constructed as part of the development. Met will receive increases in this rent in the future from increased parking revenue, and profits earned by Concert on its apartment operation.

In order to consider and approve the lease, it was moved by Fran Parkin and seconded by Jeff Ince that the group move into a formal joint session of Trustees and Official Board to consider the matter. Motion carried.

Sheldon Schultz asked how the calculation of the lease payments would be overseen to ensure that Metropolitan was receiving the amounts reflected in the agreement. Jeff Ince asked what would happen if there were cost overruns on the capital improvements. (Answer: Cost overruns will be absorbed by the developer). Linn Holness expressed concern that a deal with TPA for the underground parking had not yet been finalized and asked what would happen if there was no deal for the underground parking. (Answer: Negotiators are confident that a deal will be reached, if not with TPA, then with another parking provider.) Susan Girvan noted that Metropolitan would be responsible for maintaining the park.

Appendix C (page 2) - Copy of Metropolitan United Church's Pertinent Minutes of the joint meeting of the MUC Board and Trustees on May 25, 2016 concerning the Concert Properties head lease and the MUC decision to proceed with capital improvements requiring Presbytery approval.

After the discussion, Tim Gorley, on behalf of the Trustees, moved that the **Trustees accept the Offer to Lease** from Concert Real Estate Corporation substantially in the form and detail shown in version 13, as circulated to the Trustees on May 24, 2016. Tex Perley seconded. Trustees in favour were asked to stand; 8 were recorded in favour, including a proxy vote from Carol Dilks.

Fran Parkin, on behalf of the Trustees, then moved that **approval of the Offer to Lease** from Concert Real Estate Corporation substantially in the form and detail shown in version 13, as circulated on May 24, 2016 **be recommended to the Official Board**. Linn Holness seconded. Trustees in favour were asked to stand; 8 recorded in favour, including a proxy vote from Carol Dilks.

On behalf of the Official Board, Jeff Ince moved that the **Official Board accept the Offer to Lease** from Concert Real Estate Corporation substantially in the form and detail shown in version 13, as circulated on May 24, 2016. Dennis Donovan seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

ii) North End Renovation Expense

Tex Perley and Frank Cairns were asked to present the plan for the renovation of the north end of the church building (Attachments A and B). Frank Cairns noted that there had been extensive consultation within the church organization, senior staff, and the architects. It was noted that the execution of the plans remains contingent upon the lease arrangement with Concert Real Estate Corporation being finalized. Text Perley noted that, in relation to the painting of the sanctuary, it was recommended that the stucco be cleaned, firmed, and painted rather than replaced in order to preserve the building's acoustics. He also noted that the Trustees had approved \$80,000 in spending on the renovation project in January and suggested that it would be appropriate for the Official Board to approve this. Sheldon Schultz commented that if it were necessary to provided bridge financing for three months in order to finance the final plans and necessary permits, it would be possible to do this out of the unrestricted funds. Jeff Ince asked if the renovation plan included replacement of the roof of the chancel area. Tex replied that it did.

After the discussion, Tex Perley moved on behalf of the **Trustees**, that **the renovation plan for the north end of the building and the required budget be approved**. Linn Holness seconded. Trustees in favour were asked to stand; 8 were recorded in favour, including a proxy vote from Carol Dilks.

On behalf of the **Trustees**, Linn Holness then moved that the **approved renovation plan and budget be sent to the Official Board for approval**. Fran Parkin seconded. Trustees in favour were asked to stand; 8 were recorded in favour, including a proxy vote from Carol Dilks.

On behalf of the **Official Board**, Dennis Donovan moved that the **renovation plan for the north end of the building and the required budget be approved**. Jeff Ince seconded. Motion carried.

iii) Presbytery Approval

On behalf of the Official Board, Sheldon Schultz moved that the Trustees be directed to seek Presbytery approval of the **Offer to Lease** from Concert Real Estate Corporation substantially in the form and detail shown in version 13, as circulated on May 24, 2016. Jeff Ince seconded. Motion carried.

On behalf of the Official Board, Fran Parkin moved that the Trustees be directed to seek Presbytery approval of the **plan and budget for the renovation** of the north end of the building. Mary Stockdale Vernon seconded. Motion carried.

ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL IMPROVEMENTS RESULTING

Once Concert completes the restoration of the Manse on a new foundation, the building will be turned over to Met for finishing and our use. We are free to rent this space to any organization of our choosing, at a rent we decide. To a professional firm (lawyers, architects) this could be as much as \$150,000 per year.

Once we complete the renovations and upgrades to the north end of Met, we will have additional meeting space that can be rented out on an occasional basis. The space can also be used for small concerts and practice space. Once staff moves back out of the Met Centre outside offices and into their own space in the north end, these outside offices can be rented out to small businesses – we can become a neighbourhood innovation incubator.

MET'S RISKS

Our base rent from Concert is tied solely to the payments they receive from TPA. If parking ceases to exist, TPA will cease to need our space and they would terminate the agreement. Yes the space would revert to Met, but there would be no revenue. Concert has been asked, when building the underground parking structures to include one stall constructed as a document vault, and one stall as storage; thush there will be an "existing use" that could be increased in the future.

Our risk is that at some point in the next 99 years, people will cease to have personal transportation devices that need to be parked somewhere when they access the centre of the city, and visit their family at the hospital next door. Ever since the wheel was invented, people have had personal transportation devices requiring parking and stabling. The space can always be turned into document storage vaults, personal stuff storage units, or a columbarium.

There are maybe three semi-solutions with the arrangement with TPA.

- Concert always wanted the TPA lease to be with us directly. We had balked as we had said we wanted a cheque to be based on the entire project. We haven't won that argument, so instead we go direct to TPA. Then we have provisions to enforce ourselves rather than through Concert.
- if the agreement (whether through Concert or TPA) states that following three months of nonpayment by TPA, ownership reverts to Met, we can then deal with the property ourselves.
- 3. we always have the option of selling the land for the difference between the residual value of the remaining years of the Lease, and the FMV of the development.

Purpose of this Practice: To define the process, timeline and requirements for initiating and approving applications for grants from The Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation and to define the evaluation and follow up terms of reference for Executive.

Background and Context:

The Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation (PTCC) was established to hold and invest funds accruing from the reorganization of Toronto Conference and make available income and capital grants to support the work of the Presbyteries. In the establishing of PTCC, the founding presbyteries have agreed to an Operating Agreement setting out among other matters what funds may be available and conditions there to. PTCC has developed grant forms and other operational requirements which are set out in their website: http://www.ptccorp.org/index.php

<u>Other sources of funds available to support the work of the Church</u> are summarized in Appendix A to this document.

The PTCC Operating Agreement sets out the following types of grants

- i. <u>Annual Net Income Grant</u> of the net income earned by the Toronto Southeast Fund within the PTCC portfolio based on what is earned in prior year. Presbytery may request grants up to the amount of the expected net annual income. Funds not granted may be held for future use and allowed to earn additional income, or capitalized at the discretion of the Presbytery.
- ii. <u>Annual Capital Grant</u> of up to S% of total capital in the Toronto Southeast Presbytery Fund as of beginning of year. An annual grant can be broken up into several grant requests through the year. Three months notice required.
- iii. <u>Church Development/Redevelopment Project Grant</u> of up to 10% of current value of capital assets in Toronto Southeast Presbytery Account, less any Annual Capital Grant in that year. Six months notice required. As per the Operating Agreement approved by all four presbyteries.
- iv. <u>Major Church Development/Redevelopment Project</u> of more than 10% but not more than 20% of capital in Toronto Southeast Presbytery Account. Six months notice is required.

PTCC Requirements are set out in The Presbyteries of Toronto Conference Corporation Operating Agreement and such other requirements as the PTCC Board may determine but include the following:

- i. Presbytery must apply for annual net Income grant (up to the net amount earned) and Capital Grants
- ii. Applications should be timed to the quarterly meetings of the PTCC Board.
- iii. Requests for grants must be approved by the Plenary of Presbytery with suitable notice.
- iv. Church Development Projects must meet the Toronto Conference definition/criteria for church development. "<u>Church development/redevelopment</u> refers to the work of any congregation or congregations working together to redevelop property or programs to meet the needs of the community they serve. This could include but not be limited to amalgamation, specialized ministries such as youth, seniors, and community ministries, and it may or may not involve property."

Toronto Southeast Presbytery Procedure for PTCC Grants:

1. PTCC Annual Net Income Grant

- i. Finance & Property Team will obtain the most current information from PTCC and make recommendations prior to the annual budget submission setting out:
 - Block amount to be allocated to outreach grants which the Mission and Outreach Team shall determine, and/or
 - Amount to be applied to operating budget or other specified presbytery financial needs, and/or
 - Amount to be retained in PTCC for a later grant application in the year or future years and/or the amount to be added to the capital amount.
- ii. Time frame: It is anticipated that in September, PTCC will provide an estimate of income expected for that calendar year and available to be used in the following calendar year.
- iii. When the allocations proposed by Mission and Outreach Support are approved (by the plenary), the PTCC grant applications will be completed and forwarded to PTCC by the Presbytery Secretary for payment.
- iv. PTCC Board members representing Toronto Southeast Presbytery will be advised by the Presbytery Secretary of the grant applications being forwarded.

2. Grant Review Team

- i. The Grant Review Team includes membership from the Congregational Health Team, the Mission Strategy Team and the Property and Finance Team.
 - a. The members will serve a term of two years which is renewable to ensure continuity and experience.
 - b. The Grant Review Team may elect a chair and secretary.
- ii. The Grant Review Team will receive grant applications from the Executive, consult with Teams as necessary and provide a recommendation to the Executive.
 - a. A schedule for Grant applications will be determined annually by the Review Team to coincide with presentation to the plenary meetings in January, March and November.
 - b. The Grant Review Team will receive financial updates regarding the availability of funds prior to each review cycle.
 - c. The Grant Review Team will share the schedule and the financial updates with the executive who will make the information available to potential applicants.
- iii. The Grant Review Team will evaluate each application according to principles based on the Mission Statement of Presbytery, the Mission Strategy Priorities, 2014 and the availability of funds.
- iv. The Grant Review Team will consult with the Finance and Property Team and other program and public witness teams as necessary.
- v. The Grant Review Team will make a recommendation to the Executive on each application with reasons. It will also make a recommendation to Executive about the project's accountability and how they will report to Executive, including a schedule for reporting, elements for evaluation and follow up.

3. PTCC Capital Grants

- i. Grant requests may be initiated by a community of faith, (congregation, outreach ministry, mission or camp) within the Presbytery or by a Presbytery constituted body or jointly by a Presbytery body working with one of the foregoing.
- ii. Grant requests are received by the Executive and referred to the Grant Review Team.

- iii. The Grant Review Team will consult with the Finance and Property Team and other program and public witness teams as necessary.
- iv. Grant Requests will be approved at the January, March and November Plenary meetings. The timeline for the deadline for applications for review by the Grant Review Team, will be established each year by the Grant Review Team and communicated to the presbytery.
- v. Executive will receive a recommendation regarding grant requests from the Review Team before making a recommendation to plenary for approval or non-approval.
- vi. PTCC Board members representing Toronto Southeast Presbytery will be advised by the Presbytery Secretary of the grant applications being forwarded.
- vii. The Executive will report on the disposition of grant requests to those initiating the requests and to Presbytery.
- viii. The Executive will receive timely reports from grant recipients as to the evaluation of the program for which funding was granted and the work supported by the grants and will transmit this to the Plenary.

4. Financial Reporting of PTCC Funds

- i. PTCC is expected to report its financial results quarterly and its investment portfolio annually. All repots will be forwarded to the Treasurer and Finance and Property Team.
- ii. The Finance and Property Team will review PTCC reports and as may be required will provide comment and synopsis to the Executive and the Grant Review Team.
- iii. Based on the financial reports received from PTCC, the Treasurer will provide an annual summary report on the Southeast Presbytery Fund held by PTCC.

- Bathurst United Presentation
 - In 2011 Bathurst members attended a Retreat, where they came up with their mission theme of "Empowering Mental Health"
 - Mental health issues affect 20% of the population at any time, and there is the added stress of silence and stigma attached
 - Bathurst felt they could still address the social outreach issues that were important to them, and develop their theme through other aspects of church life.
 - Judi Enticknap: Bathurst received a request from CAMH to offer worship services to some of their people who were or had been, in trouble with the law. They started in 2012 with a simple liturgy, song, scripture, and reflection together in a circle. They also included an Agape meal of pita and grape juice. Services were the 2nd and 4th Sunday from 4-5pm. They have now partnered with Bloor Street, and expect to have services EVERY Sunday by the end of 2016. This has been a place where students from Emmanuel have been interested to come and participate.

Challenges & Learnings:

- Jane: experienced a deepening of understanding of inclusivity. Some challenges have been difficulties communicating; behavioural issues and trouble focussing. The Agape meal has become a period of calm during the challenging times. This has been an opportunity to build new, surprising & rich relationships.
- Judi: learning that you can't be attached to the liturgy, but need to be open to the needs of the attendees. A personal challenge was a fear of those who would be participating, which was quickly overcome by getting to know all the participants. There has been lots of joy and laughter in the group.
- Ralph Carl: this project has given the congregation a sense of mission that all can participate in. During a series of services on breaking silence, various Bathurst members shared their

own stories around mental health issues. There has been a sense of accomplishment in an area where not a lot of churches were participating. Volunteers from Emmanuel and Bathurst have reported some of the most joyful and meaningful experiences around this mission.

• Mission Articulation Plan – presented by lan Manson

Nearly three years ago, Toronto Southeast Presbytery launched its "Mission Articulation Project" – or MAP.

- The purpose of this initiative was to support congregations by helping them articulate, as clearly as possible, their mission priorities for the next few years.
- As many of us recall, in an earlier era this work was also undertaken through the Joint Needs Assessment process – and while some congregations used these opportunities to take stock of where they'd been and identify what they felt called to focus on – the task of identifying and clarifying mission priorities wasn't a regular part of the life of many faith communities.
- Thus the MAP process was designed to assist churches that weren't engaged in a search process to identify and clarify their goals and objectives for the next few years, and to help churches that needed to fill vacancies have these goals in hand before they began to develop job descriptions and start their search.
- The program outlined a multi-step process for churches to follow, and was developed by Ron Ewart of TUCC with the support of Anne Shirley Sutherland and a small committee. It assigned designated "accompaniers" to work with those congregations that requested assistance, but also gave congregations the opportunity to follow this process themselves – and I know that many of you have had some involvement with this initiative. Over the last year the MAP project has been resourced by TUCC's Janet Marshall and Anne Shirley – Harry Brown and I also serve on the steering committee – and we want to pay tribute to Ron, Janet, and especially to Anne Shirley for their outstanding work.

Phase One of the MAP initiative is now completed, and we can report that nearly 80% of our congregations have engaged in long term planning in one way or another over the last several years. Some worked with Accompaniers and others did not. Some did this work only because it was required, while others saw some value in doing it before it was necessary to fill a staff position. The team is pleased with this response, and sees it as a good beginning.

We've learned a couple of things. First, a review of the MAP documents reveals that many of those churches that worked with an accompanier seemed more able to take an objective look at their life and work than those that didn't. We think this is because an outsider often is able to see things that those inside the system can't always recognize, and therefore ask some different questions.

Secondly, Pastoral Relations/Pastoral Health issues frequently occurred during the process of doing MAPs. In a number of cases, Janet Marshall was asked to work with these congregations, most of which were working to declare vacancies. These turned out to be important and useful interventions, as the new pastoral relations process no longer calls for representatives from the wider church to work with congregations while they're developing their ministry profiles and job description. Because of this, potential problems don't always get flagged in a timely manner, and the MAP project helped address that need. However, the financial costs were significant – close to \$20,000 – about half of the MAP budget. Still, we believe that the money was well-spent, and that much good work was done.

Phase 2

But we also believe that this work is far from complete, and see Phase 2 involving two components. One is to continue to offer help to congregations in revising their Mission strategies. The hope is that all of our churches will do this work on an annual basis – that the priorities from the previous year will be regularly reviewed – and that new ones will be developed.

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So support through Anne Shirley and our committee will be offered in this task. But the major element of Phase Two is to bring together congregational reps, lay members and persons in Paid Accountable Ministry, to focus more specifically on a couple of issues that were identified by many congregations in their MAP reports. To that end, we will be offering:

- A one-day workshop on "Leadership" that will focus on "Leadership for Change," "Leadership and Mission-Shaped Governance", and "Developing and Supporting Lay Leadership." More details will be available toward the end of the summer, but it will be held on **Saturday October 1 – so please mark your calendar.**
- A second one-day workshop on "Growing in Faith" on **Saturday November 19**. This session will focus on how our worship, educational programs, social media initiatives and other programs can more effectively serve to develop and nurture the making of disciples in our congregations.

Those congregations that identified these as priority areas will be contacted and issued invitations, while others also will be welcome to attend.

Then, as a follow-up, we're hoping to offer a 2-year pilot project that would invite congregational teams to join together to explore some of the central questions and challenges that were identified in the MAP process, possibly with the help of the "Animate" set of resources that have been developed by Fortress Press. We see this featuring four weekend sessions (each of about 17 hours in length) where participants can immerse themselves in some relevant materials and explore how these new ideas might be relevant and helpful to their contexts. Hopefully, a greater sense of common purpose will arise, and new energies will be unleashed. Lots of planning remains to be done, and you'll also hear more about this initiative in the early fall. This is a brief overview of how the Mission Articulation Project has been striving to support congregational life in this Presbytery, and of how we hope to continue doing so in the future. It is important and interesting work – and it remains a privilege to help support and facilitate this initiative.

A few months ago a few of us took part in a two-day learning community event alongside United Church folks from other Conferences across Canada. It was led by Alan Roxburgh, one of the few Canadians who are writing and leading congregational re-development and change, discerning the shape of the church in changing contexts. The gathering, in a nutshell was about how to learn together through concrete, everyday experiments in practicing the way of Jesus in our neighbourhood.

It seemed to us that this experience provided a piece of the puzzle that many of us have been working on for a while, a way of living into our shared mission as faith communities in this Presbytery, in this city, in new ways.

As a Presbytery we've been supporting a number of innovative new ministry initiatives – which is a good thing! We just did once again in the PTCC grants we approved this evening. But we also want to, and need to support and invest in revitalization, renewal, and innovation in the life and mission of our existing congregations and ministries in practical, hands-on ways that enable us to learn together, in community.

There is tremendous "Promise" to live "Into" in the congregations we are all a part of!

So "Into the Promise" is a learning community opportunity that has been designed for 4-5 congregations to become a part of as we learn and do together, with coaching through Alan Roxburgh's Missional Network, as adapted by Christine Jerrett for United Church contexts.

The model of learning is practical, developing specific experiments that enable us to grow and learn and become increasingly effective in ministry where we are... in the neighbourhood.

If this sounds like something your congregation is ready to engage in, and commit to, over an 18 month period beginning in October, take one of the flyers on each table, work through the questions it suggests, and get in touch with one of us, whose contact information is included.
